## **Letting Blessings Destroy You**

It may seem strange to you, but do you know that a blessing from God could lead to our destruction? Yet, this truth is taught repeatedly throughout the Bible. Take time to consider the following thoughts to see how God warns us that His blessings can destroy us.

After forty years in the wilderness, the Jews were

ready to enter the promised land, a land flowing with milk and honey. Moses told them, "It shall be, when the Lord your God brings you into the land...to give blessing from our you large and beautiful cities which you did not build, houses full of all good things, which you did not fill, hewn-out wells which you did not dig, vineyards and olive trees which you did not plant-when you have eaten and are full-then beware..." (Deut. 6:10-12). Beware? How could there be any danger in these blessings?

Read the rest of the verse. "Beware, lest you forget the Lord who brought you out of the land of Egypt." Even Solomon understood the dangers of material blessings from God. He prayed to God to not make him rich. "Give me neither poverty nor riches-feed me with the food allotted to me; lest I be full and deny You and say, 'Who is the Lord'" (Prov. 30:8-9).

Think of the blessing of knowing the Bible. We spend hours studying the Bible, and God rewards us, for He has made the Bible so understandable. Yet, inherent within this blessing is that which can destroy us. Paul said, "Knowledge puffs up, but love edifies. And if anyone thinks that he knows anything, he knows nothing yet as he ought to know" (1 Cor. 8:1-2). One may know a great deal of the Bible and can become proud that he knows it better than others. One of the great dangers the Lord's church faces is those "scholars" who have failed to see how little they actually know.

Is leadership in the church a great blessing? Absolutely, but inherent within this blessing is that which can destroy a person. Think of the blessing of being an apostle, yet they argued who would be the greatest one. "Now there was also a dispute among them, as to which of them should be considered the greatest. And He said to them... 'He who is greatest among you, let him be as the younger and he who governs as he who serves'" (Luke 22:24, 26). Jealousy over leadership turns a blessing into destruction.

How do blessings lead to our destruction? It happens every time we take the blessing and think we are "owed" the blessing. The blessing of the promised land became a curse to puffed-up Israel. Knowledge of the Old Testament became a curse to the scribes and Pharisees. Honor bestowed upon a leader becomes a curse to one who elevates himself above others. Thank God for His blessings. Never let them destroy you!



## **Conversation on the Tarmac**

While traveling recently, I was seated on a flight next to some very talkative ladies, who were particularly loud in their conversation. I was not eavesdropping on their conversation, as it might be perceived, for it was impossible for those in the seats and rows around them to not follow along in

their high-volume chat.

These two ladies had just met as they were taking their seats. Their initial "get-to-know-eachother" exchange was especially alarming and eye- bizarre questions "Is your pregnant daughter married? To a man?"opening. The lady in the window seat said, "My daughter is pregnant with her first, and I'm going to be there for the birth." From the middle seat, the ordinary as flying second lady asked, "Is she a human?" "Yes," came the hesitant response, "she is." And then the second

question, "Is she going with natural birth or are they delivering through your daughter's ear?" Stunned, the voice from the window seat replied, "Um, it's going to be a natural birth."

Can you imagine hearing such a strange conversation? Well, I have good news and bad news. The good news: That was not the real conversation. The bad news: The real conversation was just as bad. I chose to illustrate with this fictionalized version first to highlight the absurdity of the actual questions that were asked. Although, in our day and age, what were once bizarre questions (like the ones in the fictional version) are now as ordinary as flying on a plane.

In their actual "getting-to-know-each-other" exchange, the lady in the window seat said, "My daughter is pregnant with her first." The lady in the middle seat asked, "Is she married?" [STOP! Think about that question!] The mother replied, "Yes, she's married!" And then, question number two. Are you ready? "To a man?" Stunned, the voice from

the window seat replied, "Yes, to a man!"

