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"Mountaintops" and "Valleys"

Spiritual lives are not always characterized by "mountaintop experiences." It was wonderful for Moses to be in the presence of God on Mount Sinai, but eventually he had to leave the mountain and return to the reality of dealing with the Jewish rebellion in worshiping the golden calf.

In the same way, Peter, James and John were at the

Mount of Transfiguration and saw Moses, Elijah and the transformation of Jesus, but they eventually had to leave that mountain and confront their failure to cast out the demon in the child.

Elijah experienced this same problem in the contest he had with 450 prophets of Baal on Mount Carmel. The fire from heaven totally consumed the prophet's sacrifice and shortly afterwards there was

the slaughter of all the false prophets. Yet, when Elijah descended from that mount, he was so overwhelmed with the sinfulness of Israel, he asked God to take him, for he thought he was the only person in Israel who faithfully served Jehovah.

"Mountaintop experiences" are so wonderful. There are those times when we see great spiritual victories and figuratively are on top of the world. You may remember in great detail that day when you obeyed the Gospel and how exhilarated you were. It may have been that day when some loved one of yours became a Christian. It may have been one of the unexpected times when you were worshiping, and you were so enthralled that you forgot about all those distractions from daily life. Thank God for "mountaintop experiences."

However, the reality is that life always has deep "valleys" when we must leave the mountaintop. Life probably has more valleys than it has mountaintops. Situations develop and doubts and fears seem to threaten our faith. Do not des-

> pair. Look at those heroes who were in that same situation. Abraham (Gen. 15:1; 20:10-11), Isaac (Gen. 26:24), Moses (Num. 21:34), Joshua (Josh. 1:9; 8:1), David (1 Sam. 23:17), Elijah (2 Kgs. 1:15), Jehoshaphat (2 Chron. 20:15) and Daniel (Dan. 10:12) are just a few of those individuals who were fearful when in the valleys of life.

There is a great principle of life to be learned when we look deeply into the lives of our Biblical heroes. Godly people have always had clouds of adversity around them. Their response was often like ours, but this does not mean they were not approved by God. All mankind has valleys, but Christians have something others do not have. When we are walking in valley of death may our hearts proclaim, "I will fear not evil for You are with me. Your rod and Your staff, they comfort me." Thank God for those "mountaintop experiences," but let us thank God for the blessings of His help in the valleys!

I don't say this because I believe that Christmas is a religious holiday to celebrate the birth of Christ, but I do find some joy in knowing that people believe that Jesus is the reason for anything good these days. And, because our "forerunner has entered for us [into the Presence of God], even Jesus," we have hope "as an anchor of the soul" (Heb. 6:19-20). Do you have that hope? Then give praise to Jesus! He is the reason!

Jesus is the reason for the church. You and I would know nothing of the church (and maybe care nothing about it) if it were not for Jesus Christ! When His physical body died on the cross, He "purchased" His spiritual body, the church (Acts 20:28). How important is the church? It is "the body of Christ" (Eph. 4:12; 1:22-23), saved by "the blood of Christ" (Eph. 2:13-16). Are you in His body, the church? Then give praise to Jesus! He is the reason!

> Jesus is the reason for zeal. You and I need things: (1) am I zealous as a Christian? and (2) why? True zeal as a Christian has nothing to do with me or what I get out of it for myself, but true zeal is all about Jesus. When "the love of Christ compels us" (2

Cor. 5:14), we will boldly speak His word (Acts 4:13-31) and be truly "zealous for good works" (Tit. 2:14). Are you burning with zeal? Then give praise to Jesus! He is the reason!

Jesus is the reason for...love, joy, peace, grace, mercy, forgiveness, courage, repentance, worship, faithfulness, assurance, obedience, etc. This list goes on and on. Don't let this realization emerge for a few weeks and then go back into hibernation for several months. Jesus is the reason for who you are and what you have as a Christian! Give praise to Him!

thought, what should our response be to those that return? How should we approach the penitent brother or sister that has come back to their first love?

First, we must realize that there is already a burden of guilt upon those that return. It is not ours to make that burden any greater by subjecting them to our self-righteous judgments. Look at how those in the parable responded to the return. The father celebrated as one that received his child back from

death (Luke 15:32). The older brother did not feel that his sibling was deserving of such treatment (Luke 15:28-30). The reality is nobody ever deserves the Father's love. In 2 Corinthians, Paul writes concerning the treatment of the repentant brother in Christ that had been withdrawn from. "Sufficient for such a one is this punishment which was inflicted by the majority, so that on the contrary you should rather forgive and com-

fort him, otherwise such a one might be overwhelmed by excessive sorrow. Wherefore I urge you to reaffirm your love for him" (2:6-8). This is exactly what the father was doing. He was reestablishing the relationship that had been severed because of sin.

Second, they need to be built back up to a measure of strength. The wayward child had been in the far off land eating very little. Desiring to eat even the slop for pigs. When he re-

turned home, I think of him as having a feeble body, barely able to walk. Spiritually, those that have wandered away for a length time are in a similar situation. "Brethren, even if anyone is caught in any trespass, you who are spiritual, restore such a one in a spirit of gentleness; each one looking to yourself, so that you too will not be tempted" (Gal. 6:1). The word "restore" is the same word used in Mark 1:19 for mending nets. Hebrews 12:13 talks about the concept as though you are resetting a joint that was

out of place. An arm that once hung lifeless to the side is set back in place and nurtured to usefulness.

When the lost son came to his senses, he returned home. We pray that those who are off in the far country spiritually would return also. Nothing would give heaven greater joy than for the wayward to say, "Here I come to my own again, fed, forgiven and known again..."
