## **Lessons Learned by Singing in the Foyer**

I am not exactly sure why I enjoy those fifth Sunday night singings in the foyer, but I really enjoy them. It's not just because it is different, but because I am reminded again and again of the wisdom of God in making singing part of our worship. These singings allow for so much spiritual growth

when we devote ourselves to them.

I enjoy singing in the foyer because we sing, and singing involves our souls. Have you considered that God could have just had us to quote or read passages of Scripture? We often sing songs, like the twenty-third psalm, which are almost completely based on selected phrases from the Bible. Why would not God just have us read those passages in unison? Would it not impact us in the same way and

have the same effect? No way! Take time to think of the implication of James 5:13, "Is any cheerful? Let him sing." Our emotions are tied directly to singing. One might be able to read Psalm 23 without his emotions being stirred, but somehow God made us so that singing touches our souls.

I enjoy singing in the foyer because I can hear so many around me singing. The design of singing is obviously vertical as our voices reach the portals of heaven, but it is also horizontal. God in his wisdom designed singing so we could

speak to each other as we sing. The Holy Spirit described what happens in our worship when He said, "Speaking to one another in psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, singing and making melody in your heart to the Lord" (Eph. 5:19). Those Sunday nights when we sit facing each other allows me to see the joy and faith you have and to be edified by hearing your words. This happens in each of our services, but singing in the foyer allows me to hear so many of those who are there encouraging me to serve the Lord.

I am reminded again of the wisdom of God in having us sing in our worship

I love singing in the foyer because there is a great sense of us being of one heart and mind. The Lord established the church and that church is a family. We are a body where each of us plays a vital role in each other's life, and this is possible because we are all in the *same* family, the *same* body. We have the *same* goals and values in life. We have the *same* 

purpose for living. Paul said, "For to me, to live is Christ" (Phil. 1:21). This is so apparent to me as we sing together.

I also love singing when we are not in the foyer. Reread this article and realize that what is said of singing in the foyer can happen all the time. It seems easier on those fifth Sunday nights, but singing is of Divine origin, and He designed it to fit every occasion. # "I want to be baptized. What do I need to know?" (Part 4 of 4)


"Look! Water! What prevents me from being baptized?" The man in Acts 8 was excited about the prospect of being baptized and wanted to know what stood between him and obeying what he had been taught. From this man's request, we learn that baptism is an integral part of the message of

Jesus, and we also learn that there are some prerequisites in order for one to be a proper subject for Bible baptism and to properly obey this part of God's plan. In addition to the seven items already considered, one must understand:

- **8.** The peculiarity of Bible baptism. Just because someone has had a "religious experience with water" does not necessarily mean that they have been Biblically baptized. A baby being sprinkled is not Bible baptism (Mark 16:16). An adult being sprinkled is not Bible baptism (Rom. 6:4). A believer being immersed, who thinks he is already saved before baptism, is not Bible baptism (Acts 2:38). A baptism to become part of a denomination is not Bible baptism (1 Cor. 12:13). Bible baptism is of a peculiar individual, for a peculiar purpose, to enter a peculiar church. Any other "baptism" cannot be reassessed and then reapplied as "Bible baptism."
- **9.** The urgency of baptism. If one is willing to wait for a later, better or more convenient time... Or, if one is willing to wait until a Sunday service when the whole church is together... Or,

if one is willing to wait until some family member or friend is in town to witness the event... Then he is not grasping the urgency and is likely not ready. In baptism, the blood of Jesus washes away one's sins (Acts 22:16)—those sins that separate someone from God (Isa. 59:1-2; 2 Thess. 1:8-9). If a person decides that he "can wait" a few days or weeks or months to be baptized, then he does not realize the true nature, purpose and urgency of Bible baptism.

are	So, you want to be baptized? That is so great! Now, you ready? Think through and answer these questions:
	Do I understand the all-authoritative nature of Scripture?
	Do I understand man's desperate need for salvation?
	Do I understand God's full plan of salvation, which involves my open faith in Jesus and repentance from sin?
	Do I understand the purpose of baptism in God's plan?
	Do I understand the unique nature of the Lord's church and the essentiality it must have in my life?
	Do I understand the commitment that is being made in baptism and am I ready for that commitment?
	Do I understand that God only has one saving plan?
	Do I understand the peculiarity of Bible baptism?
	Do Lunderstand the urgency of hantism?

#### Read it...for yourself!

How many people have you heard <u>criticizing</u> the Bible but they've never read it themselves? They make comments like: "The Bible is full of contradictions." "The Bible is full of errors." "The Bible is just a book full of kid stories." Such bold and reckless claims, yet they've never read it.

How many people have you heard <u>teaching</u> the Bible but they've never read it themselves? There are teachers and preachers who teach the Bible (or at least certain parts of it or what someone else has written about it) but they've never actually read it and studied it themselves.

How many people have you heard <u>believing</u> the Bible but they've never read it themselves? They have heard other people talk so glowingly about it that they base their faith on the words of another rather than the words of the Book itself.

Now, of these three examples, which one is acceptable? Is it acceptable to criticize the Bible without ever reading it? Is it acceptable to believe the Bible without ever

#### "It's none of the elders' business!"

So often—when shepherds of a congregation are making efforts to shepherd straying sheep whose attendance at worship has fallen off—a member will be heard to say, "Well, that's none of the elders' business! They just need to leave me alone! If I'm there or not there is none of their business!" As gently as I can say this, such a position is absolutely baseless.

Here are two things to think about. First, whether a Christian is "there or not there" for worship absolutely does make a difference, for a child of God is under command to "not forsake the assembly" (Heb. 10:25) and "not to put a stumbling block...in our brother's way" (Rom. 14:13). Second, that same God ordained elders to be shepherds of His flock and "watch out for your soul" (Heb. 13:17). For your soul, the elders "must give account" to God (Heb. 13:17). The instruction to every member of the flock is, "Let [the elders] do so with joy and not with grief."

For a Christian to assert, "If I'm there or not there is none of the elders' business," has no Biblical foundation! Shepherds cannot afford to shirk their God-given responsibilities! -DS
