The Prayer of an "Old Preacher"

We may not think of that shepherd boy as a preacher, but perhaps we should. When David arrived at the battlefront, almost every word he spoke proclaimed the power and majesty of God. His words give great insight into the heart that God described as being like His own heart. David's

older brother saw him as a youth who had abandoned the sheep and said David was filled with pride and was insolent in his heart (1 Sam. 7:28). But he was wrong. The truths David

That young man had seen the providence of God when he killed a bear and a lion who were ready to kill a helpless lamb. David knew God's nature and the challenge of Goliath had to be answered. He was not concerned about how big that giant was, for he knew how big God was!

As a youth he had also faced sin's temptation and dealt with it. He showed how a young man could cleanse his heart "by taking heed according to Your word" (Psa. 119:9). It was in the sheepfold that he learned of God's green pastures, still waters, the rod, the staff and the cup overflowing with oil.

Yet he was not always a young man. His words in Psalm 71:17-18 give us great insight into the devotion he had first as a youth and the devotion he had in his old age. Look at the words of that psalm.

"O God, You have taught me from my youth; And to this day I declare Your wondrous works."

David knew God from his youth and he had declared God's glory to others. He knew God and he unashamedly taught others about Him. What was he like as he grew old?

> "Now also when I am old and grayheaded, O God, do not forsake me, Until I declare Your strength to this generation, Your power to everyone who is to come."

David understood that the truths which he had used to cleanse his young heart were the same truths that following generations needed to cleanse their hearts. They needed them because God's words are eternal and truth does not change. David said, "The entirety of Your word is truth and every one of Your righteous judgments endures forever" (Psa.

119:160). He had taught those truths as a young man and now as he grew old he asked God to continue using him.

Read his words again. Every generation needed God's words, and David emphasized that that needed the entirety of His words-every single one of His righteous judgments. Mankind does not change. The needs of every generation are the same. God's remedy for sin does not change.

It was an older generation who taught young David. He owed them a great debt. The same is true of you!



"Christ Did Not Send Me to Baptize"

It is a favorite proof text of those who deny the Scriptural teaching of the essentiality of baptism for salvation. In First Corinthians 1:17, Paul affirmed, "For Christ did not send me to baptize ... " Some think this proves that baptism is not essential. The problem is that the passage actually proves

more than they want it to prove.

First, consider how Paul would condemn himself in this passage for doing what he said God sent him not to do. If he was not to baptize, then why would Paul state repeatedly in this passage, "I baptized...I had baptized...I also baptized...I baptized..." (1:14-16). Four times in this passage, Paul admits to baptizing and twice even names who he baptized. If he was not sent to baptize (as some want to stress), then he condemned himself by baptizing.

Paul was not given a different commission than the apostles were given in Mark 16:15. In that passage, Jesus commanded, "Go into all the world and preach the gospel." That is the preacher's primary duty. Baptizing people is the natural result of preaching the gospel, as the hearers make up their minds to obey that gospel and be baptized to be saved (v. 16). Paul was emphasizing his primary responsibility (i.e., "to preach the gospel," v. 17), which of necessity included the teaching (Acts 8:35-39) and the practice (Matt. 28:19) of baptism for the remission of sins (Acts 2:38).

Second, notice the contextual reason for why Paul was making these statements about baptism. The church in Corinth was being devastated by division, and Paul did not want to have contributed one iota to that division, lest a charge could be laid against him that he "had baptized in [his] own name" (v. 14). But, what would baptism have to do with that?

Various church members were claiming allegiance to different men, including Paul (by saying, "I am of Paul," v. 12). Paul identified two actions that would have been necessary for one to rightfully say, "I am of Paul." One, Paul needed to have been crucified for them. Two, they needed to have been baptized in the name of Paul. Then, and only then, could

one say, "I am of Paul." Therefore, by this line of argumentation, Paul equally proves how one can rightfully say, "I am of Christ." Christ must have been crucified for that person, and that person must be baptized in the name of Christ. Then, and only then, could one say, "I am of Christ."

This passage backfires on those who try to use it to prove that baptism is not essential to salvation. In fact, it proves the very doctrine they are fighting against-there is a direct connection between baptism and salvation from sin.

"Amazing Spiderman #537," Captain America quotes them to Spiderman with this addition, "Doesn't matter what the press says. Doesn't matter what the politicians or the mobs say. Doesn't matter if the whole country decides that something wrong is **fighting a war for** The beach head and the trench are in the hearts and something right. This nation was founded on one principle above all else: The requirement that we stand up for what we believe, no matter the odds or those around us. the consequences. When the mob and the press and

the whole world tell you to move, your job is to plant yourself like a tree beside the river of truth, and tell the whole world— 'No, you move.'" While these words are striving to convey the deeper meaning of what it means to be a true patriot, which we would expect from Captain America, they have a message that rings out to the heart of Christian conviction.

It seems today that being a patriot that is proud of his/her country's recent decisions has become increasingly difficult. Paul, a citizen of Rome, was not one to wave the Roman banner except when it would further the message of the gospel (Acts 16:37-40; 22:28). It is up to the individual to decide how they will be a patriot in the new Rome that we find ourselves in today. However, we as Christians understand that our citizenship is not of this world. We are citizens of the grand and eternal kingdom and heavenly city (John 18:36; Phil. 3:20; 2 Tim. 4:18; Heb. 11:16). That is why these words-"the requirement that we stand up for what we believe, no matter

the odds or the consequences" and "tell the whole world, 'No, you move'"-connect with us. As patriots of heaven, we are fighting a war for the souls of those around us, including our own (Eph. 6:10-17). minds of those walking around us. We can labor in confidence because the message is effective (Heb. 4:12; Isa. 55:11). We can labor in confidence because

He who promised is faithful (Heb. 10:23). We can labor in confidence knowing that our feet are planted by the river of truth. "But his delight is in the law of the Lord, And in His law he meditates day and night. He will be like a tree firmly planted by streams of water, Which yields its fruit in its season And its leaf does not wither; And in whatever he does, he prospers. The wicked are not so, But they are like chaff which the wind drives away" (Psa. 1:2-4). God has given us everything that pertains to life and godliness, even the power and conviction to say, "No, you move."



Who Wants to Be a Millionaire?

Here's a little piece of something profound for you. You are going to leave this world in exactly the same way you came into it. Job had it right when he said, "Naked I came from my mother's womb, and naked shall I return" (Job 1:21). We don't bring any money or big houses or fast cars when we are born into this world. Why do we think we'll be able to take them when we leave? Yet, the world we live in tells us, "That's what it's all about: getting money and living the good life."

But what does the Bible say about "getting money and living the good life"? God tells us this, "But if we have food and clothing, with these we will be content. But those who desire to be rich fall into temptation...For the love of money is the root of all kinds of evil..." (1 Tim. 6:8-10). If our goal is to get rich, God warns us that we're going to get ourselves into trouble. Is the money evil? No. The love for money and the desire to greedily obtain it is what gives root to the evil here.

We are to be content with what we have and humbly accept those things with which God blesses us. We ought not to rely on money or other possessions, but rather on God, who gives us those possessions for us to enjoy (1 Tim. 6:17). Instead of greedily hording earthly wealth for ourselves, we ought to see those dollar signs for what they really are: opportunities. Every ounce of money or wealth of any kind that God has blessed us with is a resource for us to use for His will.
