Understanding Atonement

There are many words which describe our salvation. Each one emphasizes a particular aspect of that salvation. We talk about forgiveness, regeneration, justification, redemption and sanctification. The word we least understand is the word atonement. We know about the Jewish Day of Atonement

and believe in our atonement, but we have little understanding of the meaning of this word.

Illustrations of Atonement

Numbers chapter sixteen tells of the rebellion of Korah, Dathan and Abiram. This resulted in our sins no more. the death of these men and about 250 others who followed them. The next day, the Jews slandered Moses and accused him of killing the people of God. God was so angry. His wrath was manifested in a

plague which killed nearly 15,000 Jews. What stopped the plague? What appeased His wrath? Aaron took a censer and stood between the Jews and the advancing plague. This action is described as making atonement for the nation (16:46-47). Wrath was appeased, and this is described as atonement.

In Numbers 25, the Jews were committing fornication with the Midianite women. God's anger again sent a plague and killed 24,000 Jews. What stopped the plague? Phinehas, the grandson of Aaron, took a javelin and thrust it through the

bodies of a Jewish man and a Midianite women who publically were fornicating. God said, "Phinehas...has turned back my wrath from the children of Israel because He was zealous with My zeal among them...because he was zealous for his God, and made atonement for the children of Israel" (25:11-13). If you want to understand atonement, read this story and the previous one to see what atonement means.

Atonement Always Connected with God's Anger

Atonement always involves sin which results in God's wrath against sin and actions being done to assuage His wrath. If there is no atonement, His wrath will surely come.

Sins Not "Rolled Forward" in the Old Testament

The concept that sins were "rolled forward" (think of a giant snowball getting larger every year) on the Day of Atonement does not portray what actually happened. Every year on that day God remembered the sins of Israel, and if atonement was not made His wrath was sent. Nations came against Israel when atonement was not made. When it was made, His anger was appeased, and God blessed

Because of Christ's sacrifice atonement is ours. He does not remember our sins. "Their sins will I remember no more" (Jer. 31:34). Thank God for our atonement!

that nation. God remembered their sins every year.



How Do I Compare to Others?

As we approach the end of one year and the beginning of another, this is often a time of introspection and personal evaluation on numerous levels. As you spend time assessing where you are-financially, relationally, medically, spiritually, etc.-make

sure that you are using a proper standard.

Paul addressed this matter in 2 Corinthians 10:12,

when he defended himself against false charges that were being made against him and his authority as an apostle. His accusers were ones who were "commending themselves" (i.e., were bragging on themselves), but their standard of evaluation was a faulty standard. Paul stated that "they measure themselves by themselves and compare themselves with themselves," resulting in an inflated opinion of themselves and seeing themselves as doing better than others.

A faulty standard will lead to faulty conclusions. The inspired penman declared that those who compare themselves to others "are not wise" (NKJV) and "are without understanding" (NASB). There is one perfect standard against which we must all measure ourselves—Jesus Christ and His Word! Using any other yardstick is a serious mistake.

Some Christians compare themselves to the world and feel good about themselves. "At least I'm not living like those people anymore or doing the horrible things those people are doing. Compared to them, I'm an angel and doing just fine." A faulty standard will lead to faulty conclusions.

Some Christians compare themselves to "weaker" Christians and feel good about themselves. "I'm not doing much but at least I'm doing more than that sorry excuse for a Christian. I don't see how they think they'll ever make it to heaven. At least I'm doing better than they are." A faulty

standard will lead to faulty conclusions.

Some Christians compare themselves to "stronger" Christians and feel bad about themselves. "Look at all they are doing. There is no way I will ever make that much of a difference. I'm embarrassed to even try to do more, as my efforts seem so pitiful." A faulty standard will lead to faulty conclusions.

All Christians should compare themselves to the one standard that never fails, the one standard that remains steadfastly consistent, the one standard that applies universally to all of us in all places for all time. "Imitate Christ" (1 Cor. 11:1). "Follow His steps" (1 Pet. 2:21). "Be conformed to the image of His Son" (Rom. 8:29). Look to His words (John 12:48). Look to His example (John 13:15).

As we transition into a new year, spend time in evaluation of where you are spiritually, but make sure that you are using the proper standard.

Just Make It Through the Wilderness

It would be an understatement to say that the Bible was beautifully written. A more accurate statement is that godly men were moved by inspiration to pen the very words that God would have them to write (2 Pet. 1:20-21). Those words contain a very sober and challenging warning with relation

to our time on this earth.

"So there remains a Sabbath rest for the people of God. For the one who has entered His rest has himself also rested from his works, as God did from His. Therefore let us be diligent to enter that rest, so that no one will fall, through following the same example of disobedience" (Heb. 4:9-11). The writer of Hebrews uses the example of the Israelite nation declining to conquer Canaan because they thought it would be too hard for them. So, the writer

makes reference to their, "example of disobedience." In 1 Corinthians chapter 10, Paul broadens the analogy to encompass the entire time of the wilderness wandering by the Israelites as an example of how not to follow God. "Now these things happened to them as an example, and they were written for our instruction, upon whom the ends of the ages have come" (1 Cor. 10:11).

So, the challenge to us is to just make it through the wilderness. Don't follow the example of those that failed be-

cause of disobedience, lack of faith in God, lack of courage and deficiency in moral character. If the people had been obedient and fully trusting in God, as Joshua and Caleb had been, the story would be quite different. They would have been in the wilderness for less than a year. They would have gone in and conquered the indigenous peoples. They would have established a kingdom with God as their king. They would have rested, and they would have been better examples to us today.

> It is easy for us to assume that we would have done better. After all, they were able to hear God's voice on the mountain. They were also able to see the power of God in the plagues. They could see the presence of God in the form of a cloud or fire. The Holy Spirit anticipates that reaction in the reader and had Paul pen these words, "Therefore let him who thinks he stands take heed that he does not fall" (1 Cor. 10:12). How are you doing with the chal-

lenge laid before you?

Let us rise to the

challenge that is

laid before us.

The Bible clearly teaches that we are just pilgrims passing through (Heb. 11:13; 1 Pet. 2:11). Will your path be a direct one? Straight to the gates of rest that lay beyond this life (Matt. 7:14)? Or will you be denied entrance to the place of rest because of disbelief and lack of conviction? Let us rise to the challenge that is laid before us. Let us labor together and be diligent to enter into that rest that has been prepared for us. Do not be forever lost in the wilderness of sin.


