

God Does Not Use "Bribery" to Gain Followers

It is remarkable that some ignorantly try to deny the existence of God by saying, "If there is a God, why do bad things happen to good people?" This question has been answered often and is not the focus of this article. A far greater question to be considered is, "If there is a God why do good things

happen to bad people."

existence. Unlike godly people who willingly submit to their Creator, our world refuses to acknowledge Him and stubbornly rebels against Him. Yet every breath they take is from Him. Job said that God held in His hand ". . . the life of every living thing and the breath of all mankind" (Job 12:9). Paul reminded the atheists of His day of this fundamental truth. "He

gives to all life, breath and all things . . . For in Him we live and move and have our being" (Acts 17:25, 28). Yet, in spite of such rebellion, good things still happen to evil men!

It is not because they have no need of Him. In the Old Testament the Jews failed miserably to reflect the light of God to the pagan nations around them, yet even then God manifested His existence to evil men. Paul described how God allowed them to ignore Him, yet ". . . He did not leave Himself without witness, in that He did good, gave us rain from heaven

and fruitful seasons" (Acts 14:17). Evil men, then and now, need Him, yet ignore Him. There is not one drop of rain which falls on evil men nor one beacon of light and warmth from the sun which does not show His existence (Matt. 5:45). Evil men deny this, yet still good things happen to bad people.

It is not because evil men have earned good things and therefore deserve them. Had they earned them, then God would be indebted to give blessings as payment to It is not because they acknowledge God's Consider this. "If them as rewards. greater than God. Yet we are not the creator of God, but He is our Creator, and His holiness is our objective. In spite of the fact that evil men "deserve" only evil things to come to them, He gives good things to them. It is because of His nature and not ours. He

is the Almighty God and His actions are sovereign. His blessings are proof of His existence, but they are also proof of His love for His us. Consider this. If while the world was filled with wickedness Christ died for it (Rom. 5:8), should we be surprised that our loving God sends physical blessings on His creation? His nature also is not to use "bribery" to get men to serve Him. If good things only happened to good men, then all would serve Him for the wrong reasons.

God is great; He is sovereign; He is good! It is so tragic that evil men ignore the source of the good in their lives.

When someone says, "I want to be baptized," there are some critical things to know, to understand and to do, starting with a respect for the all-authoritative nature of Scripture. 2. Man's desperate need for salvation. Man's relationship with God (or more rightly stated, man's right relationship with God) is of utmost importance, for dire consequences await those who are not in a proper relationship with the God of heaven. The Bible vivid-"for" (in order to ly depicts that "all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God" (Rom. 3:23) and that "the wages obtain) salvation pose which God assigned to baptism. While it is a [thereof] is death" (6:23). Those who want to be baptized must grasp the gravity of their condition and the absolute desperation with which they turn to God!


3. God's full plan of salvation. Too often we shortchange God's plan of salvation by focusing, almost exclusively, on one piece of His plan to the neglect (sometimes) of the full plan. Having a full appreciation of baptism necessitates having a full appreciation of God's entire plan. There is not one single act or step alone that saves man. Truly, we are saved by the wonderful grace of our Lord (Eph. 2:5, 8), and we must never turn so inward that we lose sight of His precious gift! Still, God's

grace teaches us (yes, grace teaches, Titus 2:11-12) that salvation from sin comes through faith (Eph. 2:8; Gal. 3:26), which willingly turns away from sin and toward God (Acts 3:19; 26:18), joyfully confesses its confidence of heart (Rom. 10:9-10) and is immersed in water (1 Pet. 3:21). One's salvation does not stop there, for it is just beginning! God's grace requires faithful living according to His Biblical standard (1 John 1:7; Rev. 2:10). Yes, before one is baptized, he not only needs

to "know the steps" in order to be able to "recite Must understand them," but he needs to be able to appreciate God's plan as He alone has ordered it!

> 4. The purpose of baptism in God's plan. It is absolutely essential that one understand the precise pur-"good" thing to do and a "right" thing to do and an "important" thing to do (all very true), none of these

represent the actual purpose for which God requires one to be baptized. To be a proper subject for baptism and obey this part of God's plan properly, one must understand that baptism is "for" (meaning, in order to obtain something not yet possessed) salvation from sins (Mark 16:16), forgiveness of sins (Acts 2:38; 22:16), entering a right relationship with God (Matt. 28:19), placing one into Christ (Rom. 6:3; Gal. 3:27), placing one into Christ's church (Acts 2:41+47; 1 Cor. 12:13; John 3:5), becoming a child of God (Gal. 3:26-27). Without this as its purpose, baptism has no purpose! (More next week)

Everybody's got a king!

You may not realize this or even believe it. Everyone has a king! Those who live in countries like Saudi Arabia would readily agree with that—they are ruled by an absolute monarch. Those who live in countries like Great Britain might have some understanding and yet some disagreement—they have a Queen, a Prime Minister and a Parliament. But a king? Citizens of the United States might say, "No, we have a President, not a King!" Everybody has their opinion on this, based probably solely on their country of nationality or residency.

However, it doesn't matter WHERE you live on this earth or WHEN you live. Everyone has a king! Who is your king? In the Old Testament, the Jews had God as their King (1 Sam. 12:12), but they chose a different king (1 Sam. 8:5, 7). In the New Testament, Jesus is King (John 18:36-37; 1 Tim. 1:17); in fact, He is King of kings (1 Tim. 6:15; Rev. 1:5; 17:14; 19:16); but some choose another king (Rom. 6:12; John 12:31). While there are multiple kings to serve, Jesus said you can only serve one (Matt. 6:24)! **Who is your king?** – DS

Whose? Well, mine, of course!

A whiny man (at least, "whiny" in this writer's estimation) stepped out of the crowd and ordered Jesus, "Tell my brother to divide the inheritance **WITH ME**" (Luke 12:13, emp. added). "I want mine! Gimme mine!" Jesus took this occasion to tell the parable of a rich fool. Notice the **personal pronouns** used by a rich fool. "The ground of a certain rich man yielded plentifully. And he **thought** within himself, saying, 'What shall I do, since I have no room to store my crops?' So he said, 'I will do this: I will pull down my barns and build greater, and there I will store all my crops and my goods. And I will say to my soul, "Soul, you have many goods laid up for many years; take your ease; eat, drink, and be merry"" (12:16-19, emp. added).

Don't miss what happened! "But God said to him, 'Fool! This night <u>your soul</u> will be required of <u>you</u>; then WHOSE will those things be which <u>you</u> have provided?'" (12:20, emp. added). Indeed, whose will they be? Only a fool would say at that point, "Well, mine, of course!"

Quick question: Are you laying up treasure **for you**, or are you rich toward **God** (v. 21)? – DS
