Update on the Churches in Abaco and Grand Bahama

Bahamian Report and Dorian—Week Six

It is remarkable that we have been involved in helping those in the Bahamas for six weeks. It has been one of the most rewarding efforts for all who have been part of it. We are adding these weekly reports to the Palm Beach Lakes website

(www.pblcoc.org) and recognize that this may be the first one you have seen. We urge you to go to the church's website, click on Bahamas Hurricane Relief (you will see this banner at the top of the page) and read all six reports. You will come

away with a renewed faith in how God works to take care of His people.

From the beginning we have let the Bahamian brethren determine their most pressing needs. Instead of those of us in America trying to determine their needs, we let them decide. By Thursday of each week they send us lists and immediately members at PBL begin purchasing exactly what they need. All of this is purchased by Sunday and it is brought to the church building, where it is carefully inventoried to ensure that the Bahamian customs officials will know what is in each container being shipped.

Then on Monday, these items are removed from our large classroom, loaded into U-Haul trucks and driven the five

miles to the Port of Palm Beach on Tuesday morning. We load the items on wooden pallets where they are then placed in shipping containers (some of these are 40 feet long) and shipped by Tropical Shipping

Company to various locations in the Bahamas. Because Freeport is just 70 miles from West Palm Beach, the items arrive there by Thursday and on that afternoon the Bahamian Christians have access to precisely what they need.

We are able to purchase many items at wholesale or discounted costs which means we avoid the cost of American brethren purchasing items and shipping them to us. All of this is working extremely well. God is taking care of the Bahamians!



Update on the Relief Efforts

This week, containers were sent to the church in Free-




port (which also serves as a place where the church in Eight Mile Rock can get what is sent to them) and to the brethren in Nassau. The churches in that capital city are caring for those Christians who fled from the flooding and damaging winds of Dorian which destroyed

Marsh Harbour, and also are ensur-

ing that the needs of the small South Abaco congregation are being met.

Our focus so far has been to help those two congregations on the island of Grand Bahama, Freeport and Eight Mile Rock (funds for the work in Eight Mile Rock are supplied by the
