Win the Pornography War!

Pornographic material is more prevalent and easily accessed today than it ever has been. With a mobile device, salacious images and videos can be viewed anywhere, at anytime, by anyone so effortlessly that it makes it seem (to some) to be completely innocent and acceptable. However, just be-

cause Satan makes sin easy, seemingly common and widely available does not make it any less damnable. What It's hard to sin

it does mean is that we must ramp up our efforts to successfully fight the battles and win the war!

So, what can we do to win the war against pornography and save our souls, our relationships, our marriages and our moral purity?

Divert the eyes. Close them. Look the othover again! er way. As some have suggested, "bounce the eyes" to some other viewing object. Make "a covenant with [your] eyes" (Job 31:1) to not look where you should not be looking!

Divert the attention. Immediately "set your mind on things above" (Col. 3:1-2). Turn your thoughts toward other matters that can absorb your consideration—spiritual things, recreational things, work things, specific things of life.

Turn it off, put it down, walk away. God says (in paraphrase), "Blessed is the man who walks not, stands not and sits not where sinfulness abides" (Psa. 1:1). "Abstain from

fleshly lusts which war against the soul" (1 Pet. 2:11). You know where (and when) your weak points are—avoid them! Take control of the situation (better yet, let God!) and immediately take whatever steps are necessary (even drastic ones) to separate yourself from the temptation and its sources!


Do what Jesus did. Jesus "was in all points tempted as we are, yet without sin" (Heb. 4:15). What did Jesus do when He was tempted? He quoted Scripture! "It is written...It

> is written...It is written" (Matt. 4:4-10). Find the verse (or verses) that resonate self-control, consequences, holiness, incentive (or whatever strikes at your heart the most), memorize those verses (write them on your heart), and then quote them repeatedly as you divert eyes, divert attention, turn it off, put it down and walk away. Then, keep quoting! It's hard to sin when you keep speaking God's words

over and over again (read Psalm 119:11).

Find an "accountability partner." Sometimes it takes the serious measure of confessing your weakness, faults and sins to a brother in Christ (cf. Jas. 5:16), and asking that brother to help provide you with some accountability for your actions. There are multiple ways to do this. The important part is to have someone you can trust and who will keep you honest and on target (cf. Gal. 6:1-2; 1 Thess. 5:14; Rom. 15:1).

"Resist the devil and he will flee from you" (Jas. 4:7)!

All those little details are WONDERFUL!

Have you ever wondered why God gives us all the little details in some Bible stories? Why do we know that it was "a fresh jawbone of a donkey" that Samson used to kill 1,000 men? Why are we told that David used a sling and a smooth stone from the brook to bring down Goliath? Why does God tell us that Jesus used five barley loaves and two small fish from a boy's lunch to feed 5,000 men (plus women and children)? The answer is simple and powerful!

God wants us to know, in very obvious terms, that "there is nothing too hard for" the Lord (Jer. 32:17)! He makes it abundantly clear that "the things which are impossible with men are possible with God" (Luke 18:27)!

Now, what problems did you say you're facing? What trials have come your way? What mountains seem too high to traverse? All those little details in Bible stories shout that God can do BIG things with but small resources! Do you trust Him to do BIG things with you? – DS

Three awesome words pertaining to the certainty of heaven

Peter describes heaven as an inheritance for children of God—an inheritance that is "incorruptible and undefiled and fades not away" (1 Pet. 1:4). Then, to affirm its absolute assurance, he tells us these three things about this promise.

First, the inheritance is **"reserved."** The inheritance isn't going anywhere! It is being guarded, kept and preserved in heaven for God's heirs. How certain do you feel about God's reservation?

Second, the heirs are being "kept." Not only is the inheritance being guarded, kept and preserved, the heirs themselves are being watched over and guarded. It's a military term.

Third, all of this reserving, guarding, preserving and keeping is being down by the **"power"** of God. The Greek word here gives us our word—"dynamite." There's no power like God's power!

Child of God! You can know with absolute certainty that God has **reserved** a home for you in heaven, and His **power** is **keeping** the inheritance and the heirs "ready" to be joined! – DS

The Gospel of Jesus w10 Sentences

- 1. In the beginning, God created all things and made mankind in His image (Genesis 1:1-31).
- 2. The first man and first woman disobeyed God, thereby separating themselves from a relationship with God by their **sinful** choice (Genesis 2:14-3:24; Isaiah 59:1-2).
- 3. Sin is the result when we choose to violate the will of God, and the consequence of sin is spiritual death, a **separation** from God (1 John 3:4; Romans 6:23).
- 4. Before man ever sinned, the gracious Creator already had a **plan** to send a Savior (1 Peter 1:18-21; Genesis 3:15).
- 5. In order to demonstrate the depth of His love for us, the Son of God came, lived a sinless life and **died** on our behalf while mankind was still living in sin (Romans 5:8; Ephesians 5:2; Hebrews 4:15).
- 6. Having borne in His own body the penalty that was due to us, Jesus was raised from the dead and sent Christians to tell this good news to everyone, so that they might know how to be **saved** from their sins (Isaiah 53:8; 1 Peter 2:24; 2 Corinthians 5:21; Matthew 28:19-20; 1 Timothy 2:4).
- 7. In order be saved from the devastating (and eternal) consequences of our sins, we must hear this message of saving grace and humbly **submit** ourselves to comply with the conditions that He set forth in His Word for our salvation (Romans 10:14, 17; Hebrews 5:8-9; James 1:22-25; Matthew 7:24-27).
- 8. Jesus has made it very clear that in order to obtain the remission of sins and have them all washed away by the saving blood of Jesus (Revelation 1:5), we must **believe** that Jesus truly is the Son of God (Romans 10:9-10), we must **turn** away from sin and its enticements (Acts 2:38; 17:30), and having confessed our faith we must be **immersed** in water for the forgiveness of our sins (Acts 2:38; 22:16; Mark 16:16; John 3:3-7; 1 Peter 3:21).
- 9. Only by following God's plan of salvation can we be forgiven of our sins (Matthew 7:21; Luke 6:46), and then He commands that we live a **faithful** life of service to Him (Revelation 2:10).
- 10. Only those who are "in Christ" will enjoy every spiritual blessing from God (Ephesians 1:3) and be promised the eternal inheritance with Him in **heaven** (Ephesians 1:11; 1 Peter 1:3-5).
