### What Kind of Friend Are You?

You may be someone who only has a few friends. Maybe you have lots of friends. (Your Facebook friend count doesn't count.) Regardless of the number of people who you consider to be your friends, and regardless even of what kind of friends you have, what kind of friend are you?

Scripture teaches us, "A man who has friends must himself be friendly" (Prov. 18:24). Regarding true friends, the Bible says, "A friends loves at all times" (17:17), and "there is a friend who sticks closer than a brother" (18:24). Regarding the closeness of some friends who feel like brothers, God says, "A brother (i.e., a true, real friend) is born for adversity" (17:17). What kind of friend are you?

Are you the kind of friend who always has to

have your way? Think about that. Are you? If you say "no," when was the last time that you yielded to your friend's wishes on something meaningful and were ok with it?

Are you the kind of friend who always gets your feelings hurt if your "friends" don't see things your way? Can you believe that someone who cares for you might have a different perspective on something than you do?

Are you the kind of friend who expects others to do things for you? How often do you anticipate being on the "receiving" end of good deeds, while you are rarely the one on the "doing" end of good deeds?

Are you the kind of friend who demands that others promptly say "Thank you" for every little thing that you do? Do you practice that yourself, or are others really just expected to do things for you without a sign of gratitude?

> OR...Are you the kind of friend who looks out for the needs and wants of your friends? Do you try to anticipate when they might need something and what it might be, and then try to be the one who supplies that need through totally selfless measures?

Are you the kind of friend who understands that everything doesn't revolve around you? In fact, are you the kind of friend who tries to make your friends feel like things revolve around them?

Are you the kind of friend who is polite, courteous, grateful, humble, sacrificial, generous, flexible, dependable and honest? Most importantly, is there any resemblance to the way that you treat and respond to your friends and the way that Jesus would treat and respond to your friends? Is there anything about you as a friend that should be changed to more suitably resemble the kind of friend Jesus would be?

In this self-centered, self-gratifying world in which we live, what kind of friend are you? Including to your spouse?

As a friend, do you bear any resemblance to Jesus?



### **Fig Tree Fail**

To fail is to not succeed, obviously. Fail videos and memes have been popular with our youth. They highlight the failures of others for comedic purposes. Jesus wasn't laughing at the fig tree fail though. Not long before Jesus went to the cross, He destroyed a fig tree while traveling from Bethany to

Jerusalem. This encounter might appear random, but there are

some lessons. Jesus saw the fig tree in leaf from a distance and went to see if He could find a fig. There was nothing. It was out of season, but He still cursed it, saying, "May no one ever eat fruit from you found with fruit. again" (Mark 11:13-14).

Jesus and His followers returned to Bethany along the same route, and the tree was "withered from the roots up" (Mark 11:20). At this point, Jesus

used the dead tree as a lesson about prayers of faith. This was an opportunity for insight concerning the dimensions and the power of prayer. But, when He first confronted the tree it was a different issue. The issue was a tree failing as a tree.

For Jesus, this was not a simple outburst of frustration. His displeasure toward the tree had a purpose. When He first approached the fig tree, He was displeased when He discovered it was missing a key element, figs. Jesus' disapproval had a deeper level. Like many of His parables, Jesus took this moment to use agriculture to teach a spiritual truth.

God often established a parallel between our lives and trees. He used David to describe a righteous man as "a tree firmly planted by streams of water, which yields its fruit in its season and its leaf does not wither" (Psa. 1:3). Jesus said, "You will know them by their fruits... So every good tree bears good fruit, but the bad tree bears bad fruit...Every tree that does not bear good fruit is cut down and thrown into the fire" (Matt. 7:16-19). If expectations were not met, there was a

> limit to the time allowed for good fruit. So, when Jesus confronted the tree there was a lesson. Anyone who follows Christ is expected to live a life that produces fruit. That is what defines a fruit tree. It could be said that if the fruit of the Spirit (Gal. 6:22-23) is not apparent in the life of someone, then they are not true followers of Jesus.

There is at least one more thing to learn from the day Jesus condemned the tree. "He found nothing but leaves, for it was not the season for figs" (Mark 11:13). Jesus wouldn't expect a tree to be doing something it wasn't designed to do unless He meant to teach us something. Christians are a lot like trees in many ways, except in one very important way. They should never be "out of season." We are to be ready "in season and out of season" (2 Tim. 4:2) "for every good deed" (Titus 3:1), "for the Son of Man is coming at an hour that you do not expect" (Luke 12:40). Do not fail to be found with fruit. It won't be funny.

### Do you see what I see?

When the air conditioner in your home goes out in the middle of summer, it is a major catastrophe and demands immediate attention. But, have you ever taken time to consider those who do not have a/c or cannot afford to run it? your whole day. But, have you ever taken time to think about those who only wish they had enough money to get something at the drivethru today?

When you gather together with fellow Christians in order to worship the almighty God, how does that "activity" and "opportunity" affect you? Consider the fact that in worship you are entering into the very presence of God-stepping into His throne room and appearing before Him. Or consider it

> from another viewpoint—you are standing before the cross of Jesus and watching Him suffer and die for you. As you think about either (or both) of these breathtaking experiences, ask yourself what you would or wouldn't be doing in that setting.

When you stand before the throne of God or before the cross of Jesus, can you envision yourself checking Facebook, writing your to-do list for the week, sipping your favorite coffee, playing a game on your phone, reading a book, wearing immodest apparel, exhibiting a lack of interest in what's happening, sitting at a distance (like in the lobby) and chitchatting with others?

We gather in His presence to honor and extol the Almighty! Let us focus on doing that! - DS


