In a recent article we discussed how only one of the ten lepers Jesus cleansed came to express gratitude, and Jesus asked the question, "Where are the nine?" We entitled that article "Are You Among the Nine?" to encourage each of us to be more thankful and to express thanks for all we receive. This

week we ask the question, "Are you among the eight?"

Which eight? Peter described them in this way. "Once the Divine longsuffering waited in the days of Noah, while the ark was being prepared, in which a few, that is, eight souls, were saved through water" (1 Pet. 3:20). Had you lived at that time, would you have been among the eight?

They were righteous in an unrighteous world. It is probably impossible for us to imagine

what Noah and his family experienced. Think of how we are concerned at the direction our nation is taking, yet we do know so many godly people. Noah did not have this in his life. Every thought of every person on earth was on evil continually. We are often so troubled with peer pressure. Sometimes we yield to it, but Noah never did. Had you lived at that time, would you have been among the eight?

They were righteous without a righteous heritage. So many of us have relatives who are trying to live right. Now,

when God looked at that world, Noah's father was not righteous, nor was his grandfather (Methuselah). His faith was his alone. He had no brothers or sisters who were righteous, yet he was faithful without any religious heritage. Had you lived at that time would you have been among the eight?

They were righteous because he sought grace. He believed in God, yet he was not sinless. Sinless people do not need grace, but Noah did. Sinful people do not seek grace, but

> do not the words "he found grace" imply that "he sought grace?" Sometimes we feel we have attained righteousness apart from God's grace, but Noah did not. Had you lived at that time would you have been among the eight?

They were righteous because they lived righteously for so many years. God decided that He would destroy man 120 years later. In that interim, he

called Noah and waited for him to build the ark. At least some of Noah's sons (if not all of them) were born during that period of time. For a century his family lived faithfully. We sometimes struggle to be faithful, but they did not waver. Had you lived at that time would you have been among the eight?

What an amazing example the life of Noah is to each of us. Sometimes, it is good just to imagine what it would have been like to be there. Think about it. Would you have been inside or outside the ark?

For perplexing reasons, some parents have the idea that their children will learn vital lessons in life simply by osmosis. It is true, to some extent, that children (and all people) learn things by the environment around them and events that occur in their presence. These can be valuable, life-

altering lessons, but is this the method by which we want (or expect) that our children will learn the vital lessons of life? It is critical that we take the reins and the responsibility for teaching our children those truths and principles by which God expects them to live!

Our children will not learn **agape love** by osmosis—we must teach them. They must be taught to unconditionally, unselfishly put the needs of others above their own desires or needs (Luke 6:27-36).

Our children will not learn to **show respect** by osmosis—we must teach them. They must be taught to esteem others (Phil. 2:3), be kind to others (Eph. 4:32), serve others (Gal. 5:13; 6:10), and honor others (Rom. 12:10; 13:7).

Our children will not learn **God's love for them** by osmosis—we must teach them. They must be taught that God created them (Gen. 1:26-27), loves them immensely (Rom. 8:34-39), sent His Son to bear their sins and pay the ultimate price (Rom. 5:8; 2 Cor. 5:21), and wants them in heaven!

Our children will not learn **God's plan of salvation** by osmosis—we must teach them. They must be taught that God's grace is extended to those who obey Him (Heb. 5:8-9), through faith (John 20:30-31), repentance (Acts 17:30-31), confession of faith (Rom. 10:9-10), immersion in water (Acts 2:38) and faithful living according to God's will (1 John 1:7).

Our children will not learn **acceptable avenues of worship** by osmosis—we must teach them. They must be

taught that God is the object of our worship (John 4:23), that one's heart must be engaged in all of worship (John 4:24), and that God's truth must be the standard for all worship practices, including weekly communion (1 Cor. 11:17-20), congregational singing (Eph. 5:19), praying (Acts 2:42), giving (1 Cor. 16:1-2) and preaching (2 Tim. 4:1-4).

Our children will not learn **appropriate behavior in worship** by osmosis—we must teach them. They must be taught to sit still, to be quiet, to be respectful, to pay attention, to follow along, to take notes, etc., etc.

Our children will not learn **holy living** by osmosis—we must teach them. They must be taught that their choices (Col. 3:17), their words (Matt. 12:36-37), their actions (Jas. 1:22-25), their sexuality (1 Thess. 4:3-7), etc. must be set apart to God.

Our children will not make it to heaven by osmosis! It is our responsibility to personally teach and train them!

The long-term impact of one small decision

King David made a decision in 2 Samuel 11, which may have seemed insignificant at the time, but had a dramatic impact on the rest of his life. Instead of going out to battle, which is where the king should have been, David remained at Jerusalem (11:1). Seems innocent enough, right? But, what long-term impact did that one small decision make in his life?

As a result of not being where he was supposed to be, David "saw" (and watched) "a woman bathing" (11:2), "lay with" the woman who was not his wife (11:3-4), deceived the husband of this woman (11:6-8), got this same man drunk (11:13), and then had this man killed in battle (11:14-17). A seemingly inconsequential decision had serious consequences—David was informed, "The sword shall never depart from your house" (2 Sam. 12:10).

Every day of our lives we make decisions – some "big" and some "small." Every decision we make (i.e., every "seed" sown) will have consequences (i.e., a reaping) (Gal. 6:7). – DS

"I'm not ashamed to own my Lord!"

How many Christians, in certain circumstances, ever feel ashamed or embarrassed for being a Christian? Sadly, that number would be rather high, and it is not merely limited to those who are young in age or young in the faith. Even older Christians admit that there are times when they feel uncomfortable to admit and stand up for their Christian faith.

Perhaps this is why the Psalms and the New Testament epistles give so much emphasis to not being ashamed. David prayed repeatedly, "O my God, I trust in You; Let me not be ashamed" (Psa. 25:2; 31:17; 119:46, 116). Paul often wrote, "In nothing shall I be ashamed" (Rom. 1:16; Phil. 1:20; 2 Tim. 1:12), and he urged his readers, "Do not be ashamed" (2 Tim. 1:8), for a faithful Christian "does not need to be ashamed" (2 Tim. 2:15). Peter urged, "If anyone suffers as a Christian, let him not be ashamed, but let him glorify God in this matter" (1 Pet. 4:16).

How can I fight back any inclination to be ashamed? "Trust" in the Lord (Psa. 25:2). "Speak" often of His word (Psa. 119:46). Focus on salvation (Rom. 1:16). Remember in "whom [you] have believed" (2 Tim. 1:12). Let the wicked be ashamed of themselves (Psa. 31:17). -- DS
