Eyes of Faith Looking Upward

It is remarkable how often the Bible makes reference to our ability to see. The contrast between righteousness and unrighteousness is illustrated by referring to light and darkness. The Bible uses the spiritual eyes of Christians walking by faith in contrast to those who walk in darkness. Our God

wants us to use the eyes of faith to look upward.

David, whose heart was like the heart of God, gives insight into the source of his spirituality. How did he begin his day? Take time to read his words slowly and think about them. "My voice You shall hear in the morning, O Lord; in the morning I will direct it to You and I will look up" (Psa. 5:3). Imagine how busy the life of the king of Israel was, yet he found time each day to look upward and spend

time with God. How foolish are we when we get so busy that we cannot find time to look up to our God!

The prophet Micah also showed this same use of spiritual eyes. "Therefore I will look to the Lord; I will wait for the God of my salvation; My God will hear me" (Mic. 7:7). Reading his description of Israel is like reading the description of America today. It was a land where men went to bed at night but not to rest. "Woe to those who devise iniquity, and work out evil on their beds! At morning light they practice it" (Mic. 2:1).

Some men practice evil, but the prophet described Israel as those who "...successfully do evil with both hands" (Mic. 7:3). How did Micah deal with all of this? He looked upward to God, waiting for God to bring about His salvation. As you are filled with despair about all that is happening in this land, look upwards and wait for God.

The writer of Hebrews dealt with those whose faith was being challenged and who were tempted to turn away

from God and choose a less demanding life. What illustration did he use to encourage them? He described life as being like a race. He urged them to lay aside every weight which encumbered them as they ran and to keep going onward with patient steadfastness. Then he said, "Looking unto Jesus...who for the joy that was set before Him endured the cross, despising the shame, and has sat down at the right hand

of the throne of God" (Heb. 12:2). Instead of focusing on our own "crosses" and adversities, we should look upward to see our Lord seated in heaven. He never gave up, and we can look upward and see Him there awaiting our arrival.

So, when you are in the midst of trial, remember the examples set before us by David, Micah and the Lord. We are never alone, for He will never leave us or forsake us. Instead of looking outward at the problems, may God help us to look up. The eyes of faith see things which others will never see!

Every time we

partake we are

saying, "We

remember."

What would it have been like to partake in the Lord's Supper with the apostles? Or, with Mary, Martha and Lazarus? Or any of those upon whom the Lord made such a lasting impact? What would they be thinking about as the words rolled across their minds, "Do this in remembrance of

Me" (Luke 22:19)? They could have been thinking about any of the events that we have recorded in the gospels. There was the upper room when He told them of this ceremonial meal (Matt. 26:26-29). There was the washing of the feet that took place that night (John 13:3-10). They also could be thinking of any untold number of things that were never recorded in the Bible. Maybe each of them had an event that was special to themselves that they never told anyone

about. To have been in the room with them and to have heard them talk about Jesus, the man they saw, loved and missed, would have been such a treasure.

As we think about our Lord, we can only imagine what Christ would have been like. We have an intellectual understanding of the events as they were recorded and a heart of faith, but we stop short of having enough detail for an accurate mental image. The Bible was not written as a novel that it would lay out details which would allow us to form an image of the scene in our minds. We are given the events, dialogue and pertinent details as the story unfolded. The rest of the blanks we have to fill in with our limited understanding of that time period, culture, geography and ancient history. We can be confident that we have "all things that pertain to life and godliness" (2 Pet. 1:3). It is just that those details are not needed for life and godliness.

The beauty of this is that it is no less meaningful for us who never saw, heard or touched the Lord. With the details

> out of the way, we are able to focus on the bigger picture and see what the Lord had been preparing for thousands of years, even our salvation (Eph. 3:9). We were given no forms, images or descriptions so that we would not create idols or things to be reverenced (Deut. 4:15-16). As we read the words, "Do this in remembrance of Me," we are remembering a price that was paid. We are remembering a body

that was hung on a tree. We are remembering a covenant that was sealed in a more precious blood than that of bulls and goats. We are remembering the love of the Father that He demonstrates in the death of His only begotten Son.

These thoughts may not give us the sensation of remembering the Master's touch as He washed our feet, but our hearts are no less touched, moved by the profound act of love by the Creator. The Great I Am purchased us, made us His own, and at the table we remember the "Me" that made it possible.

Only loving parents discipline

"Mom, I thought you loved me!" "I do love you, sweetheart!" "Then, why did you spank me? If you loved me, you wouldn't spank me!" "I disciplined you because I love you! If I didn't love you, I wouldn't discipline you!"

How many parents have had a conversation like that? Discipline, to a child and some outsiders, seems so unfair and so unloving. But, "he who loves [his child] disciplines him promptly" (Prov. 13:24). The motivation of parental discipline is love. The goal of parental discipline is heaven, for prompt and proper discipline can "deliver his soul from hell" (Prov. 23:14).

Do you know that the discipline of God is for the very same reason? Some say, "If God is a loving God, why does He have such rigid rules? Why does He punish so harshly?" "For those whom the Lord loves He disciplines" (Heb. 12:6). The motivation of God's discipline is love. The goal of God's discipline is heaven. Let us respect Him and submit to Him (12:9)! - DS

Is it ever ok to be angry?

When Moses came off of Mount Sinai and caught sight of the golden calf, his "anger became hot" (Ex. 32:19). Was Moses wrong to be angry at Israel's idolatry? When Jesus came into the temple and caught sight of "those who were selling oxen and sheep and doves, and the money changers seated at their tables," "He made a scourge of cords, and drive them all

> out" (John 2:14-15). Was Jesus wrong to be angry at the materialistic use of God's house? When the hypocritical Pharisees, intent on destroying Jesus, refused to answer His simple question, He looked at them "with anger," because of the hardness of their hearts (Mark 3:5). Was Jesus wrong to be angry with their self-

centered, heart-hearted, evil-minded behavior?

Sin is wrong! There is nothing about sin that should put a Christian at ease! Sin separates a sinner from God, and its tentacles impact the lives of others! "God is angry with the wicked every day" (Psa. 7:11). Therefore, sin should make the Christian angry! The anger must not be an uncontrolled rage (Eph. 4:26), but a controlled righteous indignation toward evil is Christ-like. - DS
