## Looking at the World Through the Eyes of Jesus

through the eyes

When Israel demanded that God give them a king, He gave them precisely what they wanted. They sincerely believed that a warrior who intimidated their enemies in battle would be the answer to all of their problems, so He gave them King Saul who towered above most of Israel. They were so

wrong and the reason for this is seen in the words of the Lord to Samuel. When God replaced the warrior with a shepherd boy He said, "For the Lord does not see as

man sees; for man looks at the outward appearance, to see the people but the Lord looks at the heart" (1 Sam. 16:7).

All of us often make the same mistake. Look at how Jesus looked at others, not as a man looks, but He looked at their hearts.

The people saw ignorant and unlearned laborers. Peter and John were lowly fishermen. The Jewish leaders called them "uneducated and untrained men" (Acts 4:13). Yet, Jesus chose them, for He sees more than outward appearance.

The people saw a religiously prejudiced man. If you had talked to Nathaniel about Jesus of Nazareth, you would have seen his warped view about anything good coming out of Nazareth (John 1:44). The Lord saw Him as one who would play a vital role as one who was a witness of the risen Savior (John 21:2). The Lord does not look at appearances but at hearts!

The people saw a corrupt tax collector. The most despised Jews in Israel were those who became agents to collect tax for the Roman government. Jesus not only called Matthew (Levi) to be an apostle, but He immediately went to his house to eat with him and his "evil" friends (Mark 2:14-15). Man looks on the outside. Jesus looks on the inside.

The people saw a terrorist. Most Jews had learned to live with the oppression of the Romans, but among May God help us them were the Zealots or Zealotes. The Zealotes were fanatical nationalists who were sworn to assassinate every traitor and Roman they could find. The people saw Simon the Zealot as an assassin. Jesus saw Simon the Zealot as an apostle (Luke 6:15).

The people saw a bothersome child. Even of Jesus! the apostles tried to keep children away from the Lord, for they saw them as a nuisance. Jesus rebuked these men and used a child to teach one of His greatest lessons. Jesus did not look on the problems children cause. He saw them as future servants in a greater cause.

> The people saw an adulteress, an immoral woman at a well, lepers, physically handicapped people, the lame, the blind and the sick. Yet, Jesus saw these people so differently. Think about this. With our gospel meeting just before us, what are you seeing in those around you? May God help us to see the people around us through the eyes of Jesus!

## The Christian and Voluntary Unemployment

There is so much happening in our nation that it is difficult to keep up with it all. One very troublesome trend over the last several years has been the high unemployment and the extreme difficulty that many have in finding a job. My heart goes out to those who want to work and are persistently

looking for work but are unable to find work. (The rest of this

article is not directed at these folks, for they are determined to find employment and work.) However, with so many "government programs" available to assist those who are not working, it has become common (and even expected in some circles) for some capable and responsible individuals to choose not to work and just receive the "government assistance." What is a Christian to do? That is what this article seeks to address. This is not a political matter!

This is a Biblical matter! As Christians, we must (1) know what the Bible teaches regarding the matter of "working for a living" and (2) submit ourselves in obedience to whatever it says!

God expects His children to have a job and work! In one of the clearest verses in the Bible, the Lord declares, "If anyone is not willing to work, then he is not to eat, either" (2 Thess. 3:10, NASB). That's pretty strong language!

God expects His children to work so that they can

help others! Working is not merely a selfish act for selfish gain. A Christian is to "labor, doing honest work with his own hands, so that he may have something to share with anyone in need" (Eph. 4:28, ESV). That's pretty straightforward!

God expects His children to work so that they can take care of their family! It is not the government's job to take care of our family! It's ours! The Lord said plainly, "But if anyone does not provide for his own, and especially for those


> of his household, he has denied the faith and is worse than an unbeliever" (1 Tim. 5:8). That's pretty easy to understand!

> God expects His children to work so that they can support His work through the church! Christians are commanded (not just a whimsical wish of God) to "lay something aside" (a financial contribution to the church) "every first day of the week" (1

Cor. 16:1-2). That's pretty clear!

God expects His children to work and to not be lazy! At least 15 times in the book of Proverbs, God calls out and rebukes "the lazy man" who: "buries his hand in the bowl, and will not so much as bring it to his mouth again" (19:24; 26:15); "refuses to labor" (21:25); "turns on his bed" (26:14); etc. Read the book of Proverbs and grasp God's concept of laziness!

