An Overview of God's Eternal Plan

What phrases

would you

choose to sum

up God and His

will for us?

Are you aware

that Jesus got

married?

Yes, He

As strange as it may seem, the eternal plan that God has had for this world can be summed up in just a few short statements. Just suppose that you were asked to give an overview of this plan, what phrases or words would you choose? With this in mind, let me suggest four eternal truths

about God's plan. Here's my list. How would you briefly express the truths all mankind needs to know?

God has spoken. The fact Jehovah has spoken affirms that He exists. If He is truly the Supreme One, He must have existed eternally. His Deity and His power can be known to all mankind, for in every language on earth the heavens proclaim His glory (Rom. 1:20; Psa. 19:1-2). God is and God has spoken.

Throughout history God has spoken in many ways. For many centuries, He spoke through the prophets, but at the end, He has spoken through Jesus and His prophets. When God's revelation was completed, He left us the Bible which completely furnishes us (Heb. 1:1-2; 2 Tim. 3:16-17).

Jesus of Nazareth is the Christ, the Son of the living God. When the Man of Galilee lived on this earth, some did not fully understand who He was. But He is in truth "....the Christ the Son of the living God." God confirmed His claims by "...miracles and wonders and signs." These signs are recorded

so that we might believe Emmanuel came. This faith empowers us to become God's children." (Matt. 16:16; Acts 2:22; John 20:30-31; John 1:12).

God's plan resulted in all men enjoying His promises in the establishment of the one body, the church. He did not immediately reveal His plan for our redemption. It existed before the world began but was fully revealed through Jesus' apostles and prophets. The plan was "...the Gentiles should be

fellow heirs, of the same body and partakers of His promise in Christ through the gospel" (Rom. 16:25-26; Eph. 3:3-6). The steps of faith to enter that church are clearly revealed and easily understood.

We must all appear before God to give an account of how we have lived. At the end, Jesus will return, and all men who have ever lived will stand before the great white throne to be judged by how

they have lived. There will be a separation made between those who have followed God's teachings as they are recorded in the books of the Bible and those who have not sought His will. Some will hear the words "Come, you blessed of My Father," and others will hear, "Depart from Me." Eternal justice will be meted out (2 Cor. 5:10; Acts 17:30-31; Matt. 25:34, 41; John 5:28-29; John 12:48. Rev. 20:11-15).

It is not enough to know the truths just mentioned. What matters is how you are responding to them!

Men, Why Did You Say, "I Do"?

"Sir, why did you get married?" Was it "to have sex" or "to have someone to cook and clean for me" or "to have someone to do my laundry" or "to consolidate bills" or "to have more money by combining incomes" or "to be happy and settle down"? Was there any reason beyond you and your own desires

for getting married?

If you are already married, please take time to consider the following and examine where you should make appropriate changes in your marriage. If you are not married but plan on being married one day, please take time to evaluate where you should be when that happens.

Since Jesus is our perfect example in all things, are you aware that Jesus got married? Yes, He certainly did. The Bible refers to the church as "the bride" of Christ (Rev. 21:2; 22:17). So, as husbands, let us look to Jesus for why we should marry and how we should behave once we're married.

Jesus married because He "loved the church" (Eph. 5:25). This unconditional, unselfish love seeks what is best for the one loved. Jesus did not marry for selfish reasons.

Jesus married when He "gave Himself for her" (Eph. 5:25). His sacrificial love prompted Him to give "Himself for us,

an offering and a sacrifice to God" (5:2). Jesus gave (and continues to give) His all in order to marry His bride.

Jesus married "that He might sanctify" her (Eph. 5:26). He wanted His bride set apart unto Himself and to Him alone. She belongs to Him and no one else.

Jesus married the church, in order that He might "nourish and cherish" her (Eph. 5:29). He wants to provide for her and keep her warm with His tender care. Jesus does

not want His bride having her deepest needs met by anyone else.

