Whenever you think of the Day of Atonement just remember the importance of that day to the Jews. Each year on the tenth day of the seventh month, God remembered all of the sins of that nation. Atoning sacrifices were always connected with appeasing the wrath of God (see Numbers 16:41-46;

25:1-13), and it was imperative that this holy day of atonement be observed.

Now consider how the observance of this day would have impacted the infant church. There were 3,000 who obeyed the gospel on Pentecost and so many more afterwards. They were promised the remission of sins (Acts 2:38), and it became a visible reality in their lives just four months after Pentecost. The Jews assembled again for the next annual feast,

the Feast of Tabernacles, observed each year on the first day of the seventh month, and the feast lasted for an entire week. Just two days after the feast ended, the Day of Atonement was kept. The high priests carried the blood of a bull and a goat into the Most Holy Place and assuaged the wrath of God by sprinkling the blood on the mercy seat.

Perhaps those Christians in Jerusalem would have on that day seen the difference between the blood of animals and the blood of Jesus. Every devout Jew would have been mindful of the blood carried by the priest that day, except those who had become Christians. They would have vividly seen the distinction now made between the two covenants. Christians did not need the blood of animals. Their salvation had nothing at all to do with the events happening in the temple. There was a new law, a new altar, a new priesthood and a new blood sacrifice. That Old Testament Day of Atonement had been superseded by a far greater day of true atonement.

> The new priesthood was not the Levitical priesthood established by Moses. The new high priest did not need to first offer blood sacrifices for himself, for the new high priest was sinless. He did not need to offer a yearly atoning sacrifice, for Jesus' blood obtained eternal redemption! The book of Hebrews sums it up with these words. "We have an altar from which those who serve the tabernacle

have no right to eat. For the bodies of those animals, whose blood is brought into the sanctuary by the high priest for sin, are burned outside the camp. Therefore Jesus also, that He might sanctify the people with His own blood, suffered outside the gate. Therefore let us go forth to Him, outside the camp, bearing His reproach. For here we have no continuing city, but we seek the one to come" (Heb. 13:10-14).

The words of a hymn say it all: "Full atonement, can it be? Hallelujah! What a Savior!"



## The Best Medicine to Cure the Heart

If your heart is hurting, what's the cure? If your heart is lonely, what's the cure? If your heart is grieving or broken or damaged or despondent, what's the cure?

If you asked your friends to respond By David Sproule to those questions, what sorts of things do you think they'd offer as suggestions? Per-

haps some folks would say that if your heart is hurting, lonely, broken or grieving... "Go to the bar," "Go to the club," "Hit the bottle," "Light it up," "Increase your dosage," "Find a girl/guy for the night," "Revenge tastes or lashing out at of Jesus' teaching. "And just as you want men to do good," "Maybe life isn't worth living; snuff it out."

May I share with you the cure that was stated by one whose heart has been deeply hurt, trampled and grieved more than most folks and more

than many could handle? It is not a heart that is giving up (although that would be easy). It is not a heart that is seeking pity or serving self-interest (although that would be the tendency). Here it is: "The best medicine to cure the heart is to help others." Did you hear that? Rather than hiding in a closet or lashing out at the world or throwing a pity party, a fellow Christian has found the cure—take the focus off of self and put it on others! What can I do today to make a difference in the life of someone else who is in need?

Of course, that "cure" is not new. It is at the heart of the Christian faith! We are urged, "As we have opportunity, let us do good to all, especially to those who are of the household of faith" (Gal. 6:10). Some folks wait for an opportunity. Some folks shield their eyes from potential opportunities and hope they won't come. But Christians who know "the cure" aren't even satisfied with "waiting" for an opportunity. They look. They search. And if they cannot find an opportunity,

they will even create one, just to be able to serve.

"The cure" of helping others is at the heart to you, you also do to them likewise" (Luke 6:31). Jesus didn't say to wait around. Jesus said to "do." In the application of His parable of the Good Samaritan, Jesus used two present tense imperatives, "Go and do." Who knows but that the Samaritan's heart

was hurting, and he had found the cure of helping others.

