Understanding the Kingdom & the Lord's Supper

Lord's supper



Our Lord promised those disciples in the first century that the kingdom would come in their lifetime. Read the following words carefully as though you were standing in the presence of Jesus. What would you have understood when He said, "Assuredly, I say to you that there are some standing here

who will not taste death till they see the kingdom of God present with power" (Mark 9:1)? Those who believe the kingdom is still future and will be established when Jesus returns to reign for a thousand years have no explanation of Jesus' word. They also have another problem and that is what Jesus said about the place future event canof the Lord's Supper in the kingdom.

Jesus taught the Lord's Supper would be part of the kingdom. It was in the upper room that

Jesus promised He would eat the Lord's Supper with His followers when the kingdom came. Jesus said, "But I say to you, I will not drink of this fruit of the vine from now on until that day when I drink it new with you in My Father's kingdom" (Matt. 26:29). He and eighty-three other Divinely sent messengers had proclaimed that the kingdom was about to be established. Now in the upper room, what Jesus said placed a time limit on the time it would come. He said, "With fervent desire I have desired to eat this Passover with you before I suffer. For I say to you I will no longer eat of it until it is fulfilled in the kingdom of God . . . I will not drink of the fruit of the vine until the kingdom of God comes" (Luke 22:15-18). His words clearly state that the cup with the fruit of the vine as part of that feast was ending and was about to be fulfilled when Jesus would assemble with the disciples at His table, His supper—the Lord's supper. The Passover, as a God-appointed feast, was within a year of coming to an end.

> The Lord's Supper became part of the promised kingdom for He made it part of His kingdom, the church. Within two months of His words in the upper room the church began. Peter proclaimed that Jesus ascended on high as an exalted king (Acts 2:20-33). His promised kingdom had come and notice what immediately happened. "They continued steadfastly in the apostles' doctrine and fellowship, in the breaking of bread and in prayers" (Acts 2:42). Jesus had become

part of the communion at His table in His kingdom!

The Lord's Supper will end when Jesus returns. "For as often as you eat this bread and drink this cup, you proclaim the Lord's death till He come" (1 Cor. 11:26). The words "till He comes" proclaim that at His coming the Lord's Supper will end. Those who see the establishment of the kingdom as a future event cannot reconcile these Divine words with their teaching.

The kingdom has come, as He promised, and He meets with us every week at His table "till He comes."



What God Says About Homosexuality (Part 5 of 5)

When one studies through the Bible and investigates all that God has to say about the topic of homosexuality and same-sex marriage, the careful student will find that, without exception, every mention of homosexuality in Scripture is a prohibition or condemnation from God. That is not intended

to be unkind in any way, but it is merely to state the reality of "what God says" about this subject. And, what God says is the only thing that matters.

The marvelous nature of God is that He is a us what is sinful Cor. 6:18; 1 Pet. 5:8; Eph. 6:11-13). God of love. We must not define "God of love" to mean that He overlooks or sanctions that which He has identified as sinful in His Word. That's not love. "God of love" means that God lovingly tells us what is sinful and then offers us hope to escape the sin.

God's gospel has the power to transform one's life and lifestyle completely. The key is to open one's heart and let the gospel enter and have free reign. "...The gospel of Christ... is the power of God to salvation..." (Rom. 1:16). It will transform one into the image of Christ, if given the chance (2 Cor. 3:18). The power of the gospel is not in the person who receives it but in the God who gave it.

God's mercy offers the opportunity to repent and change one's direction in life. In the New Testament, repentance is not only a command (Acts 17:30), but it is presented as a gift from God (Acts 5:31; 11:18). Repentance is not easy, but with God's help, it can be done (cf. 2 Cor. 12:21).

God's grace provides a way of escape from temptation. Temptation to sin, including homosexual activity, may never leave a person, but through the grace of God, a Christian can overcome every temptation (1 Cor. 10:13; 1 John 5:4). To successfully overcome temptation, we must pray for strength

against it (Matt. 6:13; 26:41) and flee from those situations and stimuli that Satan throws in our path (1

God's power can change your identity from what you "were" to what you "are." Addressing some Christians who used to be homosexuals, Paul said, "And such were some of you. But you were washed, but you were sanctified, but you were justi-

fied in the name of the Lord Jesus," and now you are "the temple of the Holy Spirit who is in you" (1 Cor. 6:11, 19).

God's love offers the blessing of the inheritance of His kingdom to everyone who loves Him and yields their lives to Him and His will (1 Cor. 6:9-11, 18-20; Rom. 6:1-23). He truly is a God of love! His love truly wants what is best for us!

May God help us to be a loving people, who love God, who love truth, who love people and who love helping others to walk in paths of righteousness!



Would you do what he did?

If you were told exactly what to do to inherit eternal life, would you do it? In the case of the rich young ruler, he did not (Mark 10:17-25). As Jesus was preparing for a journey, the young man runs up to Jesus, bows and asks what he should do to inherit eternal By Josh Blackmer life. Jesus responded with, seemingly, the

standard answer, most of which was straight from the Ten

Commandments. The young man's response is intriguing. "And he said to Him, 'Teacher, I have kept all What is your one these things from my youth up'" (Mark 10:20). He is saying that he is already doing those things. It makes me wonder why he even asked. It appears that something inside him knew that he needed to do more. Mark's account tells us that Jesus, "looking at him, had love for him" (Mark 10:21). At this point, we do not know what Jesus was thinking. It could be

the case that He was happy to be talking with someone who knew that there was more to serving God than just the outward show of righteousness.

The self-righteous acts of the religiously elite of the day drew a lot of negative attention from Jesus. "But woe to you Pharisees! For you pay tithe of mint and rue and every kind of garden herb, and yet disregard justice and the love of God; but these are the things you should have done without neglecting the others" (Luke 11:42). While righteousness does require obedience, it also requires a heart that is involved in the process. Paul mentions the same concept in his letter to the Corinthian church. "And if I give all my possessions to feed the poor, and if I surrender my body to be burned, but do not have love, it profits me nothing" (1 Cor. 13:3). We can do all these things, but if we do not have the proper motivation, it means nothing.

thing you need to let go of so you can serve God better?

In the case of the rich young ruler, his hang-up was money. Looking at him, Jesus felt a love for him and said to him, "One thing you lack: go and sell all you possess and give to the poor, and you will have treasure in heaven; and come, follow Me" (Mark 10:21). He was told exactly what he needed to do to inherit eternal life. He walked away sad because he had great wealth. Jesus uses the moment to warn His disciples about the love of money (1 Tim. 6:9-10). I

find that really interesting considering Judas was in the crowd at that moment. He was pilfering the collection for the poor and would eventually betray Jesus for 30 pieces of silver.

So, what we can take away from this event is that you can tell someone exactly what to do, and they will not do it. It comes down to what you love most. You cannot serve two masters (Matt. 6:24).

What is your one thing you need to let go of so you can serve God better?
