Have You Stolen Heaven's Incense?

Is there anything more touching than the following story? She sits alone in one of the finest houses to be found. Her husband is dead. He had been so successful and provided for her and her needs after his death. Her phone is by her side, but it rarely rings. Her children never call. She would give

anything to hear from them. She sits there waiting, but it never rings. Is there a scene more tragic? Consider the following spiritual parallel to this situation of loneliness. When incense

The God of heaven and earth sits in heaven waiting to hear from His children. He would give anything to just hear from them. He knows they have needs, even though they may not realize it. He is ready to help, but they do not call. He made an amazing promise to them, "If we know that He hears

us, whatever we ask, we know we have the petitions that we ask of Him" (1 John 5:15). Yet, they do not call. Beloved in Christ, is God's heart heavy because you do not call?

There is an amazing picture in the figurative language of the book of Revelation. God sits on His throne. When the Lamb of God comes before our awesome God, heaven explodes with worship of the Lamb. There are those twenty-four elders who have harps in their hands, but they also have bowls filled with incense. Immediately, heaven is filled with the aroma of that incense as the elders fall down before the Lamb, and golden bowls filled with incense become part of the heavenly joy and adoration of Jesus (Rev. 5:8-9).

That incense is mentioned again in this book. In chapter six, the saints of God are calling out to God to respond and bring His judgment on those who are persecuting the church. They are told God will respond very soon. In chapter eight, He does. An angel comes to God with incense in a censer. He adds

> fire from heaven's altar, and the wrath of God is poured out on the earth. The saints of God have called out for God to act, and He responded.

What does that have to do with the church? Take a look at God's description of that heavenly incense of the praise of Jesus. Look at what is part of did this happen? the incense which caused God to come to the rescue of those suffering saints. The bowls in the hands of

> the elders are full of incense. The Bible tells us exactly what the incense is—it is "....the prayers of the saints" (Rev. 5:8).

> What does that have to do with you individually? Imagine those elders about to praise the Lord, and there is no incense because you are not praying! Our lack of praying to heaven robs it of the praise that is around the throne.

> God sits in heaven longing for you to call out to Him. He sits there awaiting your incense to fill heaven with its aroma, but there is none! Is there anything more tragic?



Your "First" Priority on Election Day

Election times are always interesting events to observe, for one can see a side of the candidates and the citizens that is often not seen. (This is true for all elections at all levels—federal, state, local, municipal, etc.). Interestingly, there is also an unusual side of Christians that is seen during election times.

Does the Bible have anything to say about Christians

and elections? Or should one's politics be kept completely separate from his religion? And vice versa? It is beyond amazing that any Christian would think that there is ANY part of his life that should be kept separate from his faith.

As election seasons roll around and as you consider how you vote (in national, state and local races and referenda), may I suggest to you that God

has given us a filter through which to pass every decision we make. The filter that God has provided helps me to see that there are matters much larger than my personal preferences, my personal rights or my personal freedoms. How often do we vote for someone because of what they can do "FOR ME" or because of what they have promised "TO ME"? God's filter supersedes how something might benefit me personally! What are the most important issues this election season? It's not the economy, foreign policy, healthcare or education!

May I suggest to you that the filter which God has given to us through which to pass our every decision is a filter that forces us to place our focus on something much more important, valuable and eternally significant than our personal preferences or rights. Please examine this filter with me and see if it relates to your choices during any election season. "Seek first the kingdom of God and His righteousness" (Matt. 6:33). This is the "first" filter through which every decision we

make (including in the voting booth) must be passed.

No election and no candidate will ever be perfect. Unless Jesus is on the ballot or I am on the ballot, I will never fully agree with any of my options. But, here's the question: How can I use my vote for the good of the church/kingdom and God's righteousness? How can I use my vote to protect the church and to ensure the gospel has free course?

The church and righteousness are being attacked by all parts of our nation and in every "house" in Washington (the White House, Capital House and Court House), and it is only going to get worse. How can I use my vote-not to make a political statement—but to guard the most precious institution of all?

When you, as a Christian, cast your ballot, remember that your "first" focus is not on you or on your rights. You are voting for the Lord's church and what is right for her! Make this count (realistically)...for Him and His cause on this earth!

This study provided five suggestions to raising kinder children. 1. Make caring for others a priority, and balance it with other healthy needs. 2. Provide opportunities for them to practice being kind. 3. Extend your child's circle of concern beyond your immediate family. 4. Be a strong model and mentor by modeling ethical values. 5. Guide children in managing destructive feelings like anger, envy and jealousy.

While these are good practical suggestions, listen to what the Bible says about kindness. "Be kind from a heart that to one another, tender-hearted, forgiving each other, just as God in Christ also has forgiven you" (Eph. 4:32). "But love your enemies, and do good, and have compassion lend, expecting nothing in return; and your reward will be great, and you will be sons of the Most High; for He Himself is kind to ungrateful and evil

men" (Luke 6:35). "So, as those who have been chosen of God, holy and beloved, put on a heart of compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness and patience" (Col. 3:12). "The merciful man does himself good, But the cruel man does himself harm" (Prov. 11:17).

Kindness comes from a heart that has learned to have compassion for others. President Lincoln demonstrated this in his famous Lincoln Letters. His stark contrast to our current options only highlight the extreme need of kindness.