It used to be that asking these questionswould be like asking—"Is she human? Will the baby be born through her ear?" Absurd! Bizarre! Unheard of! But today, they are as common as getting peanuts or pretzels on an airplane.

How do you think God sees the condition of our society? We are not left to wonder. Romans chapter 1 describes a culture that "exchanged the truth of God for the lie" (by making up their own laws) and "exchanged the natural use for what is against nature" (by practicing homosexuality) (1:25-26). As a result, "God gave them up," to do whatever they wanted to do and to suffer the consequences (1:24, 26, 28). Today, has God given America up to their own lusts?

Brethren, it's time for us to see things (and hear things) as God does! Ungodliness must always rattle us!

# Adrift



On November 12, 1961, Terry Jo Duperrault, age 11, was alone on a threefoot by two-foot raft in the Atlantic between the Bahamas and Ft. Lauderdale, FL. The captain of the sixty-foot sailboat her family had chartered killed her parents, her siblings, his wife and scuttled the boat. She was left to

die, but she quickly found refuge on the small raft. She floated for 4 days in the open ocean before being rescued by a cargo ship. Alone with no provisions and shocked by the horrors she had seen, she was left adrift.

As tragic as this event was, this plays out spiritually every day. There are many people who are adrift in the world. Those who are unprepared for life and are left to wander. Jesus spoke of them this way, "Seeing the people, He felt compassion for them,

because they were distressed and dispirited like sheep without a shepherd. Then He said to His disciples, 'The harvest is plentiful, but the workers are few. Therefore beseech the Lord of the harvest to send out workers into His harvest'" (Matt. 9:36-38). How do you see the spiritually weak and lost in this world?

The sailor that spotted Terry Jo noticed the small white raft thinking at first it was whitecap, but as they got closer, he saw it for what it really was. We also can get caught up in seeing the multitudes as just endless waves. This nameless

"them," but we need to get closer. Christ could see into the hearts and minds of men. We have to get involved in people's lives and make a difference and be an influence (Matt. 5:13-16).

We know that not everyone will respond. In the case of Terry Jo, she was so dehydrated, scorched by the sun and starving. She barely had the energy to sit up. When we talk with people they are so spiritually weak that they do not even

know how to respond (Heb. 12:12-13). The men of the cargo ship slowly gave the little 11-year-old girl What will you do sips of water and orange juice to revive her. Can you see yourself doing the same to those who are spiritually faint?

> Terry Jo was unaware of the dangers that were around her. Even as the ship drew near to her there were sharks circling around the tiny raft. Just

getting her into the boat safely was a challenge. Many that you talk with might be content where they are but completely unaware of the danger that surrounds them. We can see the world for what it is as we have been trained to see the spiritual battle that rages around us, but they have not. They are in a snare and "held captive" as Paul would describe it (2 Tim. 2:24-26).

What will you do with those adrift around you? Will you sound the alarm and rush to their aid? Or, will you let them silently slip by? You can make the difference.

### The wind in your life...and Jesus

In the middle of the night, Jesus saw that His disciples, who were several miles out into the stormy sea, were "straining at rowing" (Mark 6:48). Matthew uses the word "wind" three times in his paragraph about this event. First, he records that when Jesus saw His friends from a distance, "the wind was contrary" (Matt. 14:24). Second, when Peter got out of the

> boat to walk to Jesus, Matthew records that Peter "saw the wind was boisterous" (14:30). But, when the Lord saved Peter and they got into the boat together, "the wind ceased" (14:32).

There are times in our lives when "the winds of life" blow "contrary" to us. Even when Jesus is near, sometimes they can still be "boisterous." But, let us not take our eyes off of Jesus, even in the midst of our storms. Rather, let us continually cry out to Him, "Lord, save me!" If we put our "faith" in Him, with no "doubt" in our hearts (cf. 14:31), we can get "into the boat" together and let Jesus take care of the winds that seek to blow us off course! Remember, "even the wind" in your life will "obey Him" (Mark 4:41)! - DS
