## Living and Walking in the Light

One of the great blessings we have is the continuing cleansing of the blood of Jesus in our daily lives. We were washed in His blood when we were baptized (Acts 22:16), but we continue to be cleansed by His blood as we continue to walk in the light.

“But if we walk (Greek tense indicates continual action—“*are walking*”) in the light as He is in the light, we have (*are having*) fellowship with one another, and the blood of Jesus Christ His Son cleanses (*is cleansing*) from all sin” (1 John 1:7).

Paul described the lives of those who are children of light in his first letter to the Thessalonians. He showed that they are different from those who are children of darkness (1 Thess. 5:4-10).

### Sons of light do not sleep (1 Thess. 5:6).

Obviously he is not describing physical sleep or the sleep of death. He contrasts this sleep with watching and being sober.

**Sons of light watch (5:6).** It was in Gethsemane that He urged the disciples to sense the dangers confronting them. In the upper room they all had affirmed their willingness to die for Him (Matt. 26:35), but they were all about to forsake Him in fear (Matt. 26:56). His words to them in the garden were, “Watch and pray, lest you enter into temptation” (Matt. 26:41). Those who walk in the light must watch!

**The Greek tense indicates the continual action of walking and being cleansed**

**Sons of light are sober (5:6).** That Christians are to be serious minded is affirmed often in the Bible using a Greek word which affirms this vital quality for every Christian. However, the Greek word used in this passage is *nephos*, which means “to be free from the influence of intoxicants.” The impact of intoxicants is to dull the senses, lower inhibitions and is devastating to one’s ability to watch.

### Sons of light neither get drunk or are drunk (5:7).

There are many verses in the Bible which condemn drunkenness (including this one in the phrase “are drunk”), but this passage shows that God also forbids the process of getting drunk. Those who are walking in the light must be aware that the Bible shows that Christians must avoid getting drunk.

### Sons of light arm themselves with faith, love and hope (5:8).

Bible students will recall these three qualities in Paul’s letter to Corinth, “And now abides faith, hope and love” (1 Cor. 13:13). These same qualities are mentioned here as those who are continually cleansed by His blood. We must never forget that all of these are specifically tied to having the Bible in our lives.

**Sons of light will live together with Him (5:10).** How else could it be? We become sons of God by the blood, we walk in light and are being cleansed by blood and heaven awaits those who live in the light. Thank God for His light!

## Did You Choose to Be Straight? (Part 2 of 2)

Sometimes individuals think they have found a “new truth” and that they have discovered a “new line of argumentation” that irrefutably confirms and defends their “new truth.” Such is the case with advocates of homosexuality. They strain constantly to find justification (even Biblical justification, in some cases) for their choice of lifestyle. And, they think that if

they can back heterosexuals into a corner and get them to yield their position against homosexuality, that such would conclusively prove their lifestyle to be acceptable and “normal.” However, such is not and never will be the case! Even if a Bible-believing heterosexual loses an argument with a homosexual, it does not prove in any way that homosexuality is a “new truth” to be accepted as “normal.”

In our discussions with advocates of the homosexual lifestyle, we must always take them back to Biblical morality and Biblical authority. We must never be ashamed of our faith in God, our faith in His Word and our faith in doing precisely what He says!

**God’s Word is our standard of authority!** All that we do and say must be authorized by the Word of God (Col. 3:17). The one and only standard that will determine my eternal destiny is the will of God (Matt. 7:21-23). No person on this earth

has a right to add to, take away from or manipulate God’s Word one iota (Rev. 22:18-19; Gal. 1:8-9). If God’s Word says it, that settles it, once and for all time (Jude 3; Psa. 119:89). Therefore, if God’s Word condemns homosexuality (which it does throughout its pages, Lev. 18:22; 20:13; Rom. 1:24-28; 1 Cor. 6:9-11; etc.), then I must adhere to His standard.

**God’s Word is our standard of morality!** It is amazing (and frustrating) how illogical and inconsistent advocates of sin are when they are trying to defend their position. Homosexuals will often claim (as is their purpose in asking, “When did you choose to be straight?”) that they were “born that way.” They create their own flawed premise and then cannot defend it, for could not even pedophiles, polygamists, rapists, zoophiles or necrophiliacs make the same argument? If anyone can claim, “I was born this way, so it can’t be wrong,” then there is NO standard of morality except one person’s own judgment. Once you become your own standard of right and wrong, then you have dismissed God and His standard of morality altogether! Read the New Testament (ex: Rom. 1:18-32; 1 Cor. 6:9-11; Gal. 5:19-23; Eph. 4:17-32; Col. 3:5-17; 1 Thess. 4:3-8; Rev. 21:8) and see if God is not very “straight” and “strait” about His standard of morality!

