### If God Were On Facebook

The popularity of social media can hardly be comprehended. It might shock you to learn that worldwide there are more than 645,000,000 Twitter accounts. Even more amazing is that there are 1,317,000,000 Facebook accounts and that 50% of all Americans check their Facebook account every

day. Like so many things, social media can be either good or bad. To help us in being part of the phenomena, let's take time to consider what it would be like if God had a Facebook account.

What would He say about finding answers to life's situation? Sometimes people use Facebook check their Faceseeking advice about what they should do, and their friends readily give their advice. It is amazing that rarely does anyone look to the Bible to find answers. Wonder what God would say about this?

What would He say about many of the photos which are posted on Facebook? It is remarkable how little thought is given to the spiritual impact pictures have on others. It seems that far too many Christians just do not believe that that those who are guilty of lasciviousness "shall not inherit the kingdom" (Gal. 5:19-21). This word is defined as words or actions designed to produce immorality. Every Christian should take a second look at their posts to see what impact they would have

on those who see them. Wonder what God would say about this if He had an account?

What would He say about "OMG"? Jesus said that man will give account for every idle word and be justified or condemned by what he says. Yet, His name is tossed about without any thought. The problem is far greater than just typing three letters which include God's name. It is a reflection of a heart that has little respect for God. Wonder what God would say about this if He had an account?

> What would He say about reposting things which sometimes are preceded by a statement like, "Ignore the language as you see this." Some seem to think there is no personal responsibility about what they post from others. They see something and share it with others. Christians must not find pleasure in wrong doing (see Rom. 1:32) and become part of

that wrong. Wonder what He would say about "cute" things which are reposted when such actually glorifies sin?

What would He do about defriending you? Who has not defriended others or blocked their message after their posts are repeatedly offensive? Take time to look at what you have posted. Is it possible that God is offended by what we are placing on social media? Would God be happier if He blocked your messages. By the way, He does not have an account, but He reads all of ours!

## We Must Avoid Showing Approval!

If someone never believes, teaches or practices a doctrine or a manner of life that is contrary to the will of God, could that person ever be guilty in the eyes of God? Let me ask that another way: if a Christian knows of others who are spreading false doctrine (but the Christian never believes it or

teaches such himself), or if a Christian knows of others who are living immoral, unholy, ungodly lives (but the Christian never practices such himself), could he ever be considered guilty of those things in the eyes of God? Let's consider two passages that every Christian needs to know.

In Romans chapter 1, Scripture plainly re- sign of welcome, one comes to you and does not bring this teachveals that "the wrath of God is revealed from heaven favor or approval against all ungodliness and unrighteousness of men" (1:18). Don't miss that word "all"! In this context, the Holy Spirit proceeds to detail some examples of "all ungodliness and unrighteousness," including idolatry, homosexuality, sexual immorality, covetousness, etc., etc. Read the whole chapter and then let the last verse sink into your mind. The first part of the verse is probably obvious in its truth: "...knowing the righteous judgment of God, that those who practice such things are deserving of death..." (1:32). Yes, "the wages of sin is death" (6:23). But, then, the rest of the verse includes the ones who would "also approve of those who prac-

tice" these things as "deserving of death." A Christian may never practice some of these ungodly acts, but he is equally guilty if he shows any approval of those who do engage in these behaviors.

Now, in the little book of Second John, there is a discussion similar to Romans 1:32 but not completely identical. Verse 9 reads, "Anyone who goes too far and does not abide in the teaching of Christ, does not have God" (NASB). That's

> pretty straightforward. One can only find favor with God when He abides in the words of Christ (cf. John 8:31; 15:7; 1 John 2:14). When he goes beyond Christ, he steps outside that sacred fellowship (cf. 1 John 1:1-7). But, then, there is this warning: "If anying, do not receive him into your house or give him any greeting, for whoever greets him takes part in his

wicked works" (10-11, ESV). A Christian may not believe or teach a doctrine that is outside the teaching of Christ, but he is equally guilty if he shows any sign of welcome, favor or acceptance toward anyone who does.

There are false doctrines out there and ungodly lifestyles everywhere. We must avoid them and never engage in them! We must equally avoid showing any approval or acceptance of them! After all, we are to be the holy, set apart, non-conformed children of the holy God!
