It's that time of year when people make resolutions, only to see them fade away in the days which follow. This does not mean that all resolutions are worthless, but when it comes to our resolve in spiritual matters, we should take this seriously. The wisest man, Solomon, said, "When you make

Personal resolutions. Who would have ever seen Saul of Tarsus, who became the great apostle Paul, as a prospect for conversion? Who would have ever seen him as the author of half of the New Testament books? Yet, God does not see as man sees, for

man looks on the outward appearance, but God looks on the heart (1 Sam. 16:7). What was it that God saw that others could not see? Perhaps the answer is found in a resolution Paul made early in his life. He said, "And herein do I exercise myself, to have always a conscience void of offense toward God, and toward man" (Acts 24:16). What a noble resolution the apostle made. Is this one you should make?

Family resolutions. Every godly parent is concerned about the spiritual welfare of every member of the family. Look at the resolution one godly father made. The Jews had entered the land God promised He would give to them. Joshua had successfully led the nation and the land had been taken. He called Israel together and challenged them to make a life changing decision about the future of the new nation.

Joshua presented two choices before them. They could worship the idols in the land they had taken or they could choose to serve God. He then expressed his resolution

about his family. "Fear the Lord and serve Him in you will serve . . . but as for me and my house, we will serve the Lord" (Josh. 24:14-15). Is this resolution **not delay it. Pay** one you should make for your family?

> Broken resolutions. What do you do when you have made promises to God and have failed to live up to them. There was that disciple who ex-

vowed. pressed his resolve to the Lord when he said, "Even if I have to die with You, I will not deny You" (Matt. 26:35). Yet, he did deny him. His resolution did not become reality. Fortunately, this is not the end of the story. Less than two months after uttering these words and then cursing and swearing that he did not even know Jesus, he stood before the Jewish nation and preached on Pentecost. What a great story!

Think about it. Are there promises you need to make to the Lord. Even if you have failed before, He can still use you!



It's Not Just a Day!

Making "New Year's Eve Resolutions" is an interesting practice. In no way trying to knock those who make them, but what is it about January 1st that makes that day the day to make changes? It's just a day! Couldn't those changes be made on Decem-By David Sproule ber 28th just as easily? Why wait?

The same perspective could be taken toward other

"holidays." What is it about February 14th that makes that the day to say, "I love you"? What is it about November 11th that makes that the day to express appreciation to our veterans? What is about someone's birthday that makes it a day to celebrate and give gifts? After all, these are just days! They're do on that day in like any other days! Couldn't any or all of these things be done on other days?

Now, understand that I'm just trying to get you to think. I'm not against any of these special days or the "special commemorations" that are part of them (usually). I'm just trying to lead your thoughts down to this point.

Too many have taken that philosophy—i.e., "A day is just a day. What's so special about a particular day over another day?"—and they have tried to apply that philosophy to Sunday. You know Sunday, right? The first day of the week. The "last day of the weekend." The day before most folks "have to go back to work." It's just like any other day, right? Does it really matter what I do (or don't do) on Sunday?

The apostle John had an interesting way of describing Sunday in the book of Revelation. He could have called it "the first day of the week," like he did when writing his gospel account (John 20:1, 19), but he didn't. He could have called it "Sunday," which would have made sense to us. But, instead, on the occasion when John "was in the Spirit" and prepared to

> receive "the revelation of Jesus Christ," the Holy Spirit inspired him to designate Sunday as "the Lord's Day" (Rev. 1:10).

> You see, Sunday is not just a day! It is not like any other day! It is, set apart by God Himself, the Lord's Day! Therefore, we must take the more earnest heed to ensure that (1) what we do on the Lord's Day is what the Lord wants us to do on His

day, and (2) we do not move what the Lord wants done on His day to another day.

What is it about Sunday that makes it the day to worship the Lord? What is it about Sunday that makes what we do on that day in worship holy and unmovable (in totality) to any other day? The answer: The Lord! That's why it is called "the Lord's Day!" May God help us to love His day, respect His day, long for His day, seize His day, give ourselves and truly worship Him on His day! The Lord's Day is not just a day!
