The Christian and Balancing Life

In gymnastics, one of the more challenging exercises is the balance beam. On a horizontal raised apparatus that is only four inches wide, the gymnast performs various balancing feats, trying not fall off either side. Some gymnasts make it look so easy; some seem a little less skilled; some of us would

make fools of ourselves just taking one step onto the beam. As with most endeavors, practice and determination are the keys to success in maintaining proper balance.

As faithful

As Christians, we have a balance beam on which we walk with the Lord. Except, as Christians, this is not a sport or a competition—it is real life! As Christians, it is not a mere four feet down if we fall—it is a bottomless pit that awaits! Therefore, with an eternal home in heaven at stake, it is vital that we give ourselves to practice and determination, in order to keep ourselves properly balanced.

Christians walking this narrow balance beam of life...

As faithful Christians (based on God's view of "faithfulness"), we must maintain a proper balance between:

- Work and recreation/play (2 Thess. 3:10).
- Work and worship (Matt. 4:4; Acts 2:42).
- Work and Christian fellowship (Acts 2:46-47).
- Work and personal time with God's Word (Psa. 119:97).

- Work and family (1 Tim. 5:8; Eph. 5:22-6:4).
- Recreation/play and worship (John 4:24; Psa. 122:1).
- Recreation/play and Christian fellowship (Jas. 1:27; 5:16).
- Recreation/play and personal time with God (Jas. 4:7-10).
- Recreation/play and family (Deut. 6:4-9; Phil. 2:3-4).

The list could go on and on. That's why practice and determination are so critical. Too often we get set in a certain pattern of daily living and we lose sight of those things that are of actual (and eternal) value.

Regardless of how much we may have rationalized our behavior, Jesus still tells us, "But seek first the kingdom of God and His righteousness, and all these things shall be added to you" (Matt. 6:33).

Regardless of how important other things, responsibilities, people or plans have become in our lives, the Lord still tells us, "He is the head of the body, the church...that in all things He may have the preeminence" (Col. 1:18).

Regardless of how busy we allow (or intentionally plan) our schedules to become, Scripture still tells us, "...Be... always abounding in the work of the Lord" (1 Cor. 15:58).

Proper balance requires proper priorities! Best of all, as faithful Christians, when we are walking this narrow balance beam of life, we have the Lord holding our hand to help us!



What if light had free will?

The very first instruction of God recorded in the Bible is found in Genesis 1:3, "Then God said, 'Let there be light." Imagine for a moment that God had given light the freedom to make its own choices. When God said, "Let there be light," would it bother you if the very next statement said, "But light was too busy at the moment"? Or, "But light just wasn't 'feelin' it' right then"? Or, "While light had good intentions, it ultimately decided there were other things more important"?

Back in the realm of reality, we know that light was not given free will. We know that when God said, "Let there be light," that the very next statement said, "and there was light." Light didn't have a choice. It did what God told it to do.

Rather than "flex" our free will or allow it to "make excuses" for us, what if we were like light? What if, when God told us to do something, the very next statement could be, "and it was done"? We can learn a lot from the very first instruction of God in the Bible! – DS

How to listen to a sermon

You may not agree with this, but preaching is "an art" or someone might call it "a craft." Proper effort must be given to honing the "skill" of preaching and then to each individual "sermon." So, if preaching is "an art" which requires proper effort on the preacher's part, then would listening to a sermon also be considered "an art" (or "a craft") that requires proper effort on the listener's part? (You know...the preaching of God's Word is one of the avenues of worship for all Christians/worshipers, not just for the preacher.) So, how should someone listen to a sermon?

God honored the Bereans in Acts 17 as a noble (fair-minded) people and then explained why He considered them as such. As Paul was preaching the gospel, (1) they were eager ("with all readiness"); (2) they were welcoming ("received the word"); (3) they were diligent ("searched the Scriptures"); (4) they were discriminating ("to find out whether these things were so").

During a sermon, are you **eager**, **welcoming**, **diligent** and **discriminating**? That's how God tells us to listen to a sermon! – DS


