The Bible is filled with verses that use the word "whoever" or "whosoever." I am so thankful that this is true. In Old Testament times, God had His chosen nation called Israel because the rest of mankind had turned away from Him. However, such is no longer true for the New Testament is fill with

promise to the "whoevers."

Can you image how tragic it would be to have the knowledge you have of God, of His purposes and His providence if you were not part of that plan? Imagine knowing the one mediator between God and man and you being excluded from the picture. Imagine knowing of the words, "Come you words, and then blessed of Father, inherit the kingdom prepared for you from the foundation of the world" (Matt. 25:34),

and you being excluded from them! God perish the thought!

Take time to read these "whoever" verses, and then imagine you are excluded from them. Think about it. Then, read them a second time and take time to thank God you are included. Think about it.

God's "whoever" verses. "Whoever offers praise glorifies Me and...I will show the salvation of God" (Psa. 50:23). "Whoever calls on the name of the Lord shall be saved" (Joel 2:32). Think about it.

Jesus' "whoever" verses. "Whoever confesses Me before men, him I will confess before My Father who is in heaven. But whoever denies Me before men I will also deny before My Father who is in heaven" (Matt. 10:32-33). "Whoever believes in Him should not perish, but have eternal life" (John 3:15). "Whoever drinks of this water will thirst again, but whoever drinks of the water that I shall give him will never thirst" (John 4:13-14). "Whoever eats My flesh and

> drinks My blood has eternal life, and I will raise him up at the last day" (John 6:54). "Whoever lives and believes in Me shall never die" (John 11:26). "Whoever believes in Me shall not abide in darkness" (John 12:46). Think about it.

The apostles' "whoever" verses. "But in every nation whoever fears Him and works righteousness is accepted by Him . . . Whoever believes in

Him will receive the remission of sins" (Acts 10:35, 43). "Whoever believes on Him will not be put to shame" (Rom. 9:33). Think about it.

The last "whoever" verse. Now go to the last page in in the Bible. Read the final words of God. "The Spirit and the bride say 'Come!' And let him who hears say, 'Come!' Whoever desires, let him take the water of life freely" (Rev. 22:17). As you read His words, just imagine what it would be like if you were excluded. How blessed we are. Think about it!

The Role of Women in the Church

Within His word, the Lord has authorized specific roles for men and women to have in His church. What a privilege to even be in the body of Christ! Then, to know that God has given each member an assigned role and purpose is even more thrilling.

While men and women share some

of the same responsibilities in the church, Christ has allocated

certain roles in leadership exclusively to the men. Since the church belongs to Him, He is the one solely authorized to make such distinctions. However, He makes it clear that these varying roles are not based upon one's value or ability, but they are simply different functions that He Himself has appointed.

Christ has specified the role of leadership our lives. for the men in the church—elders (1 Tim. 3:1-7), deacons (1 Tim. 3:8-13), preachers and worship leaders (1 Tim. 2:1 -12; 4:13-16). Christ has therefore specified a role of submission for the women in the church. While this concept is highly unpopular in today's culture, it is, nevertheless, His plan. Let us consider what the New Testament teaches in this regard.

Women are called to "learn in silence with all submission" (1 Tim. 2:11). This emphasizes a spirit of attentiveness and receptiveness, which a woman of God has toward the male leaders in the church. The woman is not inferior to the man or of less worth or the target of discrimination, any more than Christ is inferior to God (cf. 1 Cor. 11:3). It is a matter of roles that have been assigned.

Women are not permitted "to teach or to exercise authority over a man" (1 Tim. 2:12). This is not prohibiting all teaching (Tit. 2:3-5) or talking to a man about the Bible (Acts 18:26; 1 Pet. 3:15) or being an active and influential part of a congregation (Acts 9:36-39; Rom. 16:1-2), but it has to do with

> the position of authority inherent in one engaged in public teaching or leading in a church. A woman of God will willingly and humbly submit to God's plan for her place in the church.

The Lord specifies at least three reasons for these differences in roles. First, He emphasizes the Divine order of authority, in which "the head of woman is man" (1 Cor. 11:3). Second, He points to the

order of creation, "Adam was formed first, then Eve" (1 Tim. 2:13; 1 Cor. 11:8-9). Third, He calls attention to the introduction of sin into the world, when "the woman being deceived, fell into transgression" (1 Tim. 2:14; cf. Gen. 3:6, 16). Thus, the roles are not tied to any culture but to God's eternal plan.

Christian women are wonderfully talented servants of God, and there are many meaningful roles that they can and do fulfill in the church. May God help each of us to submit ourselves to His will for our lives and seek His good pleasure.

The Brooklyn Bridge that connects New York with Long Island was built over a period of 13 years, from 1870 to 1883. It was the brain child of John Roebling. At the time, no one thought it could be done. He was able to convince his son, Washington, to coengineer the project. With great opposition,

they hired a crew and began the work. A few months into the project, there was an accident that killed John Roebling and another left Washington unable to Our only opposition but not forsaken; struck down, but not destroyed; talk or walk. As they were the only ones that knew the plans, the project stopped. The naysayers thought they were vindicated in their doubts. However, Washington developed a system of communication with his wife. By tapping his finger, the only thing he could move, on her arm he gave instructions on how to finish the project. On the first day the bridge was opened, 1,800 vehicles and 150,300 people

Twice in 2 Corinthians chapter 4 we read this statement, "We do not lose heart" (2 Cor. 4:1, 16). Paul uses this phrase as bookends to a particularly difficult task, sharing the pure gospel in the face of opposition and persecution. At the end of chapter 3, Paul mentions that, "We all... are being transformed into the same image [of the Lord]." He then begins chapter 4, "Therefore, since we have received this ministry."

passed over the bridge, and 132 years later it still stands.

That ministry or service is helping other people be conformed to the image of Christ through the teaching of the gospel. Paul stresses the fact that those who do so are nothing but "bondservants" and "earthen vessels." He also stresses the majesty of the message. Read what he has to say about the challenge. "But we have this treasure in earthen vessels, so that the surpassing greatness of the power will be of God and not from ourselves; we are afflicted in every way, but not

> crushed; perplexed, but not despairing; persecuted, always carrying about in the body the dying of Jesus, so that the life of Jesus also may be manifested in our body. For we who live are constantly being delivered over to death for Jesus' sake, so that the life of Jesus also may be manifested in our mortal flesh. So death works in us, but life in you" (2 Cor. 4:7-12). Paul was so confident in the resurrection

of Christ that he knew that he would rise also (2 Cor. 4:14). Paul and the early church had great opposition. Our only opposition is self and fear. Surrender those things to God, and do not lose heart. Roebling had every reason to give up. His wife could have said, "Curse God and die!" But, he did not lose heart. With great determination, he and his wife were able to build what was said could not be done. We are not building a bridge. We are telling people how to cross the bridge that Christ built with His death and resurrection.


