## **Hope For the Future**

It is impossible for us to imagine the emotional rollercoaster endured by young Daniel and his three friends. They had lived all of their lives in one of the most spiritual times in the history of the Jews. In the six decades before they were born, king Manasseh and king Amon, had brought idols into

Solomon's glorious temple. Yet Daniel grew up knowing only of the temple worship which Josiah had restored. For the two decades before they were taken Babylon, the worship of God had been restored—they knew nothing of idolatrous worship. If you marvel at Daniel's faith, remember that the world in which he lived was a world where the Jews faithfully served God.

Three years after Josiah's death, Daniel was taken by Nebuchadnezzar to serve him in Babylon.

That "rollercoaster of faith" descended into a pagan world saturated with immorality. After Daniel and his friends arrived in Babylon, idol worship began to flourish once again because of the new kings, sons of Josiah. Nebuchadnezzar would soon make two more assaults against Israel and finally destroy the holy city. Jeremiah was in Jerusalem and watched as Jerusalem was filled with false prophets. They prophesied that Nebuchadnezzar would return the holy temple vessels taken from the temple and be defeated by the Jews. These prophets were courageously confronted by Jeremiah for twenty-three years (Jer. 25:3). The world in which Daniel had been reared no longer existed. Sin had returned to Judah and God had sent the sword, famine and pestilence to try to get the Jews to see His judgment and return to Him.

Jeremiah sent a letter to those Jews who had already been taken to Babylon by Nebuchadnezzar. It specifically told them they would be in Babylon for seventy years, but then the prophet told them of God's promise. "I know the thoughts I

> have toward you...to give you a future and a hope" (Jer. 29:11). Two chapters later, God said, "There is hope in your future...that your children shall come back to their own border" (31:17).

> How could there possibly be hope? The temple was destroyed, the city was leveled and the only physical connection Daniel could have with Jerusalem was to go to his window and pray in the direc-

tion of the ruins of the temple. How could there be hope when Nebuchadnezzar demanded all those in Babylon worship his golden idol. (Remember the fiery furnace?)

There was no physical evidence there would ever be a return to Jerusalem to rebuild the temple. How could there be hope when they were in a hopeless situation? The answer is simple. God promised them a future and God cannot lie. Are you on a "rollercoaster of faith"? Has your world collapsed around you? Have hope, for God cannot lie about your future!

# Jesus Is Jehovah!

Who is Jesus? Some in the so-called "religious world" have relegated Jesus to an inferior status in relationship to God. They look at Jesus as having been created by God or holding a position as "a god" but certainly not "the God." What does the Bible say?

begins the book of John with these words: "In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Even if it did just

Word was God" (1:1). The Bible reader is not left to wonder who (or what) this Word was! Verse 14 de- once, that would us" (Rev. 5:9). Therefore, Jesus is Jehovah! clares, "And the Word became flesh and dwelt among us, and we beheld His glory, the glory as of the only begotten of the Father, full of grace and truth." John is clearly affirming that Jesus (who came in the flesh) was and is God!

But was Jesus just "a god" or did He hold a lower rank than God? He couldn't really be THE GOD OF GODS, could He? The Bible identifies the divine, self-existing, eternal God as "Jehovah" (a fact which is asserted even by many who degrade Jesus as a created god). Does the Bible ever identify Jesus as Jehovah? Even if it did just once, that would prove that He truly is who He claimed to be (cf. John 8:58). The Bible does identify Jesus as Jehovah, and not just once.

Jesus is Jehovah, because He is Creator of all things!

The Bible teaches that "Jehovah...maketh all things" (Isa. 44:24, ASV), and it teaches that by Jesus "all things were created" (Col. 1:16). Therefore, Jesus is Jehovah!

Jesus is Jehovah, because He is Savior! The Bible teaches that "besides" "Jehovah...there is no savior" (Isa. 43:11), and it teaches that Jesus is the "Savior" (Tit. 2:13). Therefore, Jesus is Jehovah!

Jesus is Jehovah, because He is Redeemer!

The Bible teaches that "Jehovah" is "your Redeemer" (Isa. 43:14), and it teaches that Jesus "redeemed

Jesus is Jehovah, because He is the first and

the last! The Bible teaches that "Jehovah" is "the first, and...the last" (Isa. 44:6), and it teaches that Jesus is "the First and the Last" (Rev. 1:17). Therefore, Jesus is Jehovah!

Jesus is Jehovah, because John prepared the way for

Him! The Bible teaches that "the voice of one...in the wilderness" would prepare "the way of Jehovah" (Isa. 40:3), and it teaches that "the voice" came to "prepare" the way of "Jesus" (Mark 1:1-4). Therefore, Jesus is Jehovah!

