## **Every Letter in Every Word in Every Verse**

Understanding the nature of inspiration will open doors to deeper understanding as you study the Bible. Consider that when Moses brought the tablets of stone down from Mount Sanai there were no misspelled words on those stones. Every word was chosen by God. Every single letter of every word

had been chosen and written by the hand of God.

Jesus believed in the importance of just one word. The Sadducees asked Jesus about the problem that the resurrection presented regarding the woman who had been married seven times. He answered them, "You are wrong, because you know neither the Scriptures nor the power of God" (Matt. 22:29, ESV). He emphasized one word spoken at the burning bush and said that because God said, "I am the God of Abraham," instead of "I was the God of Al

the God of Abraham," instead of "I was the God of Abraham," you could prove the resurrection. Just one word. Look at the following examples of the importance of just one word.

The importance of the word "your." For years, many have struggled with Paul's instruction that a woman was not to speak in the assembly, and that if she wanted to ask a question, she was to wait and ask her husband at home. Many asked, "What about all those women who do not have a husband. Who are they to ask?" Just one word settles it. Look at

the context. Paul had been giving instructions regarding the behavior of the prophets (1 Cor. 14:29-33). He then said, "Let your women keep silent in the churches." What women? Your women—the wives of the prophets. It was the prophet's wife who was most likely to interrupt the prophet's message in that assembly. He specifically addressed those wives of the prophets. Could other women speak in the assembly? Absolutely not. He addresses all women in the next verse saying, "It is a shame for women to speak in the church."

Read your Bible.

Look at every word and this will open doors k of understanding

To presume the

Lord has spoken

does not mean

He has!

The importance of the word "this." Many have overlooked the word "this" in Matthew 24:14. One of the signs given about events before the destruction of Jerusalem was that "...this gospel of the kingdom will be preached in all the world" as the final sign the city was about to be destroyed. Look carefully at what He said. It was not just that the gos-

pel would be preached. It was that this gospel—the good news of the kingdom that God had overthrown Judaism and its temple, and the Gentiles could have common access to God. They preached far more than His death, His burial and His resurrection. They preached the fact that all men, Jews and Gentiles, could come to God. Now that is great news!

Read your Bible and look at every word in every verse. It will open many doors of deeper understanding. Every letter of every word has been chosen by God!

## "The Lord Laid It on My Heart"

It is an expression frequently heard on religious television and radio. All too often the man who is doing the preaching will say something like, "I want you to share with you something that the Lord laid on my heart." Of course, it is not just televangelists who say this. It is a common saying among

many religious folks. I don't want to call anyone's sincerity into question, but how should we understand a statement like that? How can we know if the Lord really did lay something on a person's heart? Is it possible the Lord may lay something on my heart? Is it a legitimate thing for people to say or claim?

First Kings 13 tells of a man of God who faithfully spoke "the word of the Lord" and was careful not to violate what the Lord had "commanded"

him (13:2, 7-10). But an old prophet came and spoke something different than what the Lord had told the younger prophet. And it was pretty convincing. "I too am a prophet as you are, and an angel spoke to me by the word of the Lord, saying..." (13:18). The words of the old prophet sounded good, and he said that an angel of the Lord told him. But the rest of the verse says that he "was lying." A man made a claim that was not true, but the younger prophet did not know it. The Lord had not laid anything on that old prophet's heart, particularly something that violated His own commands.

In another passage, the Lord spoke through Moses about "the prophet who presumes to speak a word in My name" (Deut. 18:20). Such a prophet would come forth and likely say things like, "The Lord told me that such and such was going to happen," or "I am coming to you in the name of the Lord," or even, "The Lord laid this on my heart to share with you." That prophet may sincerely believe that what he is saying is really "from the Lord," and he may convince others that

his message really is from the Lord. But, is it? To presume the Lord has spoken does not mean He has!

How can I know the will of God? First, I need to realize that God's revelation has been "once for all delivered" (Jude 3), which means no further revelation will be made. Second, I need to accept that God's revealed will in His Word is complete and all-sufficient (2 Tim. 3:16-17), supplying me with eve-

rything I need to live and to serve God (2 Pet. 1:3). Third, I need to admit that if I believe God laid something on my heart, then someone else has an equal right to claim that God has laid the complete opposite on his heart, and who is to say who is "right" and who is "wrong"? That's why God's Word is the perfect, complete and final standard in all things (John 12:48).

David said, "Thy word have I hidden in my heart" (Psa. 119:11). That's how God lays something on our hearts today—when we read it, meditate upon it and write it on our hearts!

Jesus was on His way up to Jerusalem. His path took Him between Galilee and Samaria. This latter place was considered worthless by many, as its inhabitants were mingled half-breed sons of Abraham. As Jesus and His disciples approached yet another small village, there was a group of ten lepers

standing at a distance. They did that—stood at a distance. It

was a habit, as they were shunned by society as "unclean" and "untouchable," as the law commanded (Num. 5:2). There was no cure for what they had, but they had heard about this Jesus who was approaching. So they cry out to Him, "Jesus, Master, have mercy on us!" (Luke 17:13). Jesus turns to them and says, "Go and show yourselves to the priests" (17:14). He had not cleansed them in that moment. Jesus had sent them to the priest as there

were certain rituals that must be obeyed in order to be made clean (Lev. 14:1-9). As the ten went toward where they were to meet the priest, they were cleansed. Before even reaching their destination they were healed. Upon seeing this, one of them turned back and shouted with a loud voice and glorified God. He fell on his face before the feet of Jesus and thanked Him. "Then Jesus answered and said, 'Were there not ten cleansed? But the nine—where are they? Was no one found who returned to give glory to God, except this foreigner?' And

He said to him, 'Stand up and go; your faith has made you well'" (Luke 17:17-19). What had this foreigner, a Samaritan, done that the other nine had not? He showed gratitude.

When Jesus asked, "Where are the nine?" He was essentially saying that all should have been grateful for what He had done and the blessing they had received from God. Shouldn't we have cause to be the most thankful? Not because we've been cleansed of a physical uncleanness but cleansed of

a spiritual death from which there is no cure without the grace of God and the death of His Son.

The Bible speaks of gratitude toward God. "Let them give thanks to the LORD for His lovingkindness, And for His wonders to the sons of men! For He has satisfied the thirsty soul, And the hungry soul He has filled with what is good" (Psa. 107:8-9). "Be thankful... singing with thankfulness in your hearts to

God. Whatever you do in word or deed, do all in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks through Him to God the Father" (Col. 3:15-17). "In everything give thanks; for this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus" (1Thess. 5:18).

Thinking of all the things that God has given us, we must be careful to remember to stop, bow and give thanks as the Samaritan did. We should not be counted among the nine in our worship and service to God as those are also ways of showing gratitude for all that He has done for us.

## "Spread it before the Lord!"

Sennacherib, king of Assyria, sent a threatening letter to Hezekiah, king of Judah, which basically said, "Don't believe God! He won't save you! We are going to destroy you! Look at how we have utterly destroyed everyone else in our path!" (Isa. 37:8-13).

Remember—"you have not, because you ask not" (Jas. 4:2)! — DS


