Let Me Be a Peg

There are verses in the Bible which seem so strange to us because we do not understand the culture when they were written. For example, Peter going “up on the housetop to pray” (Acts 10:9) seems so strange until we learn that the roofs of the houses were flat and a vital part of the lives of people in the first century. The same is true when we read about “pegs” in the house of those in Bible times.

In Isaiah 22, we read of two men who are described by God as being “pegs.” What possible meaning could this have? To understand this, consider that many of the homes and buildings in ancient times had nothing like we have, when we use closets and cabinets to store our possessions. Their possessions were placed on pieces of wood embedded in the walls of buildings as they were built. Clothing was not strewn on the floor (like we find in some rooms of teenagers today) but were hung on these pegs. Ezekiel 15:3 shows that these pegs were used as a place to hang vessels. They were a vital part of the lives of the Jews but could seem so insignificant and be easily undervalued.

There was an important person named Shebna in the kingdom of King Hezekiah (he is called a steward, a treasurer), who was so evil that God sent Isaiah to deliver a personal re-

buke for the evil he had done. He had an important place, but he had failed to fulfill his responsibility. God said of him, “The peg that is fastened in the secure place will be removed and cut down and fall, and the burden that was on it will be cut off” (Isa. 22:25). The peg had failed to fulfill his purpose.

Isaiah then described the godly man who was to replace Shebna. God said He would clothe this man, Eliakim, with the robe which had belonged to Shebna and give him great authority. “The key of the house of David I will lay on his shoulder; so he shall open, and no one shall shut; and he shall shut, and no one shall open” (22:22). Then, he added, “I will fasten him as a peg in a secure place, and he will become a glorious throne to his father’s house.”

What can we learn from this imagery? Far too many think that unless the service they render to God is visible and appears important, then there is little they can do for God. Nothing can be farther from the truth. There were important men in that day—the great prophet Isaiah and the godly king, Hezekiah—yet God looked at “pegs” and saw how important their “insignificant” roles were in the big picture.

The world may think that only those who are decorated “pillars and columns” are important. It is wrong. God sees the worth of “pegs.” God help us to be His “pegs.”

We are so wrong if we think that only those who are “important” matter...

“Does Your Church?” (Part 6)—The Lord’s Supper on His Day

On the night before Jesus was crucified, He gathered with His disciples and instituted what the early church called “the Lord’s Supper” (1 Cor. 11:20) or “the communion” (1 Cor. 10:16). This is the most sacred of all feasts, for it commemorates the “body” and the “blood” of Jesus, which He willingly sacrificed on the cross for our sins (Matt. 26:26-28).

Is this feast supposed to still be practiced by the church today? If so, when? How often? To what end? “Christendom” is not in agreement on the answers to those questions, as evidenced by the diversity of practice among various groups. But, what does the Bible say? Since the Bible is our sole authority in all religious matters, what instruction does it provide for us to follow today?

The early church assembled on the first day of the week. The first day of the week held great significance to early Christians. It was the day on which Jesus was raised from the dead (Mark 16:9), the day that Jesus met with His disciples (John 20:19, 26), and the day that the church was established with the coming of the Holy Spirit and the preaching of the gospel (Acts 2). Paul tarried in Troas for seven days, so that he could meet with the church when they assembled “on the first day of the week” (Acts 20:6-7). This was their *practice*.

The Lord’s Supper was a central purpose of the first-day-of-the-week assembly. Acts 20:7 teaches, “Now on the first day of the week, when the disciples came together to break bread...” “To break bread” is an infinitive of purpose, indicating their reason for gathering. When Paul wrote to the church at Corinth, he rebuked them for straying from this purpose—“When you come together in one place, it is not to eat the Lord’s Supper” (1 Cor. 11:20). This was their *purpose*.

The early church observed the Lord’s Supper every first day of the week. Knowing that it was a central purpose of their first-day-of-the-week assembly reveals that they observed it every Sunday, for every week has a first day. When the church began, “they continued steadfastly...in the breaking of bread” (Acts 2:42). There was a regular pattern to their observance, for Paul said, “For as often as you eat this bread and drink this cup...” (1 Cor. 11:26).

The Bible teaches: (1) The early church gathered every first day of the week (1 Cor. 16:1-2). (2) A central purpose of that gathering was the Lord’s Supper (Acts 20:7; 1 Cor. 11:20). (3) Therefore, the early church observed the Lord’s Supper every first day of the week. This was their *pattern*. And, this pattern was to continue “until He comes” (1 Cor. 11:26).

