# Looking at the Church Through the Eyes of Jesus

The church is

seen as "pests"

which must be

our society

Before the world began, God knew that someday He would establish the church. Paul described this mystery of God's plan as having been hidden in Him from the beginning of the ages (Eph. 3:9). He planned for all men to be brought together into one body, the church (Eph. 3:6; 1:22-23).

Modern America seems to have no regard for God and even less for the church. It is true that denominationalism, religious divisions and actions done by those who claim to be Christians but fail to honor the Lord and His original plan have contributed to this disrespect. However, think of the contrast in the view America has for the church and the way Jesus looks at the true church He established.

The world despises the church because the church believes in an absolute standard for right and wrong. It is not culture or society which determines what is moral or immoral. His people are often seen as "pests" whose influence must be eradicated from our land. Freedom in America means that every person should do what is "right in his own eyes" (Judges 17:6) and no one has the right to criticize anyone's choices.

Christians in the first century were seen as ignorant, unlearned, uneducated and untrained (Acts 4:13), and twenty centuries later they are often seen in the same way. The world refuses to look at the evidence for the deity of Jesus and the work He did, and they mockingly describe Christians as having blind faith in a myth which has no more basis for reality than the blind faith children have in Santa Claus.

Now contrast this with how Jesus sees the church. His regard for the church can be seen in the agony of Gethsemane and the cruelty of Calvary. Why would Jesus, God in the flesh,

> endure such things? The answer is found in the reality that the blood the Lord shed was that which purchased the church (Acts 20:28). He sees the church as those people who have been washed in His blood (Acts 22:16) and have been sanctified, cleansed and therefore are without blemish (Eph. 5:26-27).

eradicated from Because the church as been cleansed "with the washing of water by the word," His people are "a glorious church, not having spot or wrinkle or any such thing." The church is His beautiful bride and He loved His bride so much that He gave Himself to purchase her (Eph. 5:23-27).

> So the question to be determined is which view is the right view of the church? Once we understand the answer, we must never share the world's view of the body of Jesus. Someday those who have mocked the church and denigrated His bride will stand before God. You will also stand there. Which view do you have of the church? Which view will you have when you stand before the Lord? Think about it!

# "I want to be baptized. What do I need to know?" (Part 1)

Some critical

things to know,

to understand

Being baptized into Jesus Christ is the single greatest event any person will ever have in life! It is the most important decision that any person will ever make in life! When someone says, "I want to be baptized," there are some critical things for him/ her to know, to understand and to do, in

order for his/her baptism to truly be the baptism of which we read in the New Testament. (After all, why would anyone want any other baptism than the one in the New Testament, which is the only one approved by God?)

(For the purpose of this series of articles, we are going to assume that the person who wants to be and to do before baptized has heard about Jesus, is of accountable age being baptized. and is desiring to be immersed in water. We are going to assume that the person has heard about the necessity of baptism and has expressed a strong desire to be baptized. For each of these elements, there is great joy.)

In Acts 8:36, there was a man who wanted to be baptized. Having been taught about Jesus (and obviously taught about baptism, as well), he saw a body of water and exclaimed, "See, here is water. What hinders me from being baptized?" What a great desire! What a great question! He recognized there must be something he needed to know or

needed to do before he could be baptized. And, he was right.

Before the man in Acts 8 could be baptized, there were some truths that he needed to understand. Before he could be baptized, there were some steps that he needed to take. Before he could be baptized, he needed to have a proper understanding of baptism from both the Scriptural and the personal perspective. Bible baptism is both a vital and urgent matter, but it must not be entered into without (1) proper

> Scriptural understanding, (2) deep personal reflection, and (3) strong rest-of-life devotion.

> So, you want to be baptized? That is so wonderful! Here are some Biblical matters for you to consider; please make them personal to you.

> To be a proper subject for Bible baptism and to properly obey this part of God's plan, one must understand:

1. The all-authoritative nature of Scripture (God's Word). The Bible is God's inspired (2 Tim. 3:16), all-sufficient (2 Pet. 1:3), perfect (Jas. 1:25), complete (Rev. 22:18-19), unchanging (Psa. 119:89), unchangeable (Gal. 1:6-9), final (Jude 3) revelation of His divine will, which will judge us in the end (Matt. 28:18 + John 12:48). All that we do in word or in deed (which includes being baptized) must be done according to the authoritative name of Jesus Christ (Col. 3:17)! Our entrance into heaven depends on it (Matt. 7:21-23)!

#### **HOV Lane to Heaven?**

HOV lanes are great! They have limited access, so there are not as many cars in that lane. With limited access, the traffic usually moves along at a more consistent pace. However, as the last two sentences have suggested, not everyone is permitted to drive in an HOV lane. Access is limited! Limited to drivers who have at least one other person with them in the car! If you're by yourself, all alone in your travel, you are not permitted in the HOV lane.

Suppose that access to heaven was like driving in an HOV lane. Suppose that you could not travel the highway into heaven's gates unless you had someone with you—i.e., unless you had taught and helped to convert another person to the gospel, you were not permitted into heaven. Would that limit access to heaven? Would that keep some Christians out of the pearly gates?

That may sound awfully narrow, but read Matthew 7:13-14. That may sound awfully restrictive, but read Mark 16:15 and James 4:17 together. Does heaven have an "HOV lane" (only)? – DS

## Is your grease trap getting regular cleanings?

Commercial kitchen owners and operators know about grease traps. Grease traps are essential to drainage systems from commercial kitchens, for they "catch" and "collect" most of the greases and/or solids that come from the kitchens before they reach the sewer system. But, here's the thing: these grease traps must be cleaned out on a regular basis, otherwise they will "collect" so much grease that it will block the drain lines from the kitchen and cause messy backups. "Collecting" the grease is important, but "cleaning" it is even more vital in the long run.

Somewhere in here is a spiritual lesson (or two). In our spiritual lives, our souls have something like a "grease trap." It "catches" and "collects" all of the sins that we commit. Imagine how clogged it can become over time. On a regular basis, we need to have that trap "cleaned out," so that we can avoid messy backups. When one is baptized into Christ, the blood of Jesus completely purges all sin from our "sin trap." Then, as Christians, as we continue to "walk in the light" of purity and fellowship with God, He keeps on cleansing our "sin trap" (1 John 1:7)! – DS


