Sobering Thoughts as You Begin Worship

The book of Psalms gives us such great insight into the deep emotions felt by David. It allows us to see how his soul felt when he walked through the valley of the shadow of death. It helps us to vividly see what he thought about as he stared into the firmament and the heavens and saw God’s glory. Have you ever considered what was in the heart of this godly man as he worshiped? Psalm 103 gives at least eighteen reasons he approached God with a heart filled with awe and reverence.

The psalm begins with the words, “Bless the Lord, O my soul.” The Hebrew word for bless literally means to kneel, and when applied to us and our God, it specifically indicates an act of adoration toward Him. David came before God with his soul kneeling toward the Almighty. If you asked David why he worshiped God, he could give you the following reasons.

Reasons to Kneel Before God

1. He forgives all my iniquities and heals me (v. 3).
2. He redeems my life from destruction (v. 4).
3. He crowns me with lovingkindness and mercy (v. 4).
4. He satisfies my mouth with good things (v. 5).
5. He renews me (v. 5).
6. He executes righteousness and justice for all (v. 6).

If you asked David why he worshiped God, he could give you so many reasons

7. He made known His ways and actions (v. 7).
8. He is merciful and gracious to me (v. 8).
9. He is slow to anger and abounding in mercy to me (v. 8).
10. He does not strive always with me or stay angry (v. 9).
11. He does not deal with me according to my sins (v. 10).
12. He does not punish me according to my iniquities (v. 10).
13. His mercy is great toward me (v. 11).
14. He has removed my transgressions from me as far as the east is from the west (v. 12).
15. He shows His compassion and pity to me like a loving father shows pity to his children (v. 13).
16. He knows my frame and remembers that I am dust (v. 14).
17. Man is like grass, the flower of the field, wind blows and it is gone and forgotten, but His mercy toward me is from everlasting to everlasting (v. 16).
18. His righteousness reaches me and even to my grandchildren (v. 17).

As the psalm ends, David calls upon all the angels to bless Him, to kneel as an act of adoration toward God. He calls upon all the armies of heaven and the heavenly servants to bless Jehovah. He looks at all that God has done and calls upon all His works which manifest His power to bless him. The man after God’s own heart then turns inward and calls upon himself to kneel before God. In doing this, he calls upon you. “Bless the Lord, O my soul!”

“Does Your Church?” (Part 1)—The Authority of the Bible

Do you “go to church”? Do you have a “church home”? Do you have a church that you would call “my church”? If you do, there are some vital matters that every “church goer” needs to consider.

When one picks up the Bible and reads through the New Testament, a careful Bible student will find a very precise plan and pattern for something the Bible describes as “the church.” It is readily apparent to Bible readers that the church was purposed (Eph. 3:10-11), prophesied (Isa. 2:2-4; Dan. 2:44), promised (Matt. 16:18), purchased (Acts 20:28), established (Acts 2:1-47; Col. 1:13) and directed (1 Tim. 3:15; 1 Cor. 14:37) by the God of heaven! Therefore, to whom should we turn to know all that we need to know about this “church” but to God Himself? And, where else would we go than to the Bible—God’s inspired Word, revealing to us the full will of God in all matters, including the church (2 Tim. 3:16-17; 1 Cor. 2:10-14)?

The design of this series of articles is for each of us to examine “our church.” Jesus established **His** church in the New Testament. It was the only church in existence on the day of its establishment in Acts 2, and it was the only church known, addressed and approved in the pages of the New Testament. Truly, “there is one body” (church) (Eph. 4:4; 1:22-23).

The New Testament church respected the authority of the Bible!

Therefore, it is of eternal importance that each “church goer” honestly examine “his church” and be absolutely certain that it is the church of the Bible—the only one that belongs to Jesus.

Here’s the first examination. The church of the New Testament had instilled within them a deep respect for the authority of God’s Word. The teaching of the apostles and God’s inspired men was not viewed as something “cute” or “fascinating” or “a good approach.” The doctrine of Christ was absolutely essential (2 John 9-11). The church was taught not to “add to” or “take from” God’s inspired word (Rev. 22:18-19). The first-century church was warned to not tolerate anyone who would preach “any other gospel” than what had been preached by inspired men (Gal. 1:8-9). The early church could not think beyond (1 Cor. 4:6), speak beyond (1 Pet. 4:11) or act beyond (1 Cor. 1:10) that which was written.

New Testament Christians understood that each person would stand before Christ on the day of judgment (2 Cor. 5:10), and it would be His Word that would be the standard of judgment on that day (John 12:48). The church was plainly instructed that their very entrance into heaven was dependent upon their obedience to the will of God in His Word (Matt. 7:21-23).

