What Are You Planning to Wear Today?

An adage which has been around for years is, "Clothes makes the man." The idea behind this is that when a man wears the proper clothes, these clothes removed any blemishes which he might have. When wearing the proper clothing he is far more likely to be received and accepted by society. Con-

sider the follow "items" of clothing which God urges us to wear so that when others look at our lights they will glorify our God even more.

Clothed with Salvation

When Solomon dedicated the temple to God, he extolled the greatness of God and then turned his attention to those priests who came before Him. "Let your priests, O Lord God be clothed with salvation." The work of the priest was to come before God to seek God's favor for His people.

Sometimes those priests who stood before God on behalf of others were extremely vile. Remember how the sons of Eli did not have time to offer a troubled soul's sacrificethey were spending their time fornicating with women at the door of the tabernacle (1 Sam. 2:22). Solomon, in his wisdom saw that such men should not come before God, so he begged God that those who served in the temple he was dedicating might be holy—clothed with the salvation from God. Consider how this impacts every Christian, for each of us is a priest to God. When we come before Him may we be men and women with salvation, with hearts made pure by our Father. Each of us needs to be clothed with salvation.

Clothed with Gladness

The closing chapters of Isaiah prophesy about the coming the church. He describes the heart of those who are

part of that kingdom. "I will greatly rejoice in the Lord, my soul shall be joyful in my God; for He has clothed me with the garments of righteoussometimes make ness..." (Isa. 61:10). David also describes that joy. "Let your priests be clothed with righteousness, and let your saints shout for joy" (Psa. 132:9).

> Those who have been made holy by the blood of Jesus and stand in garments of righteousness have every reason to have hearts filled with joy!

Clothed with Humility

Peter adds one other aspect to the "clothes which make a Christian" when he says, "Yes, all of you be submissive to one another, and be clothed with humility" (1 Pet. 5:5). We have not been redeemed so others may serve us, but so we may serve them. When we humble ourselves and get self out of the way, others will not see us, they will see Jesus. Clothes make a man, but truly clothes make a Christian!

This concern for a religious structure gave me reason to think. Would we be as concerned as the French people at the burning of a national treasure if we thought that the Lord's church was in danger? It must first be stated that the church as a whole

will never have a victor over it. "The gates of Hades will not overpower it" (Matt. 16:18). However, a local congregation of the Lord's church can have destructive forces come in "like savage wolves" (Acts 20:29-30). We need to see the importance of Christ's church.

The church is a divine institution founded by Christ (Matt. 16:18). Jesus is the head of it (Col 1:18). It is directed and governed by God. It is the spiritual body of Christ (Eph. 1:22-23; Rom. 12: 4-5; 1 Cor. 12:12-31). It is the body of people

Christ promised the church that was planned before the world began (Luke 24: 46-48; Acts 1:3-4, 8; Eph. 3:8-11). The gospel produces the church (Luke 8:11; Acts 2: 21-36). The church is

the household of God (1 Tim. 3:15). God is the Father (Eph. 4:6). We are His children (1 John 3: 1-2). We are heirs of God, our Father, when we are born into the family (Rom. 8:15-17; John 3:5). The church is the Kingdom of God and heaven. Christ is King (Col. 1:13). We are fellow citizens (Eph. 2:19). The church is the Bride of Christ. He is the Head and Savior (Eph. 5: 23-32).

The church Jesus built is not what many believe it to be. It is not a man-made institution. It is not a sect or denomination (1 Cor 1:10-13; 3:16-17). It is not one among many that a person chooses to join. It is a not a social club that we go to for the activities and programs (Rom. 14:17). We must see to it that we don't bring into the precious church any of these ideas. We must protect it from division (1 Cor. 12:25). We must not introduce any false teaching (Acts 20:30) We should behave ourselves in such a way as not to be that spark that would ignite so much turmoil in the Lord's church.

Take heed how you hear

Mark and Luke record a statement of Jesus after He told the Parable of the Sower. Luke records that Jesus said, "Take heed how you hear" (8:18). Mark records that Jesus said, "Take heed what you hear" (4:24). In the context, Jesus is emphasizing the importance of measuring carefully what one hears, whether that be Scriptural matters or worldly matters. We must be critical listeners, intent on paying discerning attention to what is being said.

Jesus' words have application to so many aspects of our lives. Sometimes we hear a bit of information but we don't "take heed what we hear." Sometimes we believe everything we're

told and we don't "take heed how we hear." It is essential that we learn to ask ourselves some questions: "Is this true? Am I sure? Is there something that maybe I'm not being told? Is this something that I actually need to hear? Why is this person telling me this? Should I be listening to this person? What makes them a credible source?" Friend, take heed how you hear! -DS



When you look in the mirror today, whose reflection do you see? May I suggest to you that it is not someone else's reflection in that mirror, although that's what we sometimes "see." Too often we look at our reflection and try to compare ourselves to others. But that is not realistic, not wise (2 Cor. 10:12) and not healthy.

> May I suggest to you that it is not your old self in the reflection in that mirror, although that's what we sometimes "see." We sometimes focus on past mistakes, shortfalls and problems (or even compare ourselves now to some personal greatness and achievements in the past).

But that, too, is not realistic, not wise and not healthy (Phil. 3:13).

So, whose reflection do you see in the mirror today? Rather than "see" what is not there (i.e., someone else or your past self), "see" where you are today in your relationship with Christ. That's all that matters! Do you "see" Christ in you (Gal. 2:20; Col. 1:27)? What do you need to change, in your reflection, to look more like Jesus (2 Cor. 3:18)? That's all that matters! -DS