The church of Christ observes the *Lord’s Supper* every Sunday (“the *Lord’s Day*,” Rev. 1:10). Does your church?

“But there was no voice and no one answered”

Have you ever cried out for someone, and there was no answer? In that moment when you needed them most, they were nowhere to be found. Anxiety, despair and the feeling of misplaced trust wash over you as you continue your fruitless efforts of communication with the one who was supposed to help.

A similar display took place on Mt. Carmel in 1 Kings chapter eighteen. Elijah had thrown down the gauntlet, and there was to be a duel. Whose god would answer the call? The false prophets of Baal and Asherah went first as they prepared the ox and waited for their god to respond with fire. “They called on the name of Baal from morning until noon saying, ‘O Baal, answer us.’ But there was no voice and no one answered” (18:26). They began to leap about, dance, rave and cut themselves trying to solicit a response from a god that they trusted. The text tells us, “but there was no voice, no one answered, and no one paid attention” (18:29). It was evident to those prophets that their god was no god and would never respond to their pleas.

In stark contrast, Elijah prepared the altar and the sacrifice and drenched it in water. So much so that there was a trench of water around the altar. After a prayer that didn’t last

one minute, fire came down and consumed not only the sacrifice but the water and the rocks also. It was clear that Someone was listening and that Someone was paying attention.

That same Someone continues to hear today. How important is it to you that someone listens? The Bible has many passages that provide us with the confidence that God is listening. In the days of the prophet Malachi, there were many who were unfaithful to God, but “then those who feared the

LORD spoke to one another, and the LORD gave attention and heard it...” (3:16). The Psalmist wrote, “The LORD is near to all who call upon Him, to all who call upon Him in truth” (Psa. 145:18); “He has regarded the prayer of the destitute and has not despised their prayer” (Psa. 102:17); “The eyes of the LORD are toward the righteous and His ears are open to their cry” (Psa. 34:15). In Proverbs, “The LORD is

far from the wicked, But He hears the prayer of the righteous” (15:29). Jesus said, “If you then, being evil, know how to give good gifts to your children, how much more will your Father who is in heaven give what is good to those who ask Him” (Matt. 7:11). Please continue to be fervent in prayer. God is listening. God sees the struggle and the joys of your life. We serve a living God who cares about His creation. Be assured that when you approach His throne, He is listening. “This is the confidence which we have before Him, that, if we ask anything according to His will, He hears us” (1 John 5:14).

Clothed with humility

Do you have some clothes that...well...just don’t fit like they once did? Sometimes clothes just don’t fit right anymore. Have you ever borrowed someone else’s shoes and realized how very different feet are? Sometimes certain clothes fit other people better than they fit us.

There is a piece of “clothing” that God tells every Christian, with urgency, to put on. It is a “one-size-fits-all” garment, but it requires a conscious effort to put it on and to keep it on.

The Lord instructs us, “All of you, clothe yourselves with humility toward one another” (1 Pet. 5:5). The word comes from the Greek word for “knot,” and came to refer to a slave who tied on an apron. When others look at you, do they see someone who has tied on a spirit of humility and is ready to serve the needs of others? Or do they see someone who is all wrapped up in a silk blanket of self and pride? When you get up every morning, don’t get out of bed and for sure don’t leave the house without clothing yourself...with humility! God wants it to fit you! – DS



Being satisfied—is that a good thing?

Are you satisfied? Are you satisfied with where you are in life? Are you satisfied with your relationship with God? And, if you are satisfied, is that good thing? Or is that a bag thing? Be careful how you answer.

Proverbs 14:14 states, “The backslider in heart will be filled with his own ways.” What does that mean? A heart that is inclined to drift away from God and fall back into his old ways will be fully satisfied with that and will “be filled with the fruit of his ways.” He won’t think anything is wrong.

But one who has changed his heart and is no longer interested in those old ways (called “a good man” in the second part of this verse) “will be satisfied from above” or “from above himself” or “with the fruit of his ways.” He has adjusted his heart to find satisfaction in heavenly things.

What brings you satisfaction? Is your satisfaction from your wants or from heaven’s? – DS

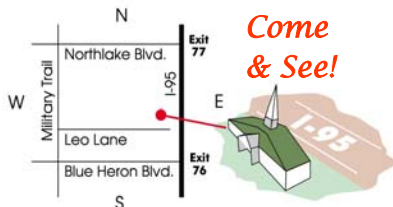
