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

Son, Remember

"And being in torments in Hades, he lifted up his eyes and saw Abraham afar off, and Lazarus in his bosom. Then he cried and said, 'Father Abraham, have mercy on me, and send Lazarus that he may dip the tip of his finger in water and cool my tongue; for I am tormented in this flame'" (Lk. 16:23-24).

It is likely that when you read these words you can

recall the details of the entire story. However, these words were far more than a captivating story when The real question they were spoken and heard by that rich man. This is not a parable of an imaginary man who never lived. Jesus said, "There was a certain rich man."

Death brought changes to the rich man. He now knew that gold has no value in hell. He knew that those who make gold the focus of their lives will

someday recognize this truth, but it will be too late. The rich man's dwelling, his clothing, all the excesses of living and his riches brought to him had no advantage.

Death brought changes to the beggar Lazarus. He no longer was hungry. He no longer was begging for crumbs which fell from the rich man's table. He no longer had sores, nor dogs to lick them. Instantaneously, it all changed. He was changed from being an unwanted member of earthly society and had become the honored guest of heavenly beings who

escorted him to the other side. Death changed almost everything around these two men and us.

One thing which did not change was the remembrance of one's earthly life before death. In two brief words Abraham brought profound truth to the forefront. The two words were, "Son, remember." The rich man remembered and recognized Lazarus. He recalled the crumbs which fell from his table and were evidently never given to Lazarus. He remem-

> bered his five brothers and their ungodliness and begged that something might be done to bring about their salvation.

> Now, think of how all this impacts your life. How will you feel when you remember that you never did anything to help the least in the kingdom? How will you feel about your selfishly spending almost all you were prospered on your own pleasures

when the church struggled to make its proposed budget? How will you feel when you recall the sermons you heard pleading with you to get involved in His work and to grow spiritually? Wasted money, wasted time and wasted opportunities will be part of the agony in the torment of fire.

It doesn't have to be that way. Think of what great memories the rich man could have had if he had changed his behavior. On the other side you will remember. The real question is whether the memories will bring regret or joy!

How Well Do I Know God?

Something that has been repeating over and over in my mind lately is this, "Rule without relationship equals rebellion." My mind map goes from there to God, and I begin to question my relationship with God. "If I knew God more, would I rebel less?" My next thought is, "How well do I know God?"

Theologically I can know about God, but do I know

Him? I can know all about a movie star, famous athlete or historical person and still not know them. There is a distinction between knowing Him and knowing about Him. You can be at services every time and five o'clock on Sundays. You can be at every activity and still only know about God (Matt. 7:21-23). How do we make the jump from knowledge to relationship?

We need to start by listening to Him-"By this we know that we have come to know Him, if we keep His commandments" (1 John 2:3). We must listen to His Son-"God, after He spoke long ago to the fathers in the prophets in many portions and in many ways, in these last days has spoken to us in His Son" (Heb. 1:1-2a). We must also listen to those men that were given charge to teach the early church—"We are from God; he who knows God listens to us; he who is not from God does not listen to us" (1 John 4:6a). This is more than just knowledge. This is hearing and obedience. There were many of the different religious elite in the time of Christ who heard and knew Jesus' message but they did not listen. Those who went out to be baptized by John, listened. Those who followed Christ during His ministry, listened. Those who were in the upper room on the day of Pentecost, listened.

We must listen and we must love. "Everyone who loves is born of God and knows God. The one who does not

love does not know God, for God is love... and the one who abides in love abides in God, and God abides in him." (1 John 4:7b-8, 16b). We have to **Knowing God is** learn to love like God. His Son can show us the way (John 14:6-10).

> Let's finish with this thought. I recently asked someone at a youth event if she trusted the coordinator of the event, someone she didn't even

know (it wasn't me). Her reply surprised me, "I trust him because other people trust him." I didn't see that coming. Then I thought, "How did Noah, Abraham, Moses and David get to know God?" They laid everything on the line for their relationship with God, they held nothing back. Were they perfect? No, but they knew God and trusted Him. They were all in. So I would like you challenge you to get to know God on a deeper level. Trust the God of Abraham, Isaac and Jacob. How well you know God depends entirely on you (Phil. 2:12).

Don't be discouraged!

When Israel came to the border of the Promised Land, the ten spies returned with a negative report about the land and "discouraged" the hearts of the people (Deut. 1:28). As a result, the people wandered in the wilderness for 40 years and died off. After almost 40 years, the tribes of Reuben and Gad sought to settle on the east side of the Jordan and not assist with the further conquest of Canaan, and thus

"they discouraged the heart" of Israel (Num. 32:9).

Sometimes the negativity and/or inactivity of our fellow brethren can be discouraging. When they don't show up for Bible Class or worship

like they should, or they don't really participate in or seem to enjoy Christian fellowship, it can be discouraging. When it feels like you're the only one who's interested in and trying to do the Lord's will, don't get discouraged! Focus on brethren (even if it's a small number) who are trying like you. Then, best of all, "looking unto Jesus," "consider Him...lest you become...discouraged in your souls" (Heb. 12:2-3). When no one else is interested in your efforts be active and involved, HE IS! – DS

Save your marriage!

Regardless of what shape your marriage is in, it can probably use some work. There are some "simple" things that you need to DO and "simple" things you need to STOP doing.

DO: Talk to (not at) your spouse. Listen (actively) to your spouse. Pray. Read the Bible. Spend time together-while

relaxing and on set dates. Be humble. Focus on his/her needs and desires. Say, "I love you," often. Say, "Thank you." Practice agape love (1 Cor. 13).

STOP: Yelling. Fighting. Slamming. Stomping. Blaming. Fussing. Whining. Pouting. Being

grumpy. Expecting perfection. Centering everything around you. Putting other things and people ahead of your spouse. Making everything about money. Jumping to conclusions.

Somebody says, "But I am not married, so this has nothing to do with me." If you are a Christian, you are married to Christ (Rom. 7:4; 2 Cor. 11:2). These principles apply to that relationship as well. Go back, read them again, and make application. - DS