Jesus married so that He could commune with His bride every Lord's day (Matt. 26:29; Heb. 2:12). There is nothing more important to Jesus than worshiping "with" His love every Sunday.

Jesus married with an eye on the second coming, "that He might present her to Himself a glorious" bride (Eph. 5:27). Jesus wanted (and wants) more than anything to spend an eternity with His bride in heaven. Jesus has done all that He can to make that a reality.

Sir, would you go back and read these things with eye on extracting a personal application from each one? Jesus is the ultimate example for us in our responsibilities within our marriages. If these six emphases above, which Jesus had for His marriage, do not match yours, what changes do you need to make...today? For Jesus, there is nothing more important!

Go Home

A familiar event in the life of Jesus has captured my attention recently. Not for its familiarity but for a detail that I had overlooked. That detail has been on my mind. This event is recorded in Mark chapter five and Luke chapter eight.

The scene opens with Jesus getting

out of a boat as they had crossed the Sea of Galilee. He was immediately met with a man inhabited by thousands You may not be of demons who says to Him, "What business do we have with each other, Jesus, Son of the Most High the person that God? I implore You by God, do not torment gets in the boat, me!" (Mark 5:7). Jesus asks the demon who he is, and his reply was, "My name is Legion; for we are you may need to many" (Mark 5:9). The demon implores Jesus not to go home. send him out of the land, "into the abyss" (Luke 8:31). He asks to be allowed to go into the pigs, and Jesus allows this to happen. Then, 2,000 pigs run down to the Sea of Galilee and drown. The man that had been living among the tombs and wandering in the desert was now healed. The man that could not be bound was now set free. Many people feared Jesus at that point. Those that witnessed the event ran to the nearby city and into the country side exclaiming what had happened. When they came back to kindly ask Jesus to leave, Luke records that the man was sitting at Jesus' feet. He had been there probably for a long time as the men went about gather-

ing the people to come and see. So as Jesus was leaving, the man that had been healed implored Jesus once again. Now in his right mind, he did not ask to be rid of Jesus but to follow him. Jesus' reply was this, "Go home to your people and report to them what great things the Lord has done for you, and how He had mercy on you" (Mark 5:19). This has been on my mind.

Here is someone who really wanted to follow Jesus, but Jesus did not permit it. This would have been a very faith-

ful disciple. Why could he not follow? We don't know. Here is what we do know. He did not go away sad like other would-be followers. "And he went away and began to proclaim in Decapolis what great things Jesus had done for him; and everyone was amazed" (Mark 5:20). That may have been exactly what he was prepared for. In Luke 9:49, John tells Jesus that they found someone teaching in Jesus'

name and casting out demons. I like to think that Jesus smiled in that moment and thought of the man healed of the legion and replied, "Do not hinder him; for he who is not against you is for you" (Luke 9:50). We can't know that it was the preacher in Decapolis, but it could have been.

You may not be the person that gets in the boat and goes across the sea. You may be the person that goes home and shares the amazing things that God has done with your life. Maybe that is what you were prepared for.

Embittered against the church

Remember: Jesus loved and gave Himself "for me" (Gal. 2:20) and for "the church" (Acts 20:28; Eph. 5:2)! – DS

Taste is such a vivid sense. Watch the face of baby who bites into a lemon. Watch as someone takes a big sip of iced tea that they thought was sweet (and it wasn't).

Eating is essential to life. This is especially true in the life of a child. The only way to properly grow is to eat. And, eating is

much more desirous when the food tastes especially good.

In First Peter 2, the apostle urged his fellow Christians, "as newborn babes," to "desire the pure milk of the word" (2:2). Why should they desire to eat? "That you may grow there-

by" (2:2). But, what could really enhance his craving to eat God's Word, so that he could grow? The taste! The taste would determine the craving, which would determine the amount one would eat, which would determine growth. So, what is there to taste? "Indeed you have tasted that the Lord is gracious" (2:3). The goodness, kindness and graciousness of the Lord (in our past, in our present and in our future) ought to create an insatiable craving in us for the Lord! – DS


