Losing the Joy of Salvation

Have you ever experienced that time in your life when you had done wrong and were so depressed that you were close to just giving up trying? You hated what you had done and were so disappointed in yourself? Embarrassment and shame for your actions had taken control of your life.

It was not always that way, for each of us have vivid

memories of other times when we felt so close to God. There was great joy. There was peace. There was thanksgiving. At such times, we could hardly imagine how life could get any better.

David had these same experiences. He had great joy when those tribes who did not support him to be king came to him pledging their loyalty to him. He then defeated the Philistines. He had captured

Jerusalem and moved the ark of the covenant to the holy city. His armies were defeating all nations around them. He had joy!

All of this began to change when he failed to lead his army in battle. David stayed home and, standing on the roof of his palace, and watched Bathsheba bathing. The events which followed this are well known—the "pleasure" of forbidden sin, the pregnancy, the attempt to deceive Bathsheba's husband, the death of that husband, the period of grieving for the dead husband and then the marriage. Then it happened!

"Thou art the man!" How these words must have shaken King David to the very core of his heart. The sin which he had so skillfully hidden from men was about to become known. It was to be recorded for all of mankind to know. He was the man-not the one whose purity of heart was like the heart of God, but one whose heart had "...despised the commandment of the Lord to do evil" (2 Sam. 12:9).

> The heading to Psalm 51 indicates that this psalm was likely written shortly after Nathan's words, "Thou art the man." He begged God to "...blot out my transgressions, wash me thoroughly from my sin...purge me...wash me...do not cast me away...deliver me" (Psa. 51:2-14). But perhaps the most meaningful words showing the nature of all sin are, "Restore to me the joy of Your salvation."

There is no joy worthy to be compared to the joy in our hearts the day we became Christians. I have seen this joy on the faces of hundreds who had just been baptized. Remember the day of your salvation and the joy you had. David had that same joy, but sin had snatched it from him. Is there any despair to be compared to that when we have wronged God?

Is there a way to restore that joy? Absolutely. This is why David asked God for its restoration. God longs for you to be in heaven. David sinned-we all do. David lost his joy-we all have. David's joy was restored—we too can regain that joy!



God's Continuous Plan for Man's Continuing Salvation

There is not a more important topic to understand (and to understand correctly) than one's salvation from sin. It is interesting how man has diverged into so many different ideas regarding salvation. Some of these diversions are deliberate; some are because of thoughtlessness.

One careless mentality among some is, "Once I get baptized, that's really all that matters. If I follow God's steps for salvation, which culminates in my baptism, then that's really the main thing I need to steps for salvado." While following God's plan that leads to one's immersion into Christ is essential for man's salvation, even after one's it does not end there. In fact, consider how each of God's steps for salvation continues on even after one's baptism.

Hearing is required for salvation and continues to be required for continuing salvation. One cannot be saved from his sins without hearing the gospel (Rom. 10:17; Acts 2:37; 4:4). However, even after being saved, one must continue to hear God's word to continue in God's salvation (Heb. 3:15; 5:11; 2 Tim. 2:15).

Believing is required for salvation and continues to be required for continuing salvation. One cannot be saved from his sins without believing the gospel (1 Cor. 15:1-4; Acts 16:31; John 3:16). However, even after being saved, one must continue to believe God's word to continue in God's salvation (Col. 1:23; 1 John 5:13; John 20:31; Rev. 2:10).

Repenting is required for salvation and continues to be required for continuing salvation. One cannot be saved from his sins without repenting of his sins (Acts 2:38; 3:19; 11:18; 17:30). However, even after being saved, one must continue to repent of sins that he commits to continue in

God's salvation (Acts 8:22; 2 Cor. 7:9-10; 12:21; Rev. Each of God's 2:5; 16; 3:3, 19).

Confessing faith is required for salvation tion continues on and continues to be required for continuing salvation. One cannot be saved from his sins without confessing his faith in Jesus (Matt. 10:32; Rom. 10:9; Phil. 2:11). However, even after being saved, one must continue to confess his faith in Jesus to contin-

ue in God's salvation (Rom. 10:10; 1 John 4:2, 15; Heb. 4:14).

Being washed in His blood is required for salvation and continues to be required for continuing salvation. One cannot be saved from his sins without being washed in the blood of Jesus through baptism (Acts 22:16; 2:38; Rom. 6:3-4; 1 Cor. 6:11; John 3:5). However, even after being saved, one must continue to be washed in the blood of Jesus through faithful living and confession of sins to God (1 John 1:7, 9; 2:2; Heb. 9:14).

The Christian Race

This is not a race that your Fitbit can track but rather something you are born into. When anyone brings up the topic of race, we tend to compare what is said with our preconceived ideas about race. What if some of those ideas are wrong?

It wouldn't be the first time someone has been wrong about the race concept. Since the 1600's, peo-

ple have been writing about the biological differences in the human races. Currently science has been able to dive into the genetic mapping of human DNA to determine if racial differences are supported by our genetics. The question is, is there enough of a difference in our DNA to show that there are various races of that you are born humans?

According to an article published in the New York Times by Natalie Angier, "Do Races differ? Not

Really Genes show," she quotes Dr. J. Craig Venter, head of the Celera Genomics Corporation in Rockville, Maryland as saying, "If you ask what percentage of your genes is reflected in your external appearance, the basis by which we talk about race, the answer seems to be in the range of .01 percent." To put this in perspective, if you printed each letter of your genome 1mm apart it would be 1,864 miles long. That is the distance from New York to Brazil. Only 1/100 of a percent, or 1,003 feet, of that genome code is different from cultural group to cultural group. Genetically, we are one human race.

There are not enough differences to categorize people into biological racial groups. People have been categorized by ethnic groups but that has to do with common location, culture and ancestral background. All the exterior things. We have come to use race and ethnicity interchangeably. Our differences come in how we think, interact and perceive the world around us.

God has given us guidelines that, if properly executed, can take the diversity of many ethnic groups and unite them. I

am not talking about changing languages or giving up cultural customs, necessarily. I am talking about changing the value system and fundamental thinking about life. Ethnic, cast and gender division has always been a problem for mankind. We as a people are quick to focus on the outside appearances to form judgments about people (1 Sam 16:7).

In the church, the kingdom of God (Col. 4:11),

there is no race or ethnicity. "There is neither Jew nor Greek, there is neither slave nor free man, there is neither male nor female; for you are all one in Christ Jesus" (Gal. 3:28). This is a group that has a culture unto itself, because no matter where you find it or what language is spoken, the same basic values, beliefs and heart of compassion are found there. It is never about what you look like but Who you look like. The Christian race is a race that you are born into (1 Pet. 1:3) and it is measured by the word of God. There you will find the collective goal of reaching the heavenly city as a chosen race (1 Pet. 2:9; Heb. 11:16; 12:22).




