Two Truths Simply Stated

There may be some things in the Bible which are difficult to understand, but there are others which are so simply stated but often are easily overlooked. Two of these truths are that Jesus established the church and that He never wanted it to be changed.

Read Matthew 16:18 and notice how easy it is to understand the promise Jesus made before

He died about what was about to happen. "I will build My church." Even a child can grasp these What would hapwords. Continue to read the Bible, and you will see exactly what happened. Just days after He ascended into heaven that church became a reality, and men were added to it (Acts 2:38-47). We must never overlook this truth so plainly stated.

Read the words in Matthew 16 which follow

His promise to build the church. He said to Peter, "Whatever you bind on earth will be bound in heaven and whatever you loose on earth will be loosed in heaven." Two chapters later, He expanded this right to reveal God's message bound upon all men to include others (Matt. 18:18). For the church to exist, there was a new testament which was about to be revealed, but when that truth was bound on this earth it was bound in heaven. We must not overlook this truth so simply stated.

To see how firmly this new way of living was binding

on man, read the words of the apostle Paul. "I marvel that you are turning away so soon from Him who called you in the grace of Christ, to a different gospel, which is not another; but there are some who trouble you and want to pervert the gospel of Christ" (Gal. 1:6-7). The truth was so firmly bound on mankind that to change it is described as a perversion.

Then, read the next verse to see that the gospel could not be changed. "But even if we, or an angel from heaven,

preach any other gospel to you than what we have preached to you, let him be accursed." Do you see how easily these words show that the Lord never gave any man, including the apostle Paul, or any angel from heaven to change the truth that was revealed?

Yet, it is so easy to overlook these two truths. God first gave that Old Testament to the Jews and only God Himself could change it (Deut. 4:2; 12:32). When

Jesus gave us the New Testament, He gave this same message-do not change it. How tragic it is that since Jesus left the earth men have changed the church and changed the truth bound on us in so many ways.

What would happen if all those who believed in Jesus decided to return to the simple truth given by Jesus and the apostles? What would the church look like if we established that first-century church in our day? Think about it!



What Do I Need to Know About Baptism?

Baptism is one of those topics that seems like it should be simple, but there are so many different ideas regarding it and so many different practices of it that one can easily get confused trying to figure out what he actually needs to know. Is there a way to simplify this topic? Is there a way to strip

away all of the confusion and get down to the basics of what a person needs to know? There most certainly is! And it is as simple as just picking up the Bible and letting Is there a way to it do the teaching itself. What does it say?

Baptism is God's idea, not man's. It is important to know that man did not come up with the practice or the doctrine of baptism. God did! This is and get down to Baptism is referred to as being "buried" and then not an "invention" of man, therefore, man has no right to regulate it (or confuse it). Everything that I

need to know about baptism (and everything that has any authority regarding the subject) is found in the New Testament.

Baptism is a command of God. Jesus commanded "baptizing" as the means by which to "make disciples" (Matt. 28:19), which is why the apostles "commanded" individuals "to be baptized in the name of the Lord" (Acts 10:48). This is not optional. It is required in order to be obedient to God, thus it must not be minimized or altered by man.

Baptism involves prerequisites of God. Prior to being

properly baptized, God (the Originator of baptism) specified certain steps that one must take. Before one can be baptized, he must be taught the gospel (Mark 16:15-16), he must believe the gospel (Acts 8:12), he must be convicted of his sins and repent of them (Acts 2:37-38), he must confess his faith in Jesus (Acts 8:36-38), he must arise of his own free will and be prepared for the commitment that baptism requires (Acts 22:16; Rom. 6:3-4). If one does not meet all of these prerequi-

sites, then he cannot be Scripturally baptized.

Baptism is defined by God. The Bible stipustrip away all of lates that baptism is by (and only by) immersion. The description is always of one going down into and then up out of the water (Matt. 3:16; Acts 8:38-39). "raised" (Rom. 6:4; Col. 2:12). The word itself means "to immerse." We need to let God define it.

> Baptism is given purpose by God. If we strictly limit ourselves to what God says about baptism (and not man), then we find that He clearly identifies baptism as essential in order to be "saved" (Mark 16:16; 1 Pet. 3:21), to obtain "the remission of sins" (Acts 2:38), to "wash away sins" (Acts 22:16), to get "into Christ" (Gal. 3:27) and to "enter the kingdom of God" (John 3:3-5). Man has no right to repurpose baptism!

