Ebola and Christianity

The introduction of the deadly virus, Ebola, in our nation has captured the attention of most Americans. It has been the featured story on all newscasts. What American is there who has not heard of it, and how many of us have not had a sense of fear about its impact? It would help us if we could

learn some spiritual lessons from all that has happened.

Think about how rapidly this disease has spread. When it first arrived in Dallas, it impacted the life of just one man, but in the days which followed, we learned more about the disease. That single person touched the lives of more than one hundred others even before he entered the hospital. Suppose each of them had become infected and had also spread the disease to one hundred others. Instead of

there being one individual, that "second generation" of infected people would number 10,000. If each of those spread the sickness to 100 additional individuals, the third generation would number 1,000,000. It was this kind of geometric progression that created such a stir around this nation.

Apply these numbers to the spread of Christianity, and you can understand why the first-century church spread so rapidly. The church began on Pentecost with just a handful of disciples, but by the end of the century it is estimated that there were over 6,000,000 Christians. This growth continued into the next century. Unlike Ebola, it did not bring death, but it brought life to a dying world.

While Ebola reduplicates itself in just 21 days, teaching the gospel to others can sometimes take longer. The seed of the gospel lands in various kinds of soil, and the soil, not the seed, determines if it will germinate. However, that seed has always been "living and active" (Heb. 4:12). The redeemed

> have "... been born again, not of corruptible seed, but incorruptible, through the word of God which lives and abides forever" (1 Pet. 1:23).

Our commission has never been to go into all the world and baptize every creature. It was not the task of the early church. He said, "Preach the gospel to every creature" (Mark 16:15). It is easy for Christians to become discouraged because they have

not led another to the Lord. The issue is not whether they became Christians but whether we taught them! As much as we long to see those we teach being baptized into Christ, we must remember what is involved in the great commission we have received from the Lord. He said, "Go . . . teach."

The spread of Ebola can teach us. If each of us would win one soul each year and teach them to do the same, what impact would that have? Do the math. In just 34 years every person on earth could be a Christian! He said, "Go...teach!"

How Do You Put This Thing Together?

It was late in the evening when my family pulled into the campground. We had been driving all day and were exhausted. From the trunk of the car, we pulled the brand new tent, which we had never set up before that night. In addition to the large nylon tent, stakes and pieces of rope, there

fell from the bag more than 20 aluminum poles of varying lengths and connection types.

The poles were not all the same length. Some of the poles had one tapered end, some had two tapered ends, some were not tapered at all. Most of the poles were straight, but some of them bent at about a 60-degree angle. Most had rounded those poles to fit There is a "salvation configuration" that must be folconnections but a few had squared connections.

Needless to say, this was "back in the day" before pop-up tents and before tent poles that were all tied together at each connecting point. At the campsite that night, we had our task—assemble the poles in the proper way, so that the tent stands properly and looks like the picture on the box. When done right, there was only one way for all of those poles to fit together. With some time and patience (and flashlights), we finally got the tent erected. After we saw how to do it the first time, it was easier (and more obvious) each subsequent time that we assembled it.

> an "organization configuration" and there is a "doctrine configuration." Each of these must likewise be followed and put together according to design. When all of these "poles" are assembled in the proper way and working together, the church will stand properly and look like the "picture" in the book.

> If we had just followed our own wishes with the tent that night, the end result would have been awful. Likewise, if we follow our own wishes with the configuration of the church today, the end result will be manmade rather than God-made!

How does death apply to faith, you ask? Read this passage from the book of James. "Even so faith, if it has no works, is dead, being by itself. But someone may well say, 'You have faith and I have works; show me your faith without the works, and I will show you my faith by my works.' You believe that God is one. You do well; the

demons also believe, and shudder. But are you willing to recognize, you foolish fellow, that faith without works is useless" (2:17-20)? James teaches that faith without works or action is dead and useless—much like the faith of demons. They believe so much that they tremble in fear, but it will not save them. Faith must be coupled with works for it to be biblical faith that can:

> Cleanse hearts (Acts 15:9) Sanctify (Acts 26:19)

If you have biblical faith, then it will be seen if it is accompanied by verbs. What are the verbs in your life?

Justify (Rom. 3:28) Not walk by sight (2 Cor. 5:7) Receive the promise (Gal. 3:22) Understand (Heb. 11:3) Conquer (Heb. 11:33)

If you have biblical faith, then it will be seen if it is accompanied by verbs. What are the verbs in your life? When you look at Hebrews chapter 11, you quickly see a pattern in the text—faith + verb. Biblical faith could be seen in the lives of the individuals of this chapter. Some of the people did great and grand things. Others were noted for more simple things. Abel was noted for worshipping God correctly, and Joseph was men-

tioned for preparing for the future exodus at his death.

Life is busy, and it is easy to lose sight of why we are here. I would like to challenge you to lift up your head and walk by faith—not like the zombies around you. Make room for the simple acts of faith in your life and a few grand ones along the way, so that this could be said of you, "God is not ashamed to be called their God; for He has prepared a city for them...men of whom the world is not worthy..." (Heb. 11:16b, 38a).
