"If it had not been the Lord who was on our side..."

Psalm 124 begins with these words, "If it had not been the Lord who was on our side" (Psa. 124:1). How bad would it have been? "If it had not been the Lord who was on our side, when men rose up against us, then they would have swallowed us alive...then the waters would have overwhelmed us" (124:2-4). Have you ever felt that way? If it hadn't been for the Lord, there's no telling how bad that would have been!

David goes on to conclude: "Blessed be the Lord, who has not given us as prey to their teeth...Our help is in the name of the Lord, Who made heaven and earth" (124:6-8). *Things were looking pretty bad, but God would not allow us to be caught in the trap and overcome!*

If the Lord is on your side, you can rejoice to know that, "If God is for us, who can be against us?" (Rom. 8:31). Our help comes from the Lord! Read Psalm 124 and rejoice to know that the God who protected Israel is the God who protects you! -DS

"Is that how I really sound?"

Have you ever heard a recording of your voice (maybe on a voicemail or a video) and thought, "That's not how I sound...is it? Is that really how I sound to other people?" In our minds (and in our ears), we "hear ourselves" one way, but hearing a recording might sound more "pitchy" or nasal or strained or "throaty." It can make you wonder how you actually sound.

Take that and apply it to more than just the "sound" of your voice but to the entirety of your communication habits. When others hear you, do you "come across" like you have an attitude or that you're arrogant or that you don't care? Or, do you "come across" like you're humble, compassionate, interested, sincere and sympathetic? You may think that you "come across" one way, but in actuality, you may be coming across completely different.

Try to listen to your words and your tone through the ears of others. What if someone else spoke to you in the way you speak to others? How would that "come across" to you? -DS

Those who were converted in the New Testament did:

- 1. Exactly what they were told to do.
- 2. Immediately what they were told to do.
- 3. Uniformly (in every case) what they were told to do.
- 4. Graciously receive the same blessing of salvation.

N.T. conversions matched Jesus' Great Commission? Does yours? Today, there is little controversy over the essentiality of faith or repentance for salvation. And, we have no doubt that every conversion in the New Testament included faith and repentance, although they are <u>not specified</u> in each case.

But, notice what <u>God did specify</u> in each of these cases of conversion: <u>Baptism!</u> How can this possibly be a point of controversy today? God specified it and He requires it!

"...always abounding in the work of the Lord..." (1 Cor. 15:58)
