Reminders From the Storm

There are those events in our lives which become a catalyst to enhance spiritual truths we have known for years. It is not that we have forgotten the truths, but familiarity may have dimmed our appreciation of them. Let me share with you truths made more vivid as we dealt with the hurricane, Irma.

Irma reminds us that God is omnipotent. He is all

powerful. All other forces are not worthy to be compared to His awesomeness. We were "powerless" in every way before His might. We hid in our shuttered more vivid to me "omnipassionate." I recognize that there is no such houses. When daylight arrived, we left our houses to see the aftermath of His majesty. Perhaps the prophet Nahum said it best. "The Lord has His way in the whirlwind and in the storm" (Nah. 1:3).

Irma reminds us that God is omniscient. For

days before the arrival of Irma, we saw meteorologists who were completely baffled as they sought to plot the course of the storm. Just thirty-six hours before the storm arrived, we were told to expect it to come directly over West Palm Beach. No mortal knew when Irma would turn northward. The evidence of this was seen in "spaghetti predictions" made by the most outstanding scientists using their computers. They knew almost nothing. God alone is the all-knowing One. Paul described God's wisdom in relationship to human wisdom. "He taketh the wise in their own craftiness" (1 Cor. 3:19).

Irma reminds us that God is omnipresent. Our God was present during that Wednesday night prayer meeting before the storm arrived. He was there when we prayed for deliverance in whatever came. When we left, He was with us in our homes as the storm approached. He was there during the storm. He was there after the storm. His name says it all, "I AM." He is the eternal, unchanging God. He promised, "I will

never leave you nor forsake you" (Heb. 13:5).

Irma reminds us that God is word as I just used, but His compassion and care is unending and immeasurable. He loves us. I will never forget what I saw during a lull between the raging rain bands. I opened the front door and stood in the breezeway. Four small birds flew from one place to

another. How could I ever forget that if God takes care of every sparrow, then He would take care of me (Matt. 10:31)? Elizabeth Cheney so beautifully describe His love for us:

> Said the robin to the sparrow, "I should really like to know, Why these anxious human beings Rush about and worry so." Said the sparrow to the robin. "Friend, I think that it must be, They have no heavenly Father, Such as cares for you and me."

Have you ever grown increasingly frustrated with someone who would not respond positively to your efforts to touch their lives with the gospel? You tried and tried and tried, but they rejected and rejected and rejected at every turn. Most likely, every one of us have been there, and every one of us

have been tempted to just give up trying. But, we have good news! We know it! The Lord knows it! And, we want them to know it! What should we do when we are fully convinced of the news we have?

In Acts 12, Herod Agrippa I threw Peter into prison, intending to execute him after Passover. This was horrible news, and the church in Jerusalem was intent on believing the worst. An angel of the Lord freed Peter from the prison that night. What glorious news! He was free! He escaped death! The church would be so excited to hear this message! Or, so one would think.

When Peter came to the house where prayer was being constantly offered on his behalf, a girl named Rhoda recognized his voice at the gate but did not open to him. She ran to tell the church that Peter was at the gate, but they did not believe her. They told her that she was out of her mind.

Perhaps Rhoda would just give up. She tried to tell them but they rejected her. They not only rejected her, but they suggested that she was crazy. (Have you ever had someone suggest such about you in your Christian faith?) Notice two Greek imperfect tense verbs that teach us what we should do in a similar situation-when people reject the good news that we are trying to offer them. The imperfect tense indicates a past action that was continuous, ongoing and non-stop.

First, Rhoda "kept insisting that it was so" (12:15). Although they were rejecting her message and insulting her,

> she did not grow ashamed or deviate from her efforts. She kept on, kept on, kept on sticking to the truth. She knew it was true, and she wanted her friends to know it was true, too!

Second, Peter "continued knocking" (12:16). Peter did not walk away. He did not give up. He knew who was inside. He knew the potential that was there. Although the door was still locked, he was

still knocking. He knew that if they would eventually accept the message of his escape, they could rejoice, too.

Do you have unbelievers in your life (folks who are friends or family members), who have steadfastly refused to listen to you regarding Jesus, the Bible, salvation, the church? What should you do? Give up? Be like Rhoda—keep insisting that the truth is the truth. Be like Peter-keep knocking. Eventually, the text states, "they opened the door." There are hearts today that may do the same if we don't give up!

Some Things Paul Knew That Made a Difference

It has been said, "What you don't know won't hurt you." I would like to suggest that what you do know could keep you from hurt. Sometimes knowing makes all the difference. In the case of Paul, there were some things that he knew that made all the difference in his life.

He knew Jesus. "For this reason I also suffer these

things, but I am not ashamed; for I know whom I have believed and I am convinced that He is able to guard what I have entrusted to Him until that day" (2 Tim. 1:12). He is suffering unjust imprisonment because of his faith and devotion to Christ but without shame. Why? Because He knew Jesus. There was a confident expectation that Christ would guard his soul. He had entrusted it to the Savior.

He knew his mission. "For if I preach the gospel, I have nothing to boast of, for I am under compulsion; for woe is me if I do not preach the gospel" (1 Cor. 9:16). Having a mission in place helps create a drive and push forward. How many have said, "I don't know what I'm doing with my life." Never Paul. He knew his mission, and it was his focus.

He knew his purpose. "According to my earnest expectation and hope, that I will not be put to shame in anything, but that with all boldness, Christ will even now, as always, be exalted in my body, whether by life or by death. For to me, to live is Christ and to die is gain" (Phil. 1:20-21). It is one thing to know your mission. It is another to know your purpose. Why am I here? Paul would say, "To glorify Christ, in life or death." How he lived and died would all be tied together in a way to exalt the One that would save his soul.

He knew his reward. "In the future there is laid up for me the crown of righteousness, which the Lord, the righteous

Judge, will award to me on that day; and not only to me, but also to all who have loved His appearing" (2 Tim. 4:8). It is alright and healthy to look toward the reward. Paul knew what was waiting for him. This knowledge helped him get through and persevere even when all others could not.

He knew the grace of God. "But by the grace could not. of God I am what I am, and His grace toward me did not prove vain; but I labored even more than all of them, yet not I, but the grace of God with me" (1 Cor. 15:10). Paul, of all people, needed to understand grace. How would you preach to the very group you once were determined to destroy? It was an understanding of the grace and the nature of God that allowed Paul to lift his head and teach what he once persecuted.

> True knowledge can make all the difference in our ability to serve the Christ. Do you know these things?




