## It Takes a Village ... Maybe

A few years ago, Washington reminded us of an African proverb about rearing children. Evidently, it was part of the Igbo culture in Nigeria from centuries ago. You may recall the emphasis that says, "It takes a village to raise a child." There is some obvious truth in this concept, but there may be

some inherent dangers. Let's think about it together.

There is no doubt that the community in which children are reared plays a powerful role in the spiritual development of every child. The fact that some fail to understand this is seen by the opening words of Paul in 1 Cor. 15:33. "Be not deceived: Evil Paul begins with this warning about being deceived shows that this truth can be hidden from us.

The world that existed when many of our older members were young no longer exists. The culture of those days is not the culture of our day. So, what might have been a truth years ago is not necessarily a truth today. What if parents fail to realize this today? They can unconsciously give their children to the "village" where the school system is forbidden to teach morals and tie them to Jesus. The majority of the hours each day is spent in that "village."

Then, there is the "after school village." With both

parents working, or even where there is a single parent situation, making a living means children have to spend time somewhere. I do not have a perfect solution, but wise parents should think about the impact those hours have on their own children. Sports have their place, but do we not realize the impact that the language and attitudes shown by coaches and players has on our children? To do nothing to counter this influence is to let this "village" rear our children.

Be aware of the "village" of media. Do we The "village" that really want the lifestyle of actors, actresses, singers and filthy comedians to mold our children? Are we content to have our children, who know of the immoral lives of leaders in media, make those individucompanionships corrupt good morals." The fact that village controlled als their heroes and idols? The same could be said of the influence of smartphones and the internet.

> There is another side to the words of Paul about the impact of ungodly friends, and that is the impact of the influence of godly friends. It is so easy to get so busy that we fail to get our children to spend as much time as possible with other children who have real values.

There are two God-given "villages" we have to help us. One of the blessings of the church is its influence as a "village" today. The other is our homes. Not just houses where the family finally gets together to sleep in the same house but a real home—God's "village" where He is present!

Those Christians to whom the book of Hebrews was addressed were not growing as they should and had "become dull of hearing" (Heb. 5:11). They had gone backwards and needed someone to teach them "again the first" or "elementary principles of Christ" (5:12; 6:1-2). Are you a Christian who

has matured beyond the basic rudiments of Christian doctrine?

Elementary Principle: "repentance from dead works." Do we understand that the works of the old man of sin have no place in the life of a Chris- tian who has matian (Col. 3:1-14), and that we must forsake all sin and turn to righteousness? May we never forget!

basic rudiments Elementary Principle: "faith toward God." Do we understand that movement "from" sinful of Christ? works must be combined with movement "toward" God (1 Thess. 1:9-10), which involves an obedient faith to God's revealed will (Heb. 11; Jas. 2)? May we never forget!

Elementary Principle: "the doctrine of baptisms." Do we understand the different baptisms mentioned in the New Testament? John's baptism involved believing in Jesus "who was coming after" John (Acts 19:4), and is no longer a valid baptism. Holy Spirit baptism was administered by Jesus (Mark 1:8) on only two occasions (on the Jews in Acts 2:1-4 and on the Gentiles in Acts 10:44-11:18). Baptism of fire is to take place in hell's lake of fire (Matt. 3:10-12; Rev. 20:15). The baptism of suffering involved the sufferings that Jesus and His disciples would endure (Matt. 20:22-23). The baptism of Jesus' Great Commission (Matt. 28:19-20; Mark 16:15-16) is the "one baptism" (Eph. 4:5) that still remains today, which is a burial (Col. 2:12) in water for the express purpose of obtaining the remission of sins (Acts 2:38). May we never forget!

> Elementary Principle: "laying on of hands." Do we understand that in the first century the apostles were able to lay their hands on Christians to impart a miraculous measure of the Holy Spirit (Acts 8:14-19), by which those early Christians were able to prophesy, speak in tongues, heal diseases, etc. (1 Cor. 12:4-11), in order to confirm the spoken word (Mark 16:20), but those gifts ceased when the New Testament was completed (1 Cor. 13:8-13)? May we never forget!

Elementary Principle: "resurrection of the dead." Do we understand that at the return of Jesus, in the very "same hour," all of the dead will be raised to either "life" or "condemnation" (John 5:28-29). May we never forget!

Elementary Principles: "eternal judgment." Do we understand that all of us will stand before Christ (Rom. 14:10) and be judged by His Word (John 12:48), according to how we have lived (2 Cor. 5:10). May we never forget!

Are we growing as we should? As our God desires?



## **Righteous Warfare**

A list of names and deeds begins in 2 Samuel 23:8 with these words, "These are the names of the mighty men whom David had..." As I read this list and the exploits of these men, I longed to be named among them. The romanticized ideas of a time long gone, when men defended their faith with

sword and shield, with spear and buckler. When one could stand flat-footed on the field of battle confident that the Lord would bring about a great victory by your hand alone, and those that came after you would **God is glorified in** is against us? warfare, don't That was another age. The Holy Spirit now tells us, "For our struggle is not against flesh and give up! blood, but against the rulers, against the powers, against the world forces of this darkness, against the spiritual forces of wickedness in the heavenly places" (Eph. 6:12). The face of the enemy has changed, and the battle field has changed (Eph. 4:22-23; Rom. 12:2). This puts things into perspective when Christ said, "Do not fear those who kill the body but are unable to kill the soul; but rather fear Him who is able to destroy both soul and body in hell" (Matt. 10:28). Some of the fiercest battles are waged in the mind, and we deal with temptations and issues that come from putting off the old man—issues that can destroy both body and soul.

In my youthful desire to be a mighty man of valor, I knew nothing of the wars that people wage in their own minds. I knew nothing of the strength it took to draw a line in the sand with the tip of the sword of the Spirit and shout out to the temptations of sin, addictions and darkness, "This far and no more!" The courage it takes to stand up and say, "I need help, my strength is fading." In that moment, your fellow brothers and sisters at arms rally around you and pull you from

> the encroaching darkness. Remember this, "What then shall we say to these things? If God is for us, who ingly conquer through Him who loved us" (Rom. 8:31, 37). We all have battles, and we are all warriors. So, arm yourselves as for war and fight (Eph. 6:10-18)! Fight for all you hold dear: for sons, daughters, spouses, friends, family and your own soul.

A list of names and deeds is found in heaven that, perhaps, begins with these words, "These are the names of the mighty servants whom God has..." Keep fighting, "Fight the good fight of faith; take hold of the eternal life to which you were called" (1 Tim. 6:12). So when the end comes you can say, "I have fought the good fight, I have finished the course, I have kept the faith; in the future there is laid up for me the crown of righteousness, which the Lord, the righteous Judge, will award to me on that day" (2 Tim. 4:7-8). God is glorified in your righteous warfare, don't give up!




