



Hope Is Our Anchor

Our theme for this year is With GOD We Can, and the emphasis for this month is that with Him we can anchor our hope in Christ. Our world is so complex and is so rapidly changing. Televisions, phones, computers and other electronic devices become outdated so rapidly. We seemingly move from

house to house and job to job far more frequently than before. Relationships and our roles in our family are so different as we rush through life. Is there nothing stable on which we can build our lives?

The answer is found in the closing verses of Hebrews chapter six. "This hope we have as an anchor of the soul, both sure and steadfast and which enters the Presence behind the veil." God has given us hope and that hope is the anchor of our souls.

Hope is based on His immutable promise. The Bible clearly shows that we are saved by hope (Rom. 8:24) and this hope is the anchor of our souls. The writer of Hebrews ties hope to the promises of God. God's promises to Abraham enabled the patriarch to see what others could not see. God spoke the promise to Abraham and His word was enough. Yet God wanted Abraham to know how much he could trust Him. So God confirmed this with an oath (Heb. 6:13-16). The writer then says *this* same hope, our hope, is our anchor.

Hope is based on the promises which are secure. Hebrews say that the hope we have is sure and steadfast (Heb. 6:19). What could be more sure? The omniscient, omnipresent, omnipotent, eternal and Almighty One have given us His promise and He cannot lie (Tit. 1:2). Life is filled with uncertainty but the hope we have is far beyond all certainty. It is the basis of all of life's decision. It is truly the anchor of the soul!

> Hope is based on the promises which are steadfast. His promise and our hope are both sure and steadfast (Heb. 6:19). There is no variance in the trustworthiness of our anchor. The life's philosophy of some is forced to change throughout their lives from day to day, but the faith we have is constant and unchanging. As our faith grows stronger, the anchor becomes more secure. It is always there. It is always secure. It is the anchor for our soul.

Hope is based of the life of Jesus and reaches from earth to heaven. Look again at Hebrews six. Jesus our forerunner has carried the anchor and has taken it into the very presence of God. No wonder it is an anchor sure and steadfast. The anchor line extends from our hearts, from our trials, and reaches into heaven. Hold on to that anchor. It will never move for it is anchored in eternity. God, hasten the day when we arrive at the place where we have anchored our lives! God, we thank You for the anchor You have given to us!



Singing Without the Instrument Is Unacceptable!

There is much discussion about whether it is acceptable (according to Scripture) to have an instrument in the worship of the church. There is much that has been said on both sides of the issue, but it comes down to one and only one question-What does the Bible say? That's all that matters!

This will surprise some of you initially to read, but I

want you to read it all the way through (and not misquote me). I believe with all of my heart that any worship (including and especially singing) that is done without the done without the instrument is vain, unscriptural and sinful. Let that settle in for a minute. In fact, let's state it this way: God will not accept any worship vain, unscriptural that is offered without the instrument.

You may think that is different or even con-

tradictory to statements that have been previously spoken or written, but I assure you that it is not. It is just stating this matter from a little different perspective. The key is to define and understand what instrument is under discussion.

Let us first underscore that there is no New Testament authority for the use of a mechanical instrument in worship. God specified the music that He wanted (and authorized) in worship, and that music is singing (Eph. 5:19; Col. 3:16). By specifying singing, God automatically excluded all other types of music, including the use of a mechanical instrument.

However, there is an instrument that God requires in our worship. The "melody" must come from somewhere! And, once again, God specified the instrument that He authorizes to make that melody. Read Ephesians 5:19, "...speaking to one another in psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, singing and making melody with your heart to the Lord." There is one instrument that God authorizes to accompany our singing, and

it is an instrument that every worshiper must "pluck" Worship that is instrument is

and sinful.

as he is singing-the heart instrument!

Consider these statements again. Any worship (including and especially singing) that is done without the instrument (i.e., the heart instrument) is vain, unscriptural and sinful. God will not accept any worship that is offered without the instrument (of the heart). Jesus taught that true worship is done "in

spirit and in truth" (John 4:24). One's heart (i.e., spirit) is required! Jesus condemned vain worship, which comes from the mouth and lips while the "heart is far from" honoring the Lord (Matt. 15:8-9). Our singing must be done "with the spirit" and "with the understanding" (1 Cor. 14:15). The heart is required!

Did the title and early paragraphs of this article get your attention? True worship demands our attention and our heart! Worshiping with a mechanical instrument is as unacceptable to God as worshiping without the heart instrument!



The Lamborghini Gospel

I recently saw a guy driving a Lamborghini Huracan (Italian for hurricane) over the railroad tracks. That is a \$240,000 car with a ground clearance of a little over 5 inches (135mm). I was holding my breath. This particular crossing is not smooth and is at an angle. That means those 5 inches of

clearance get cut down very quickly. How does a guy get to the point that he drives a car so valuable like a common Camry?

You are probably thinking about some reasons right now. (Or you are thinking about gospel be told or heard as how common the Camry really is.) The most obvious may be that he uses it all the time and forgets its value. With familiarity, what was once exotic and rare can become common or just a car among cars. place. We may be guilty of the same thing with

our own possessions. My question for you is, "Have we done that with the Bible and, more specifically, the gospel?"

We just finished up with a gospel meeting. Whether you attended them all or just one, you heard a familiar story. If you are a member at Palm Beach Lakes or any congregation of the Lord's body, you would know the gospel message that was preached. As I sat there listening, I wondered, "How do I keep a message, which is so important, valuable and unique, vibrant

fervor that was there when I came up out of the water?" Here are some ideas. First, remember that the gospel is still at work in your life. 1 John 1:7 reads, "But if we walk in

the Light as He Himself is in the Light, we have fellowship with one another, and the blood of Jesus His Son cleanses us from all sin." This is a continual cleansing. The blood of Christ is still

in my heart and soul? How do I listen to the message as though

it were the first time? How do I maintain the conviction and

at work in my life today. As long as I walk in His ways and keep His precepts, the cleansing power of the gospel goes with me.

Second, you need to see that conviction and the light of understanding shine on the face of another. In teaching others about that gospel, we get to see the changes they make in the their lives as a result—there are few greater joys in life. We are but servants, you and I. The glory is

not for us but for our Father. What we take away from those moments is the knowledge that God has used us for His good pleasure and that we have made an eternal difference in a person's life (1 Cor. 3:4-8).

The next time your hear it, think about how important it is. May we never let the gospel be told or heard as though it were just a story among other stories or just a car among cars. It is the story, it is our hope, it is our salvation.




