The Invisible Bible

The impact of the Bible in the history of man is remarkable. Most books from the ancient past are hardly ever read. Yet, the Bible, though thousands of years old, remains at the top of the list of best sellers each year. This fact alone should help us marvel that our educational system has re-

moved it from our classrooms. In many places, a teacher cannot even have a copy of it on his/her desk. What a tragic mistake! The smallest

Bible Trivia

Each year over 100,000,000 copies of the Bible are sold or given away freely in our world. It has been translated into nearly 350 languages and parts of it have been translated into over 1,100 languages and dialects. Most American homes have about three copies of the Bible. (How many do you have? I checked my

shelves at the office and immediately found 57 copies of the Bible). The precise number of Bibles printed is difficult to ascertain, but 6,001,500,000 Bible have been printed since Gutenberg printed the first one in 1455.

The Largest Printed Bible

The largest printed Bible was finished in 1930. Louis Waynai, a member of the church, used a homemade rubberstamp press, and it took him 8,700 hours to complete the project. That Bible is in the library at Abilene Christian University. When closed, it is 34 inches tall and almost four feet wide. It weighs 1,094 pounds and has 8,700 pages.

The Smallest Printed Bible

The smallest printed Bible is about the size of a grain of sugar. Using a process called "Focused Ion Beam," the Haifi Institute of Technology printed 1,514 pages of the Bible on a metal plate the size of the head of a pin. It weighs less than one half of an ounce.

The Invisible Bible

Yet, there is something far more remarkable than the facts just given. There is a Bible so "small" eye but it is seen that it is impossible to be seen. Its impact is also greater and has more influence than all the Bibles ever printed. Consider these words describing this

Bible. "Your word have I hidden in my heart that I might not sin against you" (Psa. 119:11). "And these words which I command you today shall be in your heart. You shall teach them diligently to your children" (Deut. 6:6-7). "Written not with ink but by the Spirit of the living God, not on tablets of stone but on tablets of flesh, that is of the heart" (2 Cor. 3:3). This Bible is invisible to the eye of any mortal, but is seen daily in the lives of His people.

One final question. Do you have your Bible on a shelf in your home or hidden in your heart?

Are you going to heaven? If you were to die right this moment, would you go to heaven or not? Are you sure? Can you be

I can remember as a child, growing By David Sproule up in the church, and believing that a Christian could not know where he would go, at

any given moment, if he were to die. I have no idea where I got that idea, but it was a scary idea. The very thought that a Christian could go through his daily life and have no clue as to his eternal destiny can children to know God" (4:15). Are you "in Him"? Then, you can know lead to all sorts of questions, worries and anxieties.

However, that precarious outlook is not a Biblical concept. God has given, and wants His children to have, confidence! He wants His children to know for certain if they are going to heaven or not.

John writes, "These things I have written to you...that you may know that you have eternal life" (1 John 5:13). The word "know" emphasizes a complete and absolute knowledge. It is not a knowledge that needs to be learned or experienced, but a knowledge that is intuitively certain because God gave it.

How can a Christian have this absolute certainty? Look at the passage. "Eternal life" is a favorite subject of the apostle John. He emphasizes it more in his gospel account than the other writers do. Then, it is a focal point in his first epistle. "And this is the promise that He has promised us eternal life" (2:25). "God has given us eternal life" (5:11). "You have eternal life" (5:13). So, how can a child of God have confidence in this life that he will go to heaven when he dies?

Notice how precise John is. "God has given us eternal life, and this life is in His Son" (5:11). One must be "in Christ," in order to know that he has eternal life. John clearly teaches that one is "in Him" when he "keeps His word" (2:5; 3:24),

> walks "just as He walked" (2:6), "abides in Him" (3:6) and continually "confesses that Jesus is the Son of that you have eternal life!

One must "believe in the name of the Son of God" (5:13), in order to know that he has eternal life. The word "believe" is in the present tense, emphasizing a continuous and abiding faith. John plainly

affirms in this epistle that those with an abiding faith are those who "keep His commandments" (2:3, 4; 3:22, 23, 24; 5:2, 3). Notice how many times that is emphasized in this book. Are you demonstrating a continuous faith by keeping His commandments? Then, you can know that you have eternal life!

God wants you to go to heaven, and He's told you how to get there! God wants you to KNOW that you're going to heaven, and He's told you how to know it! Are you going? Are you sure? What a blessing to have that confidence!

of this "perverse generation" (Acts 2:40)—the contamination of pure religion to the point of bland religiosity. I want to scream, "I am not a Mormon! I am not a brand of what you think religion is!" When I begin talking about faith or the Bible, I often feel like the nonverbal response is, "Why should I choose your brand of religion?" It is as though we

are at a giant religious trade show with hundreds of tables, and everyone is peddling their ideas of what they think devotion to a higher power is. So, the thinking of some becomes, "We need to change the product to attract more." If we do those things, then we become another voice diluting the message.

The only option in this scenario is to teach the pure powerful gospel. If we begin to think that changing it will make the church more attractive, then we have missed two very important things. One, if changing the gospel makes it more relevant and seemingly more powerful, then it was never inspired to begin with. I know that the Bible teaches that is has all

things that pertains unto to life and godliness (2 Pet. 1:3). I also know that it is sufficient. "All Scripture is inspired by God and profitable for teaching, for reproof, for correction, for training in righteousness; so that the man of God may be adequate, equipped for every good work" (2 Tim. 3:16-17). I know that it is powerful. "For I am not ashamed of the gospel, for it is the power of God for salvation to everyone who believes, to the Jew first and also to the Greek" (Rom. 1:16). So, if changing it

makes it better than this, then it was never inspired to begin with, and you can delete the whole thing.

The second thing we are missing is that it is not about the numbers. God has never been about the numbers. Ask Gide-

on. God wants all men to be saved (2 Pet. 3:9). Christ said, "Enter through the narrow gate; for the gate is wide and the way is broad that leads to destruction, and there are many who enter through it. For the gate is small and the way is narrow that leads to life, and there are few who find it" (Matt. 7:13-14). So, we know going into this that people are not going to come running to the church like Krispy Kreme with the hot sign on. This should not cause us to change the message or our work. If we were to adapt or change the gospel in any way, we would become just another voice of religiosity with no power to save. If we remain pure in practice and doctrine, then we are the church. Simply Christians, powerfully equipped.
