

#### The Sabbath in the Garden of Eden?

If the Sabbath

was first given at

We must

"sanctify Christ

as Lord" in our

hearts, in

everything...

There is no doubt what Moses told the Jews about the Sabbath. He said that God ". . . declared unto you His covenant, which He commanded you to perform, even ten commandments" and then affirmed, "The Lord our God made a covenant with us in Horeb. The Lord made not his covenant

with our fathers, but with us, even us, who are all of us here alive this day" (Deut. 4:13; 5:2-3). How much clearer could God be in saying that the ten commandment covenant which included the Sabbath was not made with the fathers like Abraham, Isaac and Jacob?

When confronted with these clear statements, some who have a predetermined agenda to bind the Sabbath go to Genesis 2:2-3. To go to this passage and interpret it as affirming that God gave the Sabbath to Adam and all his descendants does not settle the issue. This interpretation simply makes God contradict Himself. God cannot lie, and to say God teaches in Genesis that He gave the Sabbath to Adam makes God a liar, when He clearly says in Deuteronomy that He did **not** make the Sabbath coverant with anyone before He gave it at Mt. Sinai.

Mt. Sinai, it was not given before

Then, what does Genesis 2:3 teach about the Sabbath? "And on the seventh day God ended His work which He had done, and rested on the seventh day from all His work

which He had done. Then God blessed the seventh day and sanctified it, because in it He rested from all His work which God had created and made." Read the passage again. The verse does not affirm that He sanctified the seventh day **before** He rested. It does not affirm that He sanctified it **as** He was resting. He had completed His seventh day rest and **then** sanctified the day because He **had** rested. The sanctification of that day was **after** He rested. Deuteronomy clearly shows when He

revealed for **the first time** about man keeping a rest day!

Recognize that Moses who wrote Genesis lived **after** two events. First, he lived after God rested, and he lived after God gave the Ten Commandments! His words in Genesis were written after God had done both of these events.

One other thing. Moses told the Jews at Mt. Sinai, "Six days you shall labor and do all your work, but the seventh day is the Sabbath of the Lord your God. In it you shall do no work" (Ex. 20:9-10). What did God tell Adam? "Cursed is the ground for your sake; in toil you shall eat of it all the days of your life" (Gen. 3:17). Look at the difference. Adam was to toil every day of his life. He was not given a rest day! The Jews at Mt. Sinai were given a rest day, but Adam never was promised one.

God cannot lie about the Sabbath!

# "Take Time to Be Holy"

One of the most meaningful and soul-stirring songs that we sing in worship is William Longstaff's "Take Time to Be Holy" from 1874. The lyrics of that song are founded upon Scriptural principles that cultivate holiness in the life of the Christian. God, who called us, is holy, and He beckons us, "You

also be holy in all your conduct" (1 Pet. 1:15-16). Consider carefully the words from this song that correlate so beautifully with the New Testament.

"Take time to be holy...Speak oft with thy Lord." Holiness comes by spending time with the Lord in prayer (1 Thess. 5:17; Phil. 4:6-7; Col. 4:2).

"Take time to be holy...Abide in Him always, and feed on His word." Holiness comes about when I study and abide in God's Word and allow it to abide in me (John 15:1-7).

"Take time to be holy...Make friends of God's children." It is so much easier (and enjoyable) to be holy when we do it together as brethren in Christ (1 Cor. 12:12-27; 15:33).

"Take time to be holy...Help those who are weak." True holiness requires that I look beyond myself and do good unto others (Matt. 7:12; Gal. 6:10; Rom. 15:1; 1 Thess. 5:14).

"Take time to be holy...Spend much time in secret

with Jesus alone...Like Him thou shalt be." To be conformed to His image, I must spend time letting Him transform me through the mirror of His Word (Rom. 8:29; 2 Cor. 3:18).

"Take time to be holy...Let Him be thy Guide; and run not before Him." God's Word must truly be "a lamp to my feet and a light to my path," so that I will not turn from the Lord in any direction (Psa. 119:105; Prov. 30:6; Deut. 4:2).

