There is a great danger when Americans ignore those verses in the Bible which discuss the dangers of riches. The average annual income in America is about \$47,000. That number is the gross amount you receive, not the amount you bring home after the deductions at work. With that in mind

consider the following. If you make \$41,000 each year you are in the top 3% of the wealthiest people living on the earth. There are approximately seven billion people on the earth and three billion of them make less than not just for those \$2 per day! This means that over forty percent of people earn less than \$14 per day or less than \$800 per year. Those verses about riches apply to all of us!

The dangers of riches. The wisdom of Solo- West Palm Beach mon so vividly describes the dangers that Americans

face. He asked the Lord to grant him two things. One was that he would not be poor and be tempted to become a thief. The other concerned riches. "Give me neither poverty nor richesfeed me with the food allotted to me: lest I be full and denv You and say, 'Who is the Lord'" (Prov. 30:8-9). His words are easily understood, yet difficult for Americans to apply since so few realize that most of the world knows we are rich.

Riches are not sinful. Having money is not sinful. Abraham, the friend of God, was very rich. His wealth was described by his servant. "He has become rich; and He has given him flocks and herds, and silver and gold, and servants and maids, and camels and donkeys" (Gen. 24:35). This is further seen in the fact that he had 318 men who were trained and able to go to war to rescue Lot (Gen. 14:14). Job was also an extremely wealthy man who was described by God as a "...man that was blameless and upright," and yet his wealth made him "...the greatest of all the people of the east" (Job 1:1-3).

The words are in Palm Beach, but to those in

God's special message to "rich" Americans. The Lord gives nine direct commands to those who are rich (1 Tim. 6:17-19). I beg that you prayerfully consider them.

- 1. Do not become haughty because you are rich.
- Do not trust in uncertain riches. 2.
- Do trust in God. 3.
- 4. Do good by using your money.
- 5. Be rich in good works, not just rich.
- Always be ready to give. 6.
- Always be willing to share. 7.
- 8. Use your money to store up treasures in heaven.
- 9. Use your money to lay hold on eternal life.

These words do not just apply to those in "Palm Beach." Ask those whose annual income is less than \$800. They apply to those in "West Palm Beach"!



When It's Ok to Stop Preaching the Gospel

Is it ever permissible to stop preaching to people about the love of God, the sacrifice of Jesus, the church of Christ, the plan of salvation or the glory of heaven? Some of us would answer, "Absolutely not! We must never stop preaching the gospel to anyone and everyone!" It is true that our Lord has

given us the task and responsibility to take the good news of Jesus Christ to every person on the face of the earth. However, did you know that God gives you permission to stop preaching to some people? That might sound contradictory or counter-intuitive, but in the wisdom of God it is prudent and necessary.

Consider the instructions of Jesus in this regard. "Do not give what is holy to the dogs; nor cast your pearls before swine, lest they trample them

under their feet, and turn and tear you in pieces" (Matt. 7:6). There are persons whom Jesus described as "dogs" and "hogs" -vile, incorrigible creatures who want nothing to do with God, His ways or His Word. What did Jesus say was our responsibility toward such persons? Do not give that which is holy and valuable to them! Would this not include the message of salvation? Is there anything more holy and valuable?

Perhaps we can use Jesus' words in Mark 6:11 as His own commentary on Matthew 7:6. Who are these "dogs" and words], when you depart from there, shake off the dust under your feet as a testimony against them" (cf. Matt. 10:14). In the book of Acts, we see an example of Paul follow-

"hogs"? "And whoever will not receive you nor hear [your

ing these instructions. He shook the dust off his feet when persecuted in Antioch of Pisidia (13:51) and then again toward the Jews in Corinth. Notice four things Paul did (in Acts 18:6) in fulfilling the instructions to stop preaching to certain people.

> He distanced himself from the antagonists. "He shook his garments." The Lord did not require him to continue preaching to blasphemers.

> He disclosed the antagonist's personal responsibility. "Your blood be upon your own heads." He did not discontinue preaching without telling them, one more time, of the consequences of their sinful ways.

He disavowed any responsibility for their guilt. "I am clean." He had done his part, fulfilled his charge, and the Lord gave him permission to move on.

He directed his efforts toward more fertile soil. "From now on I will go to the Gentiles." He did not stop preaching altogether. He just took the message of salvation to others, searching for those who had more receptive hearts.

Don't ever stop preaching! Just keep soil searching!

Gallio has a lesson for all legislators and judges today

While preaching in Corinth on his second missionary journey, some Jews rose up in opposition to Paul (as they were accustomed to doing) and hauled him before the local court system, accusing him of things "contrary to the law" (Acts 18:12-13). Gallio, the local proconsul, responded forthrightly, "If it were a matter of wrongdoing or wicked crimes" (i.e., against the law of the land), "there would be reason why I should bear with you." Then, he continued, "But if it is a question of words and names and your own law" (i.e., "Jesus," "the Christ," "the Messiah," the Law of Moses), "look to it yourselves; for I do not want to be a judge of such matters" (18:14-15). Gallio refused to allow matters of faith to be decided in the civil court. Being a Christian was not against the law; teaching Christian doctrine wasn't against the law; practicing Christian living and service wasn't against the law. Therefore, "he drove them from the judgment seat."

Today's legislators and judges would do well to pay attention to Gallio! Christianity is not against the law in this land (as of now)! Matters of Christian faith (its teaching and practice) should not be decided in the civil court system! There is a Higher Law at stake here! -DS

From whence cometh a Christian's strength?

Are you a strong Christian? If so, how do you know? If not, how do you know? What makes a strong Christian? How can a Christian truly know if he is weak or strong? It is not a matter of feeling – "I feel strong." That's not the gauge. It is not a matter of other's opinions – "You are a strong Christian." That's not the gauge. From whence then cometh a Christian's strength?

The apostle John penned, "I have written to you, young men, because you are strong, and the word of God abides in you, and you have overcome the wicked one" (1 John 2:14). The two present tense verbs are linked together – "you ARE strong...the word of God ABIDES in you." As with physical strengthening, spiritual strengthening takes energy, effort and endurance in lifting the weight of God's Word and pressing it into the depths of one's soul.

The word strengthens...the strong overcome...and overcomers are victorious (5:4). Now, back to the question: Are you a strong Christian? How often do you work out in God's gym? – DS