Christians are set apart! We must conform to God's standard—not society's! Still, we must be balanced. (Next week)

### "He's trying to find himself"

Have you ever heard someone say about another person (who had withdrawn himself and was spending all of his time alone and separated from his family, friends and church), "Well, he's just trying to find himself"? May I suggest to you that if someone is trying to "find himself," and has undertaken that endeavor while separating himself from the church, that the "self" he finds will be the "self" that he himself wants to find and not necessarily the one God wants him to find.

Too many individuals think that they can figure life out "on their own." They think that they have it within themselves to determine "who" they are, "what" they need to do, "where" they need to go and "how" they should go about it. However, such a person has forgotten that (1) "the way of man is not in himself; It is not in man who walks to direct his own steps" (Jer. 10:23), and (2) "the steps of a man are established by the Lord, and He delights in his way" (Psa. 37:23).

Are you trying to find yourself? Turn to the Lord. Get in His church. Let Him help you! -DS

### So, deacons can drink a little but elders none at all. Right?

There is a feeble argument often attempted to make a significant difference between an elder's qualification to be "not given to wine" (1 Tim. 3:3) and a deacon's qualification to be "not given to much wine" (1 Tim. 3:8). Can a deacon drink a little, while an elder is to totally abstain? Here's the real question: if the Bible condemns something in excess in one passage, does that mean that God is permitting that same behavior in moderation?

God says, "Do not be overly wicked" (Ecc. 7:17). Would moderately wicked be ok? God says, "Therefore lay aside all filthiness and overflow of wickedness" (Jas. 1:21). Would moderate filthiness that doesn't overflow be ok? God says, "They think it strange that ye run not with them to the same excess of riot" (1 Pet. 4:4). Would moderate rioting be ok? God says of false teachers, "...having eyes full of adultery" (2 Pet. 2:14). Would eyes half-full of adultery be ok?

You get the point, and it's obvious, isn't it! The English might appear to make a "quantity" difference, but God was not, is not and does not! He clearly said to every one of us (elders, deacons, all Christians young and old), "Abstain" (1 Pet. 2:11)! – DS

# "Family, A Basic Need"

Abraham Maslow, in 1943, published his work, "A Theory of Human Motivation." In it he produced a pyramid of basic human needs. It has come to be known as "Maslow's Hierarchy of Needs." He wanted to see what truly motivated people and what made them who they are. These needs were drawn from the study of what he called "exemplary people." This group included the healthiest 1% of the college population and Albert Einstein, Jane Addams, Eleanor Roosevelt and Frederick Douglass (all of whom were very extraordinary people). At the very heart of the pyramid is the need for "love and belongingness," that is, the need to be a part of something bigger. Listed there are these two words, "friendship" and "family." What does that tell us? It tells us that science knows that God has hard-wired us with the need to belong. God created the family and the church as a source to fulfill that need.

With this in mind, read Ephesians 2:19, "So then you are no longer strangers and aliens (not belonging), but you are fellow citizens with the saints, and are of God's household (belonging)." In this chapter Paul speaks of the love of the Father and how, "in Christ Jesus, you who formerly were far off (not belonging) have been brought near (belonging) by the blood of Christ" (Eph. 2:13). In this chapter, we see how we once did not belong, had no part with God, but now we are part of His family. God both programed us to belong and provided a source for that need.

Nobody's family is perfect, we all struggle to do the best we can. Some of us are the only ones in our families that believe and that is a struggle. Our biological families can and should be our source for a sense of belonging, and we should do all we can to make that a reality. Then the question is, what happens when they are not? What we need to understand is that the church, the family of God, should also be that source. What would happen if we all put the "one another" passages into practice? If we truly treated one another as brothers and sisters (1 Tim. 5:1-2)? If when we asked, "how are you doing," we genuinely meant it (Phil. 2:3-4)? We would, in essence, simply be fulfilling the intent of the Father, and we would be bringing to fruition what He intended.

So the challenge is to broaden our scope of the word "family." It no longer includes "me and mine" only, but those who call God, "Abba, Father" (Rom. 8:15) and have been washed in the blood of His Son (1 Cor. 6:11; Rev. 7:14). We can create this environment at Palm Beach Lakes, but it will only happen if we make the choice to include God's group of extraordinary people (1 Pet. 2:9) in our definition of "family."
