# The Importance of Obedience

As Jesus began teaching, He went to a mountaintop and with His disciples around Him, He startled those who heard Him by the way He preached. "When Jesus had ended these sayings, the people were astonished at His teaching, for He taught them as one having authority, and not as the scribes" (Matt.

7:28-29). So much of what He taught was so different from what most individuals thought about religion.

Many Jews of His day strongly believed that the outward manifestation of their devotion was the evidence of their acceptance by God. They thought that long, repetitious prayers publicly delivered showed that those praying were accepted by God (Matt. 6:5-7). They thought that regular fasting characterized by disfigured faces indicated the holiness of

the person fasting (Matt. 6:16-18). They thought that those who gave great gifts to those in need, in such a way so that others saw it, was the proof of great spirituality (Matt. 6:1-3).

Jesus looked at those who taught these ideas and described them as wolves who looked like sheep. He urged His followers to take a deeper look at these religious leaders and judge them by their fruits (Matt. 7:15-16).

Look at the clarity of His words as He neared the end of this discourse, "Not everyone who says to Me, 'Lord, Lord,'

shall enter the kingdom of heaven" (Matt. 7:21). This was the exact opposite of those who defined spirituality with the wrong measure. Those who did this thought their salvation was assured because they called Him "Lord," yet Jesus said that such did not guarantee acceptance.

He then mentioned other things which would not bring salvation. At the final judgment there would be those prophets (preachers) claiming to speak for God who would be

> lost. He said that there would be those who claimed they were performing miracles like casting out demons who would be lost. He said there would be those who claimed to perform mighty deeds who also would hear the words, "Depart from Me, I never knew you" (Matt. 7:22-23).

**y Him** Then, who will be saved? He answers this in one brief phrase and one parable. Who will be saved—those who do the will of My Father (Matt. 7:21)! External religion without obedience to what He says cannot bring salvation. The parable of the two builders vividly shows one's "spiritual house" does not stand unless the rules are followed.

It is not enough to be religious. The only one who is assured by Jesus of salvation is the one who "...does the will of My Father." True religion is manifested in the life of an individual, but those deeds come from a heart which first seeks the will of the Father. This shows the importance of obedience!



# **God's One-Way Street**

Two cars approach one another, going opposite directions on a well-lit, single lane street. There is a solid wall on the right and a solid wall on the left. There is no other direction to go. Who must yield the right of way? Would it help to know that it is a oneway street? Now, which one must yield?

This is not a hard scenario to solve. Obviously, the

driver going in the wrong direction must back up, turn around and go in the right direction. Once he is shown the "One Way" sign, he would have no other argument or recourse than to comply.

Similarly, two individuals may approach one another, going in opposite directions on a well-lit, single Bible doctrine. Let's assume that there is a solid wall on the right and on the left, meaning that weak to life! there is no other direction or option. One of these people is going in the right direction and the other is not. Who must yield the right of way?

This scenario, for some, may not be as easy to solve. Obviously, the Bible student going in the wrong direction must back up, turn around and go in the right direction. But, how can it be shown who is going in the right direction and who is going in the wrong direction? Bible students must pay attention to the directional (i.e., One-Way) signs that God gives in the Bible. God puts down road signs that are very clear.

God has only one truth (John 8:32; Eph. 4:5). No person has a right to alter that one truth one iota (Deut. 4:2; Gal. 1:6-9; Rev. 22:18-19). God's truth will never contradict itself (2 Tim. 3:16; Heb. 6:18). No person should try to set one verse against another (2 Tim. 2:15). God's ways are always right (Hos. 14:9). Man's ways are not (Prov. 14:12). God's doctrines are truth (John 17:17). Man's doctrines are not (Matt. 15:8-9).

> How can I know if I'm going in the right direction? How can I know if I have God's truth on a matter, or if I'm the one who is wrong? To know God's truth on a Bible doctrine, gather all of the relevant Scriptural evidence on that Bible subject (the "sum" of it) (Psa. 119:160). Handle it aright (2 Tim. 2:15) by putting it (and keeping it) in its original con-

text and studying what it meant to its original recipients. Put all things to the test (1 Thess. 5:21), using clear Bible teaching as the only standard (Acts 17:11). Respect the authority of the Scriptures as final (Matt. 28:18; Col. 3:17).

The Bible was not written to have multiple meanings but only one (Matt. 21:25; Jude 3). The Bible is not a two-way street, but a one-way (narrow) street that leads to life (Matt. 7:13-14; John 14:6; 1 Tim. 2:4). Man's doctrine will lead you in the wrong direction! Read the Bible! Respect God's "One Way" signs! Yield to His truth in all things! Don't be ashamed!

# Are You a Christian or a Cliché?

You have seen them. These are the "Jesus is my co-pilot" bumper sticker Christians. The ones that just "feel" like they know what God wants for their lives. The ones that are "called by God" to make a ministry out of every obscure verb or concept. The ones By Josh Blackmer that say they are praying for you but are nev-

er around when life gets really hard. The ones that can't back their faith up with facts, just feelings. In the end, they are a hollow cliché. Due to the overwhelming number of cliché Christians, the name Christian has become a societal pigeon hole for good people that mention Jesus and have weird ideas on moral issues. Because of them, you have a hard time telling people you are a real and legitimate follower of Christ. They think, "Oh, another Christian," and into the pigeon hole you go. You then try to take the time to explain

what the Bible says about being a Christian. But, you get the "I have never heard of that" response, and you are stuck into the pigeon hole labeled, "What I Don't Understand," next to tax law and The Hitch Hiker's Guide to the Galaxy.

So, what do we do to stem the tide of confusion? First, let's all make a pact not to be a cliché Christian. Don't start a conversation about a Bible subject with, "I feel." It doesn't matter what you feel, only what is written. Be a student of the Word and back up doctrine with corresponding Scripture. Did you know that the phrase, "It is written," is found 63 times in the New Testament? Learn to use the Sword of the Spirit with surgical precision.

Second, continue to hold your moral compass in line with God and "His righteousness" (Matt. 6:33). We must be those who would live above reproach, even to the detriment of our own desires (1 Tim. 6:14; 1 Cor. 8:13). When we compromise and stray from moral center, then we become just one of the masses that claim to know Jesus.

Do not be a cliché or a cheap imitation. Put the effort into being genuine.

Third, be ready to receive those that repent and help them come out of sin. This can be difficult. It involves a lot of prayer and time spent with people. Remember always that you are helping people escape the captivity of Satan's snares (2 Tim. 2:26). The golden rule applies here also (Matt. 7:12). You may one day need that same help yourself.

Lastly, remember that Christ fought against the clichés also. He repeatedly stated, "You have heard that it was said...but I say unto you" (Matt. 5:21-22). They weren't Christians then. They were Pharisees, Sadducees, Scribes and Jews. Whenever we change, water down, skew or otherwise taint the image of the original, we become a cliché. The Bible says we become a stumbling block (Rom. 14:13), a hindrance to the knowledge of Christ. Do not be a cliché or a cheap imitation. Put the effort into being a genuine Christian.