"The cure" of helping others is at the heart of Jesus Himself! On the night when His heart must have been grieved beyond measure, Jesus washed His disciples' feet and said, "Do as I have done to you" (John 13:15). In the garden, His soul was "exceedingly sorrowful" (Matt. 26:38), and yet what did He do? He went to the cross to "help us"!

Have you learned it? Are you practicing it? "The best medicine to cure the heart is to help others."

Evangelism is more than a summertime trip, more than door knocking, more than special mail outs, more than an international move, more than an invite to a friend, more than any act. Evangelism is part of something eternal and powerful.

Evangelism is how the church

spreads the divine message. "To me, the very least of all saints, this grace was given, to preach to the Gentiles the unfathomable riches of Christ, and to bring to light what is the administration of the mystery which for ages has been hidden in God who created all things; so that the manifold wisdom of God might now be made known through the church to the rulers and the authorities in the heavenly places" (Eph. 3:8-10). We get to share with Paul in the work that

has been handed down since the day of Pentecost. The message that was once hidden and waiting for the fullness of time in order to be revealed is now in our hands. It is both humbling and empowering at the same time. God has left the most important task of mankind to the church. That is better than flying into space and destroying an asteroid and better than defeating a rouge band of invading extra-terrestrials on July 4th weekend.

Evangelism is how the church fulfills the divine pur-

**pose.** "This was in accordance with the eternal purpose" (Eph. 3:11a). "He chose us in Him before the foundation of the world, that we would be holy and blameless before Him" (Eph. 1:4a). The letter to the Ephesians reassures the reader that what they are a part of is what God had intended since the beginning. We were always going to be a body of believers on Earth with the charge of carrying the message—the most powerful message ever written (Rom. 1:16), and the easiest to tell:

He lived, He died and He rose again (Acts 10:34-43). We are not selling used cars, pawning used goods or selling knives on late night TV. We have the message that everyone needs to hear (2 Pet. 3:9). We are not charged with saving the whole world. We are just commanded to give everyone the opportunity.

powerful.Evangelism is how the church embodies<br/>divine love. "In love he predestined us to adoption as<br/>sons through Jesus Christ to Himself, according to the kind<br/>intention of His will, to the praise of the glory of His grace,<br/>which He freely bestowed on us in the Beloved. In Him we<br/>have redemption through His blood, the forgiveness of our<br/>trespasses, according to the riches of His grace which He lav-<br/>ished on us. In all wisdom and insight" (Eph. 1:4b-8). The<br/>church gets to embody and show what divine love looks like to<br/>the world. It looks like adoption, it looks like redemption, it<br/>looks like grace, and it feels like love. Please do not lose sight<br/>of what you have been given and the responsibility.


### Articles Published in PBL Family News Emails Last Week

#### Consensus

Many folks make decisions based upon "consensus." We are told things like: 4 out of 5 dentists approve. 4 out of 5 doctors use this product. 9 out of 10 customers agree. "Consensus" means a "general agreement; the judgment arrived at by most of those concerned." And so many folks will reason, "If it's good enough for the majority, then it's good enough for me."

Unfortunately, too many allow that to be the standard by which they make their religious and spiritual decisions, as well. "That church has lots of adherents, so they must be doing right." "This preacher has a lot of followers online, so he must be worth listening to." "I've polled several members at our church, and here are some changes we think should be made."

Consensus? That's not the way God works! The way that "seems right" often is not (Prov. 14:12). Following the majority will lead to destruction (Matt. 7:13). The one "way" (Matt. 7:14) approved by God is not based upon consensus but upon His one "truth" (John 8:32). – DS



Do you remember when the price of gas started to climb dramatically a few years ago and there was outrage all over the country? Gas went from close to \$1.40/gallon in 2000 to pushing \$4.00/gallon in 2012. And the cost of everything else increased along with it. Now we seem content for the price to hover near \$3.00/gallon. Where did the outrage go?

Even when everyone else seems to lose the outrage toward sin and just accepts it, we must see the real "per eternity" price! -DS