Let us each choose God, God’s creation, God’s truth, God’s will, God’s authority and God’s morality!

## What Do a Sheep and Coin Have to Do With Repentance?

They saw Jesus spending time with tax collectors and sinners again. For the Pharisees and scribes, the very “religious” people of Jesus’ day, that was the last thing any God-fearing person would do. The only thing worse would be getting caught talking to a Samaritan woman. When confronted about this on another occasion Jesus said, *“It is not those who are healthy who need a physician, but those who are sick; I did not come to call the righteous, but sinners”* (Mark 2:17). The irony is that they needed to repent just as much as the “sinners” did. Paul spoke of these people as “not knowing about God’s righteousness and seeking to establish their own, they did not subject themselves to the righteousness of God” (Rom. 10:3). Toward the end of His ministry on Earth, Christ said this of those “religious” men: *“Woe to you, scribes and Pharisees, hypocrites, because you travel around on sea and land to make one proselyte; and when he becomes one, you make him twice as much a son of hell as yourselves...Woe to you, scribes and Pharisees, hypocrites! For you are like whitewashed tombs which on the outside appear beautiful, but inside they are full of dead men’s bones and all uncleanness. So you, too, outwardly appear righteous to men, but inwardly you are full of hypocrisy and lawlessness”* (Matt. 23:15, 27-28).

**Jesus says that there is more rejoicing in heaven over the repentance of the lost than those that are righteous.**

When these men grumbled about Jesus eating with tax collectors and sinners, He told them three stories (Luke 15). The story of the sheep begins with, “What man among you.” The story of the coin begins with, “What woman among you.” Both stories are told to appeal to both the male and female audience about the value of something lost. The man leaves the 99 sheep to find the lost one. The woman sets aside the 9 silver coins and searches for the lost one. In both cases, they rejoice with their neighbors over the return of that which had been lost. In both stories, Jesus says that there is more rejoicing in heaven over the repentance of the lost than those that are righteous. What do a sheep and coin have to do with repentance? They show the value of a repentant heart. When we are convicted of sin in our lives, we are on our knees. When we take “self” out of the way and open our hearts to His grace and His righteousness, angels rejoice. I imagine that they cry out, “Holy, Holy, Holy is the Lord God Almighty,” with more fervor. When we are on our knees in repentance, heaven shouts glory to God!

The third story began thusly, “A man had two sons” (Luke 15:11). One returned home penitent of the wrongs he had committed against his father. The other was not happy about the rejoicing that took place. We may need to repent or we may need to be rejoicing with those that do repent.

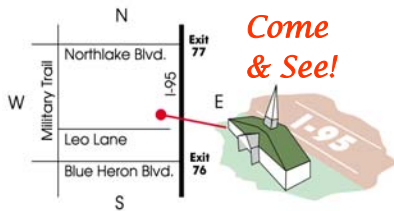

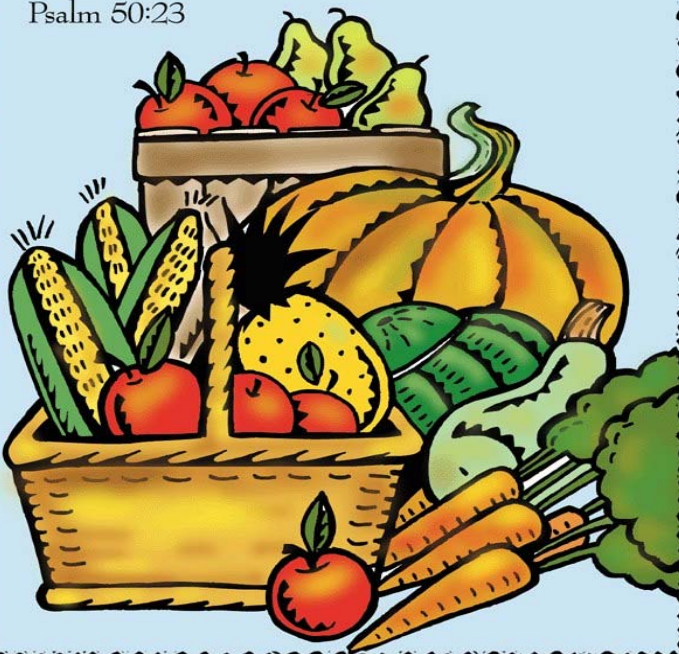