"Take time to be holy...In joy or in sorrow, still follow thy Lord." Holiness looks beyond the circumstances of life and is devoted fully to the way of the Lord (Phil. 4:4-7; 1:20-21; Matt. 6:25-34).

"Take time to be holy...Be calm in thy soul." Instead of trying to keep up, as "the world rushes on," we need to learn to "be still" and trust the Lord (Psa. 46:10; Prov. 3:5-6; Phil. 4:6-7; Col. 3:15).

"Take time to be holy...Each thought and each motive beneath His control." It is so critical, in our endeavor to live holy lives, to keep our thoughts and desires holy (2 Cor. 10:5; Phil. 4:8), for "as he thinks in his heart, so is he" (Prov. 23:7).

"Be holy, for I am holy" (1 Pet. 1:16). We must "not be conformed to this world" (Rom. 12:2), but we must "sanctify Christ as Lord" in our hearts, in everything that we say, want, think and do (1 Pet. 3:15; Col. 3:17).

Brothers and sisters, let's take time to be holy!

"Arise, O LORD, confront him, bring him low; Deliver my soul from the wicked with Your sword" (Psa. 17:13).

"He has also prepared for Himself deadly weapons; He makes His arrows fiery shafts" (Psa. 7:12).

"The LORD is my rock and my fortress and my deliverer, My God, my rock, in whom I take refuge; My shield and the horn of my salvation, my stronghold" (Psa. 18:2).

We may all have different ways of thinking about God. We have created a persona or an image of Him that we can relate to based on what we understand about God. We may not think of God the way David did. As a man of war, David saw God fighting for him against his enemies. His enemies were numerous and frequent. David was not a man

that couldn't handle enemies. He was a man of war, valiant in fight, according to the Bible. You know about the famous fight with Goliath (1 Sam. 17:48-51). Maybe you know about his scrap with the lions and bears trying to take the sheep (1 Sam. 17:34-36). Do you know what people back then said about David? "Then one of the young men said, 'Behold, I have seen a son of Jesse the Bethlehemite who is a skillful musician, a mighty man of valor, a warrior, one prudent in speech, and a handsome man; and the LORD is with him" (1 Sam. 16:18). Moreover, Hushai said, "You know your father [David] and his men, that they are mighty men and they are fierce, like a bear robbed of her cubs in the field. And your father is an expert in warfare..." (2 Sam. 17:8). Even though he is an expert in war, he does not rely on this to save him. He relies on God. Repeatedly, the Psalms portray God and a source of refuge, protection and deliverance from the oppressor.

How are you doing with your enemies? We Are you allowing may not have arch enemies or the type of enemies that are trying to kill us. We do have a lot of struggles or things that otherwise seemingly hinder our forward progress. Are you allowing God, with His arsenal, to work on those things in your life? Do you believe that He has the power to do something about it? Read this passage from Philippians and think of God as David saw Him. Think of the God the Psalms

> speak about. "Be anxious for nothing, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God. And the peace of God, which surpasses all comprehension, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus" (Psa. 4:6,7). It will be peaceful for you, it will not be so for your enemies and those struggles/anxieties in your life. It is little wonder that David could write this from Psalm 4:8, "In peace I will both lie down and sleep, For You alone, O LORD, make me to dwell in safety."

When Rhoda heard the apostle Peter knocking at the gate of Mary's house, she ran back inside the house "and announced that Peter stood before the gate" (Acts 12:14). May God help us to be like Rhoda, who "kept insisting that it was so" (Acts 12:15). May God help us to be like Paul, who kept right on "[speaking] the words of truth and reason" (Acts 26:25)! - DS

In writing to a group of Christians who were on the verge of turning from Christ and drifting away into disobedience, the writer of Hebrews urged his readers to not neglect "so great a salvation" (Heb. 2:1-4). Contemplate that for just a moment. What is "so great" about "salvation"?

great compassion, great wisdom, great power, etc. What else comes to mind? Salvation is "so great" because it will save anyone, from anything, at anytime, at anyplace, when they will come to the Lord "according to His will."

Think about the question: "How shall we escape if we neglect so great a salvation?" Don't neglect the "so great a salvation" that is yours in Christ! There's nothing greater! - DS
