Check How You Look in the Mirror

It happens to Americans every day of their lives. Few of us like the way we look the first time we see ourselves each day in the mirror, so it is not long before we begin making changes to our appearance. Usually, before we leave the house, we take a final look in the mirror hoping that we look presentable and acceptable to others.

James describes the Bible as a mirror. “For if anyone is a hearer of the word and not a doer, he is like a man observing his natural face in a mirror; for he observes himself, goes away, and immediately forgets what kind of man he was” (Jas. 1:23-24). It is remarkable how God uses the simplest aspects of our lives to illustrate truth. To look into His mirror, the Bible, and to see our spiritual needs and do nothing about them just does not make sense. It is even more foolish than that person who looks into a regular mirror, sees something which destroys his appearance and then walks away forgetting what the mirror showed him.

Paul describes the Bible as a mirror with the power to change you. “But we all, with unveiled face, beholding as in a mirror the glory of the Lord, are being transformed into the same image from glory to glory, just as by the Spirit of the Lord” (2 Cor. 3:18). These words are much like the words from

James, but Paul sees that person as spending time looking into the mirror, but not seeing just self. He looks into the mirror and sees Jesus in His radiant glory. The present tense of “being transformed” indicates an ongoing process. He does not just see the Lord once, and then he is immediately and completely changed. He sees the Lord. He spends time gazing at Him. The glory of the Lord becomes his standard, and he is being changed into the very image of the Christ.

David, while not using the imagery of a mirror, describes the same action. “Blessed is the man . . . (who) delights in the law of the Lord, and in His law he meditates day and night” (Psa. 1:1-2). Have you ever considered what made David’s heart be like the heart of God? He turned to the law of God and meditated on it day and night, and that transformed his heart. Looking into God’s mirror will change the heart of all men.

Consider some “mirror rules” for those seeking to change their appearance. We must come to our mirror, His word, with an open, sincere heart and see His image clearly. We must come with a determination to change the flaws we see in ourselves in that mirror. We must spend time seeing the glory of the One in the mirror, meditate on what we see and then change our lives to become like that One. We need to think often about this, knowing that it takes time to become just like Him.

You can have fellowship with God right now! Have you ever received an invitation to someone’s house, but you had to wait several days or weeks until the day arrived that

you could go? Not with God! You don’t have to wait! He has invited you to enjoy an ongoing fellowship with Him in His house right now! Yes, He most certainly has invited you to enjoy an eternal fellowship with Him in heaven for ever and ever, but that is something you will have to wait to enjoy. But, right now, you can have “fellowship with the Father and with His Son Jesus Christ” and walk with them each and every day (1 John 1:3-7)! We don’t have to wait around for it!

You can friendship with God right now! There are some people, who are unknown to you today, who will become your friends some time in the future. Sometimes on Facebook, I might send a “Friend Request” but not get a response for quite some time. God doesn’t operate that way! You don’t have to wait around for Him to respond to a friend request! You can enjoy a friendship with Him right now! Jesus said, “You are My friends if you do whatever I command you” (John 15:13). So, if I obey the commands of Jesus, I not only can have forgiveness right now, I not only can have fellowship with God right now, I can be His friend right now! When Abraham trusted and obeyed, “he was called the friend of God” (Jas. 2:23). We don’t have to wait around for it!

For retail “specials,” you’ll have to wait around for the day to come. For God’s “specials,” you can have them, enjoy them and share them RIGHT NOW! Are you missing any?

Sitting Thus by the Well

It was clear that she did not expect to talk with this man “sitting thus by the well” (John 4:6). As the conversation unfolds, this man, the Christ, did three things that we should practice when we are about our Father’s business.

He began by asking for water, but there was more to it. He actually spoke to her. In her mind, it was something that Jews didn’t do with Samaritans, much less a woman (John 4:9). Here is our first challenge—talking with those who nobody else will. By doing so, we show that we are not like everyone else and that we care. These two things go a long way with reaching the lost. The concept that people have about the “religious” is often tainted.

The discussion at the well covered living water, her past and true worshippers. In all of these subjects Jesus demonstrated knowledge and wisdom. He did not flinch at her sins and the life she lived. We must be equipped to do the same (2 Tim. 3:16-17). She was like so many of our friends and co-workers who are confused about what real religion is and are living lives of sin. We must be fountains of information for those around us, and we can’t flinch or shrink away when the down-trodden and outcasts come to the well, for “such were some of you” (1 Cor. 6:11).

Finally, she began putting things together. She understood that this was no mere man with whom she was speaking (John 4:19). At the end of their discussion, she admitted that she understood the nature of the coming Messiah. Jesus then revealed, “I who speak to you am He” (John 4:25). He divulged to her His true self, the Messiah. We must be those who point to the One, the Christ, with our lives and our speech to help people come to know Him. We are not mere people, but rather, we are His servants, His priests and His ambassadors with the message of reconciliation (1 Cor. 4:1; 1 Pet. 2:9; 2 Cor. 5:20). As people who seek to be laborers in the kingdom, these things should be a part of who we are. We care, we demonstrate a knowledge of God, and we point people to the Christ.

As the woman left the well and went into town with the message, “Come and see,” it was time for the disciples to learn. The work we have to do is more important than the food we eat (John 4:34). There is no time to wait—the harvest is now (John 4:35). We rejoice with those who labored before us as we enter a work that was started long before us. “Already he who reaps is receiving wages and is gathering fruit for life eternal; so that he who sows and he who reaps may rejoice together...others have laborer and you have entered into their labor” (John 4:36-38). Let us rejoice on our work.

Jesus was eating in the house of a Pharisee named Simon, when a “woman of the city” came and expressed her deep love for Jesus. How did she do that? Notice Jesus’ words to Simon:

“Do you see this woman? I entered your house; you gave Me no water for My feet, but **she has washed My feet with her tears and wiped them with the hair of her head**. You gave Me no kiss, but **this woman has not ceased to kiss My feet** since the time I came in. You did not anoint My head with oil, but **this woman has anointed My feet with fragrant oil**. Therefore I say to you, her sins, which are many, are forgiven, for **she loved much**” (Luke 7:44-47).

Can you imagine a more lowly, more humiliating, more demeaning act than to shed your tears on someone’s unwashed feet, to wipe those muddy feet with your own hair, and then to pour fragrant (and costly) perfume over those feet? Why would anyone stoop to such a level of vulnerability and servitude? Jesus said it! “She loved much!” I wonder...how much do we love Jesus? How do we show it? What are willing to do? – DS