Jesus is deity (Col. 2:8)! Jesus is God (John 1:1)! Jesus is Jehovah, the great "I AM" (John 8:58; cf. Ex. 3:14). "Let us exalt His name together" (Psa. 34:3)!

# **Everything Is Awesome**

We use the word "awesome" a lot. I say "we" because I'm guilty also. A wise Spaniard once said, "You keep using that word. I do not think it means what you think it means." If you look into the etymology of the word, you can clearly see the change in its use. It began to be used in the English language in

the 1590s and was used in the context of something that was "profoundly reverential" or "that which inspires awe." It was in the 1960s that it started getting used as something good or great. In 2013, the Lego Movie further degraded the word by giving us the song, Everything Is Awesome. Let's think about this: If everything is awesome then nothing is truly awesome.

What is wrong with that? Let's read a few verses to see if I can illustrate. Jacob was given a dream from God in the place that would later be called Bethel or house of God. After the dream, the Bible says, "He was afraid and said, 'How awesome is this place! This is none other than the house of God, and this is the gate of heaven'" (Gen. 28:17). Now if you read that passage again and think of awesome in the context of today's meaning, it has a different idea. "How cool/great is this place" is very different than "How profoundly reverential or awe inspiring is this place." In another place, Moses was encouraging the people concerning their imminent conquest of Canaan. He said, "You

shall not dread the [inhabitants of Canaan], for the LORD your God is in your midst, a great and awesome God" (Deut. 7:21). A great and "totally tubular" God does not inspire one as much as the awesomeness of God. We lose so much of the impact of God's awesomeness if we use todays Merriam-Webster's version or common use of the word. The King James Version translates the word as "fearful," "terrifying," "dreadful."

What is wrong
with that?

Consider these things. It was the Awesome God that spoke the world into existence. It was the Awesome God that spoke from Mt. Sinai and caused the people to tremble saying, "Let not God speak to us or we will die" (Ex. 20:19). It was the Awesome God that filled the temple with His presence before Isaiah which caused him to say, "Woe is me, for I am ruined!" (Isa. 6:5). "Say to God, 'How awesome are Your works! Because of the greatness of Your power

Your enemies will give feigned obedience to You. All the earth will worship You, and will sing praises to You; they will sing praises to Your name.' Selah. Come and see the works of God, Who is awesome in His deeds toward the sons of men" (Psa. 66:3-5).

Will I/we stop using the word awesome when we mean great or cool? Probably not. However, will we stop and consider the true awesomeness of God? That which inspires a sense of wonder, dread and profound reverence for Him? Yes.

### Can God get me out of this?

In fulfillment of prophecy, as Jesus was hanging on the cross, the religious leaders in voices of derision and blasphemy, jeered, "He trusted in God; let Him **deliver** Him now if He will have Him" (Matt. 27:43; cf. Psa. 22:8). But, on that day, in order that we might be delivered by God one day in the future, the Father did not deliver the Son. Think about that for a moment!

When the devil tests us, are we on our own? When temptations round you gather, is it hopeless? They mocked Jesus for not being delivered, but what a blessing we enjoy as a result. God wants to "deliver" us and bids us to pray for such (Matt. 6:13). God has already "delivere

for such (Matt. 6:13). God has already "delivered" us (Col. 1:13), and with confidence we know that He "will deliver" us in the future (2 Tim. 4:18). Here's a comforting text: "The Lord knows how to deliver the godly out of temptations" (2 Pet. 2:9). He has the will, the power and the knowledge to deliver you!

Do you trust God to deliver you? Open your eyes! Look! He always provides an escape! – DS

#### Resist the vortex

Some people are like a vortex, in that they seem to catch you in their swirl and gradually draw you into them. Sometimes it's their personality that sucks you in and drives you to please them. Sometimes it's their beauty, sometimes it's their popularity, sometimes it's their power, sometimes it's their wealth. And, before you know it, you are thinking like them, talking like

them, wanting what they want, and swirling in fluid and synchronized motion with them.

In some cases, this may not be a bad thing. A Christian husband and wife could be said to be in a vortex together. God joined them together as one (Matt. 19:4-6), and they must stick to-

gether as "joint-heirs" (1 Pet. 3:7). But there are others, including some brethren, of whom we must be cautious. It is so easy to get drawn into certain people and situations that we do not evaluate our thoughts, our steps, our words, our desires, etc. And, before you know it, we are swirling around in perfect unison...with them. Friend, be careful! Resist the vortex! – DS




