

Understanding the Heart of a Visitor

There is a principle taught repeatedly throughout the Bible about how we should treat others. Simply stated, it is that we should: (1) put ourselves in the place of those around us, (2) ask ourselves how we would want to be treated, and (3) treat them in that way. Before the exodus, the Jews had

been strangers in Egypt. As they left the land of bondage and headed for the Promised Land, God spoke of the shall not oppress a stranger, for you know the heart of a stranger, because you were strangers in the land of Egypt" (Ex. 23:9). Because they had once us treat others as been strangers, they had "the heart of a stranger" and were able to know how to treat others.

treat us. In view of the many visitors who come our way and especially those we trust will come next Sunday for our "Coming Home" Sunday, we need to put ourselves in the place of visitors. Having the "heart of a visitor" we must treat others as we would have them treat us (Matt. 7:12).

If I were a visitor, I would want to be welcomed from the time I got out of my car. Every week, but especially next Sunday, greet every person you see as you walk toward the building. If you do not know them, introduce yourself, and let them know you are so glad they have chosen to come to visit.

If I were a visitor, I would want to be welcomed from the time I entered the foyer. There is that awkward moment when anyone enters a new building and is overwhelmed by the fact that so many "belong" in the foyer and are so happy to see each other, while the visitor has no sense of belonging. Every week, but especially next week, have the "heart of a visitor" and make them feel comfortable and sense they are in a place of warm Christian friends.

If I were a visitor, I would want to be welstrangers who would soon live among them. "You Having the heart comed from the time I entered the auditorium. Those Christians, who demand their "end pew seats" and force visitors to climb over them to sit, send a silent message to visitors. Those Christians who readily move and give up their seats also send a silent message. Jesus rebuked those who "love the chief seats in the synagogue," and many Christians fail to listen to Him.

> If I were a visitor, I would want to be welcomed and greeted before and after worship. Letting visitors know with friendly words and warm smiles we are glad they have come is so important. Before spending time visiting with each other, we must spend time with those we do not know. This is a vital part of having the "heart of a visitor."

> Great opportunities surround us. God help us to do all we can to touch the lives of those who enter our services. How we treat them can make an eternal difference!

If someone "believes in Jesus," does that mean he is saved and a child of God? Could a "believer in Jesus" actually be a child of the devil? Let's look at what Jesus said about this. Whatever He says will settle it!

In John 8, Jesus preached to a group of Jews, affirming His deity (8:14-19), warn-

ing of spiritual death (8:21-24), predicting His crucifixion (8:28) and requiring faith to escape eternal punishment According to (8:24). Verse 30 plainly states, "As He spoke these

words, many believed in Him." There you have it- many denominamany believed in Jesus! Were they saved? Were they free from sin? Were they children of God? Keep reading, for Jesus continues speaking to them.

Verse 31 begins: "Jesus said to those Jews believes. who believed in Him..." These are the same people who heard His preaching and "believed in Him" in verse 30. What did Jesus say to them?

To believers, Jesus gave conditions to be His disci-"If you abide in My word, you are My disciples indeed" (8:31). Were they not already His disciples by believing?

To believers, Jesus gave conditions to be free from sin. "If you abide in My word...you shall know the truth, and the truth shall make you free" (8:32). Were they not already free from sin by believing in Him?

To believers, Jesus affirmed that they were not children of God. "Jesus said to them [same believers in the context], 'If God were your Father...'" (8:42). Were they not already children of God by virtue of believing in Jesus?

To believers, Jesus affirmed that they were children of the devil. "You are of your father the devil, and the desires of your father you want to do" (8:44). Had they not escaped the clutches of the devil by believing in Jesus?

> How could believers NOT be disciples, NOT be free from sin, NOT be children of God and ACTU-ALLY be children of the devil? According to many denominations today, one is saved when he believes.

> Why were these believers still lost? Jesus tells us (when He told them). He told them that they must abide in His word, but then announced, "My word has no place in you" (8:37), and then, "You are

not able to listen to My word." Believers must obey His word!

Perhaps if we go back to the beginning of the book of John, we can find God's explanation for what a believer in Jesus actually is or has. What does Jesus "give" to "those who believe in His name"? Read John 1:12 carefully. "To them He gave the right to become children of God." Believing did not make them children of God or free from sin! It simply gave them the Jesus-given right to BECOME such! Believers must obey; otherwise, they remain "of the devil" (cf. John 3:36)!

Reassuring Truth: Jesus remains the same!

In a book that exalts Jesus Christ and everything about Him as being superior in every way, the New Testament epistle of Hebrews makes a stunning, refreshing, comforting declaration in its first chapter and its last chapter. In a quotation from Psalm 102:25-27, which depicts the perishable and changing nature of all things, it is said to Jesus, "You are the same" (Heb. 1:12). While everything else around us changes, Jesus remains the same! Then, in the last chapter, the writer affirms, "Jesus Christ is the same yesterday, today, and forever" (13:8).

Jesus does not change! His nature does not change! His character does not change! His love does not change! His gospel does not change! His plan does not change! His promise does not change! His hope does not change! Thank God that Jesus does not change!

Amidst everything else that changes, how stunning, refreshing and comforting is this truth! You can count on Him! And He won't (doesn't) change! He is the "I AM" (John 8:58)! – DS

Working Together

Have you ever been part of a group project? In the ideal situation, everyone has an equal share of the work and helps with the final project. Often there are one or two people in the group who do very little or nothing. There are many people, who are willing to let others do the work, rather than do work for others. This is a group dynamic that is generally true. That is why group projects (and political parties), based on the concept that "we all work for the common good," usually don't last. "Why?" you ask. Because in the end, we are more motivated by personal gain than the "good of others." It is too easy to sit back and do less and still receive the same reward.

However, as Paul wrote, "you have not so learned Christ" (Eph. 4:20). The church isn't the same. It is not some man-made institution where human concepts always apply. The church is a hybrid of better things. By that I mean we need to work for the common good and for individual responsibility. Paul mentioned to the Philippians that the work they did would "increase to their account" (Phil. 4:17). Christ is seen in Revelation chapters two and three judging whole congregations saying, "I know your deeds" (Rev. 2:2, 19, 23; 3:1, 8, 15). In that same context, Christ also mentioned individuals (Rev. 2:20). The New Testament is very emphatic about personal responsibility, or every man being judged "according to his deeds" (Rom. 2:6).

So, what does this have to do with the Family/Youth? We need everyone involved. This is an "all hands on deck" call! Amazing things can be done with God, faith and a mind to work (Neh. 4:6). We have to put aside the concept that says, "I belong to the group so I can get the benefits" or "This isn't about me." While it is true that belonging to a faithful, healthy congregation has its benefits, it is equally true that you will be judged by your own fruits (Matt. 7:20). Coming to worship is not involvement but rather an aspect in the lifestyle of a person who calls Christ, "Lord." What Christ wants is that all would be active in the work of His church, like "living stones" (1 Pet. 2:5). You can be active through the "Family and Youth," "Laborers Together with God" or in ways that no one will ever see. The important thing is that we are actively living our devotion. Paul wrote this to Titus, "Our people must also learn to engage in good deeds to meet pressing needs, so that they will not be unfruitful" (3:14). There are "pressing needs" that nobody can do for us. Christ already did all the heavy lifting, showing us love through self-sacrifice. It is our turn to show love through obedience.