The New Testament church respected the authority of the Bible and would not dare teach any other doctrine than what the Bible teaches (1 Tim. 1:3). Does your church?

It Pays to Serve

“Your words have been arrogant against Me,” says the LORD. ‘Yet you say, “What have we spoken against You?” You have said, “It is vain to serve God; and what profit is it that we have kept His charge, and that we have walked in mourning before the LORD of hosts?”’ (Mal. 3:13-14).

It is a definite fact that we are obligated (and privileged) to serve God. The Lord stressed, “For it is written, ‘YOU SHALL WORSHIP THE LORD YOUR GOD, AND SERVE HIM ONLY’” (Matt. 4:10). Because of the great sacrifice of the Christ Himself, we are in a position to effectively “serve the living God” (Heb. 9:14). The apostle Paul often referred to himself as being a “servant of Jesus Christ” (Rom. 1:1, 9). We must also strive to imitate Paul (Phil. 3:17) as he followed Christ.

In connection with serving God, the question is often asked, “Does it pay? Is it worthwhile?” In the days of Malachi, the wicked said: (1) “It is vain to serve God.” (2) “What profit is it that we have kept His ordinances?” (3) “What profit is it that we have walked mournfully before the Lord?” Is it possible that we could be guilty of the same thing?

I don’t think we say these words, but we are quick to evaluate what we invest our time and efforts into. We may

think things like: “Is it worth it to get up on a Sunday morning and worship?” Or “I don’t think I get much out of the lessons and Bible classes.” Or “It doesn’t pay to practice my faith, no one else does, and they are doing fine.” We cannot afford to be so short-sighted. We are falling into the same lies that Satan spun with Eve all those many years ago. Another aspect is that we are consumers. If we are not careful, we could change our faith into a consumer faith. “What’s in it for me?” “What is the pay off?” We must remember that what we are promised is long term.

What will you do to show your obedience to the Father this week?

The prophet Malachi emphasized, “It does pay to serve God!” He stressed: (1) That God delights in the fellowship of His people; (2) That God hears and hearkens to His people; (3) That God has before Him a “book of remembrance” for those who fear Him; (4) That in the day when God makes up His jewels, He will spare those who have loved Him and served Him (Mal. 3:16-18). In serving God, there are wonderful blessings both now and in the hereafter.

The reward lies before us. That is why He went to prepare a place. The reward of service can only be reaped when the service is done. As long as it is still called today, we must serve with obedience. He is the Creator of all living things. Does He not deserve our service? What will you do to show your obedience to the Father this week?

Jesus had to pass through Samaria. Don’t you?

When Jesus left Jerusalem following the Passover (John 2:23) and headed back to the more fertile soil of souls in Galilee (John 4:3), the Bible records that Jesus “needed to go through Samaria” (4:4), or that He “had to pass through Samaria” (NASB). For us, that may not sound unusual, but for a Jew, that was highly unusual, for no Jew ever “had to pass through Samaria.” In fact, many Jews traveled on the east side of the Jordan to avoid Samaritans altogether. But, Jesus knew there was a woman there who would hear and a whole city ready to believe. Jesus was not going to avoid lost and searching souls because of some long-held prejudice.

When the story of your life is recorded, will there be a sentence written that said you had to pass by a certain person? It may not sound unusual to some, but perhaps there would be other readers (who knew your situation) who would think, “No way! He/She didn’t have to go that way! There must have been some compelling reason!” There are lost and searching souls who need the gospel! We must put aside every prejudice and “pass through Samaria”! – DS

Turning a curse into a blessing

If there was ever anyone who was absolutely fixed on cursing the people of God, it was Balaam in Numbers 22-24. In an effort to satisfy his materialistic heart and receive a reward from the king of Moab, Balaam attempted three times to pronounce a curse upon Israel, but every single time Balaam ended up blessing the people instead. Why? What happened?



“Nevertheless the Lord your God would not listen to Balaam, but the Lord your God turned the curse into a blessing for you, because the Lord your God loves you” (Deut. 23:5).

How often do you think God does that for you? If God turned a potential curse into a blessing for His people more than 3,000 years ago, how often do you think He is taking a curse today and turning it into a blessing for you? There is no way for us to know the answer to that question, but here is something in which we can absolute confidence—“the Lord your God loves you!” Do you believe that? 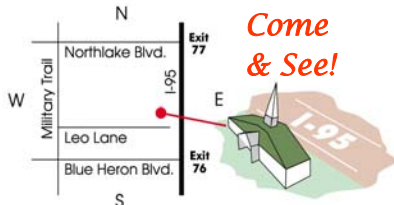