> Baptism is not a confusing topic. God has made it pretty simple to understand! The Bible gives it to us plain!

Worshipped God, Leaning Upon His Staff

A seemingly

There are bits of information in the Bible that leave us wondering, "Why are these here?" Random acts like when John wrote that Jesus "was sitting thus on the well" when talking with the Samaritan woman (4:6). Other strange bits of information are found in the genealogies, especially in

the early ones of Cain, Adam and Noah (Gen. 4:17-26; 10:1ff). Did you know Tubal-cain was the "forger of all implements of bronze and iron" (Gen. 4:22)? While these are interesting facts to know and may raise more questions than answers, there is another random fact I would like us to consider.

"By faith Jacob, as he was dying, blessed each of the sons of Joseph, and worshiped, leaning on the top of his staff" (Heb. 11:21). This particular

piece of information, seemingly insignificant, points to the practice of faith. It is possible that Jacob used a staff for much of his life after wrestling with the angel. The Bible says that he "was limping on his thigh" (Gen. 32:31). Why was this mentioned in Hebrews eleven, the chapter of faith? A man, near the end of his life, blessed his sons and worshipped God despite the circumstances.

If I were to think of a word that accompanied the image of an old man worshipping God and leaning on his staff, it would be devotion. When others might have a reason to rest from the labor of worshipping their God, you couldn't keep Jacob from doing it. While faith is not relegated to those of age, it is often in those years that we see the greatest examples of faith, devotion and mature love for God. Our aisles and pews are dotted with wheelchairs, walkers, canes, oxygen tanks and other implements of assistance. Each one a testament to the devotion of that individual. While we may lie in

bed wondering if we feel like going to worship, other older soldiers of the faith have risen hours ahead of us to start the process of readying themselves. Every movement of the painful joints, every arthritic step is a triumph over the fleshly tabernacle in which each soul is housed—another example of bringing the body into subjection to the holy will of the soul that seeks after God (1 Cor. 9:27). This is the soul that says, "No matter the circumstances I will go up the

house of the Lord. I will assemble with the saints. I will be in the presence of the Lord."

Jacob and others like him teach us that worshipping God is more important than our health, our familial responsibilities, or any other thing. PSA: If you are contagious, then please consider yourself unclean and stay home. However, if you can possibly come to worship, for those that are looking and our God, you stand as testaments of great faith. What a seemingly random act that heralds a life of devotion.

They have left "their senses"

Have you listened to or read any news reports lately and had the thought, "They've left their senses!"? Have you heard someone on the TV or radio talk about the Bible and had the thought, "They've left their senses!"? The Bible says that is exactly what has happened!

Paul warned his friend, Timothy, about those who "spread" a false message, "strayed concerning the truth" and "resist the truth" (2 Tim. 2:17, 18; 3:8). In this context, he calls upon servants of the Lord to humbly correct "those who are in opposition...that they may know the truth, and that they may come to their senses and escape the snare of the devil" (2:25-26). God says that those who stray from and resist His truth (on any matter) have left "their senses" and need to come back. Think about that! They no longer have "their senses."

Our responsibility is to unashamedly stand for truth and help those who are in error to see the senselessness of their rejection of truth and to "come to their senses." Hard? Yes! But essential! -DS

Keeping score sets you up to fail!

Two words that should never go together are "nobody ever." Both words are superlatives, stating absolute extremes. *Has just one person ever done this?* "No! Nobody!" *Maybe it happened just once?* "No! Not ever!" Starting a sentence with "Nobody ever" may intend to draw a strong conclusion, but it actually creates doubt and draws the conclusion into question.

> Some have been known to say, "Nobody ever calls to check on me." Or, "Nobody ever sends me a card." Or, "Nobody ever speaks to me at church." Or, "Nobody ever comes by to visit me." Or, "Nobody ever shows any concern for me." Each of these claims is suspicious, just by

nature of starting them with the absolute extreme of "Nobody ever."

But, may I suggest a solution? Rather than "keeping score" on what others do (or don't do) for you, what if you turned your thinking around? Who can you call to check on? Who can you send a card to? Who can you go by to visit? Truly, it is more blessed to give than to receive! -DS
