

We Saw the Word and Beheld His Glory

The glory of God

is seen in all that

our Savior did.

Look at Him and

see God's glory

Christ that frees

"And the Word became flesh and dwelt among us, and we beheld His glory, the glory as of the only begotten of the Father, full of grace and truth" (John 1:14). There is so much more in this verse than the average reader of the Bible may see. This is likely because we fail to notice the uses of the expres-

sion, "the glory of the Lord," in the Old Testament.

The Glory of the Lord in the OT

When the children of Israel left Egypt and arrived at Mt. Sinai, they saw a visible manifestation of the glory of Jehovah. "And the glory of the Lord abode upon mount Sinai...and the sight of the glory of the Lord was like devouring fire on the top of the mount" (Ex. 24:16-17).

While at that mount they built the tabernacle and before it was ever used God hallowed it with His presence. "Then a cloud covered the tent of the congregation, and the glory of the Lord filled the tabernacle" (Ex. 40:34). Almost five hundred years later the tabernacle (a tent) was replaced with Solomon's majestic temple. Read the Divine record of what happened as the temple was sanctified. "Now when Solomon had made an end of praying, the fire came down from heaven, and consumed the burnt offering and the sacrifices; and the glory of the Lord filled the house. And the priests could not enter into the house of the LORD, because the glory of the Lord had filled the Lord's house" (2 Chron. 7:1-2).

Two Shining Faces and the Glory of the Lord

Think about the events preceding Moses wearing the veil at Mt. Sinai. In Exodus 33, Moses asked the Lord, "Please show me Your glory." The next day Moses ascended Mt. Sinai with two tablets of stone and was protected by the hand of

> the Lord while His glory passed by. He had been in the very presence of God and the result was seen in his shining face.

> The events on Mt. Sinai shed light on what happened at another mount, the mount of Jesus' transfiguration. On that mountain, His face began to shine like the sun, and His garments became radiant and exceedingly white. The three apostles who were with Him "...were heavy with sleep; and when they

were fully awake they saw His glory" (Luke 9:32). His transfiguration was an affirmation of His Deity.

It was not just on this mount where His glory was seen. It was visible in all He did. Paul said, "For in Him dwells all the fullness of the Godhead bodily" (Col. 2:9). He was "...the brightness of His glory and express image of His person" (Heb. 1:3). Jesus said, "He who has seen Me has seen the Father" (John 14:9). Behold Him! See His glory! (More next week).



The. Perfect. Law. Of Liberty.

In one of the most practical, real-tolife books in the Bible, James urges his readers to be more than just passive, forgetful hearers of God's Word. He charges us to be "doers of the word" (1:22), which requires "looking" into God's Word (1:25). The word "looks" in verse 25 involves a close, intent

examination. It's the same Greek word used of Peter, John and Mary's actions at the empty tomb of Jesus, when they each "stooped down and looked into the There is only one tomb" (Luke 24:12; John 20:5, 11).

For a few moments, consider what we are examining so closely. Into what are we looking so intently? It is "the perfect law of liberty" (1:25)!

God's Word is a law. That is not a very the gospel. popular concept today, as people don't want to think of the Bible as a "law." Some Bible students even claim that we are not under a law today but only under a grace (without law) system (by misusing passages in the book of Romans). But James 1:25 calls God's Word a "law." Elsewhere in the New Testament it is referred to as "the law of Christ" (Gal. 6:2; 1 Cor. 9:21), "the law of faith" (Rom. 3:27) and "the law of the Spirit of life in Christ Jesus" (Rom. 8:2). As a law, God's Word is the "rule" or the "standard" by which all action and conduct is to be measured (Col. 3:17; Luke 6:46).

God's Word is perfect. We hear the word "perfect" and think of something that is flawless and without any defects. Of course, that is true concerning the Bible, but the word here means "complete." The emphasis of that word is upon the all-sufficiency of God's Word to accomplish the purpose for which it was designed—namely, the salvation of souls (cf. 1:21; Psa. 19:7; Rom. 1:16).

God's Word brings liberty. Jesus said that "the truth shall make you free" (John 8:32). When we "obey the truth," it "purifies" (1 Pet. 1:22) and "saves" (Jas. complete law of 1:21) our "souls" by liberating us from bondage and guilt of sin (Rom. 6:17-18). When the law of Christ makes us free (upon our obedience thereto), we are us from sin—it is "free indeed" (John 8:36), enjoying "the liberty by which Christ has made us free" (Gal. 5:1).

God's Word is THE perfect law of liberty.

The definite article "the" specifies the singularity and exclusive nature of God's law. There is only one complete law of Christ that frees us from sin-it is the gospel, the New Testament. No other law is of God! No other law saves our souls!

So, what is my responsibility? Read verse 25. "Look" intently into it regularly. "Continue" in it, abiding in it and all of its precious precepts. "Be a doer" of the work that is defined therein. And the promise is that the one who does this "will be blessed in what he does." What a book!

Lagging Behind or Fervent In Spirit?

So, you know what you are supposed to do. You know what is expected of you. You know what you want and need to do, but how do you get motivated to do it? In Romans chapter twelve, amongst a list of Christian attributes, there is this phrase, "not lagging behind in diligence, fervent in spirit,

serving the Lord" (12:11). If we were to be honest we could say that we spend more time feeling like we are "lagging behind" rather than "fervent in spirit" in our service to the Lord. How do we change that? Here are some thoughts to consider.

We remake

We need to stop waiting until we feel like doing something. "I'll get to it when I feel like it" is not a life mantra. We will typically never "feel" like doing anything that is for our betterment and the

good of others without some other motivation. Something other than "feeling it." "Beloved, I urge you as aliens and strangers to abstain from fleshly lusts which wage war against the soul" (1 Pet. 2:11). The very earthly vessel we live in naturally only does those things that please it. Most often, change only happens when the fear of staying the same overcomes the fear of change. The soul and conscience have to be trained to be more than someone that responds to fleshly whims and fear.

Fervent people plan to be so. "But solid food is for the mature, who because of practice have their senses trained to discern good and evil" (Heb. 5:14). Through practice and training we can be fervent people. We do those things that would propel us toward a fervent spirit, even when we don't feel like it. Part of this is building healthy habits. Schedules and routines for yourself and for the family that include time for spiritual formation. One example would be syncing your calendar

with the church calendar and attending everything you can. Even when you don't feel like it. I know that spirituality and a relationship with Christ are much more than just attendance, but it is a start. If we want to be fervent in service we should be where service is happening.

fervent lifestyle, how do we maintain it? Be realistic with yourself. With a renewed fervor there is the need of setting goals for our continued spiritual growth. As humans, we love a challenge; however, if something is easy or very diffinaturate cult we lose interest. Make sure your goals for personal growth are challenging but not too challenging. Think of what Goldinores locks would do.


We all want to work towards a healthy relationship with Christ. We need to make sure we are being intentional about it and not waiting until we are "feeling it."




