All His Words

Jesus said, "It is written, man shall not live by bread alone, but by every word that comes from the mouth of the Lord" (Matt. 4:4, italics added throughout). The full implication of that phrase, "every word which comes from the mouth of the Lord," can so easily be overlooked. Think

about it. For man to live by every word which comes from God necessitates that every word which God spoke still exists. Otherwise, if any is missing, man cannot live. God is not just

Let's take a moment to look at a parallel concerned about phrase, all the words, and the implication it has. The phrase is found forty-one times in the Bible. Six of these times it refers to the words of individuals expressing their own thoughts. The rest of the time it describes the words spoken by God or words spoken

by His messenger. God gave His message, and His messengers then gave us His word. But, they gave us more than His wordthey gave us every word.

When Moses met his brother, Aaron, who was to be the spokesman, "Moses told Aaron all the words of the Lord who had sent him..." (Ex. 4:28). Two verses later, these brothers are in Egypt talking to the Jews, "...and Aaron spoke all the words which the Lord has spoken to Moses." Not one word given at the burning bush was omitted!

When Moses descended from Mount Sinai, he had the two tablets of stone and "...on them were all the words which the Lord had spoken" (Deut. 9:10). While Moses was on the mountain, God gave instructions of sacrifices and worship. Moses descended from that mount "...and came and told the people all the words...and all the people...said, 'All the words which the Lord has spoken we will do.' And Moses wrote all the words of the Lord" (Ex. 24:3-4).

> Are you intrigued by this study? Do you see how God and His messengers were careful to ensure we have all the words He spoke? Take time to read Deuteronomy 27:3, 8; 28:58; 29:29; 31:12; 32:44, 46, and you will see this emphasis again and again. God is not just concerned about men having His word. He is concerned about men having all the words!

There is one chapter in the Bible where the phrase, all the words, is found seven times. It concerns the time when God told Jeremiah (who had been God's messenger for over twenty years) to write on a scroll all the words that God had given to him. He could not leave even one word out and do what God said. When the king burned that scroll in his fireplace, God told Jeremiah to rewrite the scroll again and include every word God had said.

Next time you read the Bible, read every word carefully! God has given each of them and preserved them all!



"Dear Friend, I Found Eternal Life"

Friend, I want to share with you one more thing that I have found. Like all the ones leading up to this, it is thrilling and lifealtering, so I hope that you will consider this carefully! I have found eternal life! Like everything else l've shared with you, I earnestly want this for you!

First, I found that there is life after death. Our limited number of years on this earth is not all there is! While death is certain for all of us (Heb. 9:27), the promise of a continuing existence after death is just as certain. Jesus' account of a rich man and a beggar in Luke 16:19-31 teaches this quite clearly. The resurrection of Christ guarantees our own resurrection from the dead (1 Cor. 15:20-23), after which we will live in another place forever (John 5:28-29).

Second, I found that there is going to be a judgment. There is something just as certain as death—"judgment" (Heb. 9:27). When Jesus returns at the end of the world, "we must all appear before the judgment seat of Christ, that each one may receive the things done in the body, according to what he has done, whether good or bad" (2 Cor. 5:10). At that time, our eternal sentence will be announced (Matt. 25:31-46).

Third, I found that there are two (and only two) very real destinies in the eternal realm. The Bible teaches quite clearly that there is an eternal realm called "heaven" (1 Pet. 1:4) and an eternal realm called "hell" (Matt. 10:28). Scripture makes it plain that, while these two destinies are very different from each other (2 Thess. 1:7-9), both places will last forever and ever (Matt. 25:46), and there will be no passage or transference from one to the other (Luke 16:26).

Fourth, I found that obtaining eternal life is conditional. Not everyone is going to go heaven; in fact, Jesus said

that only a "few" are on the path that leads to eternal "life" (Matt. 7:13-14). Jesus went on to say that only a person "who does the will of My Father in heaven" will "enter" into heaven (7:21). Therefore, one who does not do the Father's will is promised an eternal separation from Him (7:23; 2 Thess. 1:9).

Friend, I want you to have eternal life! I cannot bear the thought of you spending eternity in any place other than the loving presence of God! I want you to find what I have found!

Have you found God? The Bible? The truth? Jesus? God's love? Salvation "in Christ"? The church of Christ? Have you found eternal life, which is only "in Christ" (Rom. 6:23) and only for those "who obey Him" (Heb. 5:9)?

Friend, you are important to me! One day Jesus is going to return and take God's children to heaven with Him! Are you ready for that day? Friend, please find His way today!

Do You Remember?

There are some things that you will never forget. They are woven into the fabric of your mind with sight, smell, sound and tactile memory. The good and the bad are etched onto the template of who you are. I think about this when I read, "He will teach you all things, and bring to your remem-

brance all that I said to you" (John 14:26). Jesus was speaking to His apostles about the work that the Holy Spirit would do in them in the near future. I read that, and I think about what we know Jesus said to them. Both the good, "Blessed are you, Simon Barjona..." (Matt. 16:17) and the bad, "Get behind Me, Satan! You are a stumbling block to Me" (Matt. 16:23). They would remember it all. Every word. I wonder how many times they would replay different events. How many times did Thomas think about when Jesus appeared

to him in the upper room? How often did Peter long to eat fish with Jesus beside the Sea of Galilee?

The memory that God has given us is both a blessing and a burden. What are we doing with it? There are things that we will remember that are beyond our control. Events that unfolded that we cannot change. However, what are we doing with the remainder? If the law of sowing and reaping is correct, you reap what you sow, then can we not store in our minds those good things? Here are some things worth remembering. "So remember what you have received and heard; and keep it, and repent" (Rev. 3:3). "But you, beloved, ought to remember the words that were spoken beforehand by the apostles of our Lord Jesus Christ" (Jude 1:17). "You should remember the words spoken beforehand by the holy prophets and the commandment of the Lord and Savior spoken by your apostles" (2 Pet. 3:2). "Remember Jesus Christ, risen from the dead, de-

scendant of David, according to my gospel" (2 Tim. 2:8). "Therefore remember that formerly you, the Gentiles in the flesh, who are called 'Uncircumcision' by the so-called 'Circumcision,' which is performed in the flesh by human hands, remember that you were at that time separate from Christ, excluded from the commonwealth of Israel, and strangers to the covenants of promise, having no hope and without God in the world. But now in Christ Jesus you who formerly

were far off have been brought near by the blood of Christ" (Eph. 2:11-13). "Therefore remember from where you have fallen, and repent and do the deeds you did at first" (Rev. 2:5).

Both the good and bad memories serve as tutors for our future. We must do our best to remember what we have been given in Christ. To remember His word and our instruction. To remember the great love that was bestowed upon us. To remember and act to provide memories of obedience.

Praying "In Your name"?

In various religious settings (outside the church) where a prayer is offered, I am hearing more and more prayers closed with these words, "In Your name, Amen." Is that appropriate?

Our prayers are to be primarily directed to the "Father" (Matt. 6:9). Is it ever appropriate to address Jesus in prayer? Various

passages indicate that such is authorized (John 14:14; Acts 7:59-60; 2 Cor. 12:8). However, Scripture is very specific that our prayers are to be "in the name of" Christ (John 14:14-15). "In the name of" emphasizes praying by His authority and in the manner that He authorizes. After all, He is the One who has "all authority" (Matt. 28:18). The "name" (or authority) by which we pray (and do

all we do, Col. 3:17) is that of Jesus Christ.

"In Jesus' name" is not a magical formula that must be verbalized in a prayer in order to be heard. But, if one chooses to verbalize in Whose name a prayer is being offered, let's be clear about it. "In Your name" is ambiguous and could be the Father. Let's be specific. Let's be Scriptural. Let's pray "in the name of" (by the authority of) "Jesus Christ." – DS

The tried and proven method of reaching the lost

> Reaching the lost in the first century was **personal**. Peter and John looked the members of the Sanhedrin in the eye in Acts 4. The same could be said of Stephen (Acts 7), Philip (Acts 8), Ananias (Acts 9), Peter (Acts 10), Paul (Acts 16), Aquila and Priscilla (Acts 18), etc. The divine model of the most effective method of reaching

the lost is the **personal**, eye-to-eye encounter.

Reaching the lost in the first century was **to the point**. Peter preached the deity of Jesus Christ and the essentiality of immediate obedience (Acts 2:22-39; 3:13-26; etc.). The same could be said of Stephen, Philip, Ananias, Paul, etc. The divine model of the most effective way to save the lost is to immediately get **to the point**—Jesus is God's Son and you must obey Him right now! Brother and sister, are you practicing God's tried and proven method? -DS






