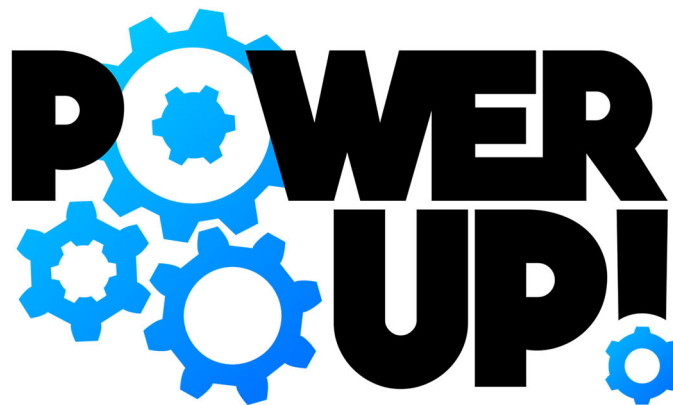

## Speaking Before You Know the Truth

One of the mistakes far too many make is forming opinions and often arriving at a final conclusion *before* we hear the complete story. Solomon said, “He who answers a matter before he hears it, it is folly and shame to him” (Prov. 18:13). Also remember that in defense of Jesus, Nicodemus said, “Does our judge a man before it hears him and knows what he is doing” (John 7:51).

Yet, many people arrive at conclusions simply because of what others are saying without ever investigating to know the whole story. Tragically, they then act on these ill-founded conclusions and even become vocal advocates of these unstudied matters. Let me illustrate this by looking at two views of Jesus and why He was crucified.

### One View of the Jesus and His Crucifixion

I know the reason Jesus was crucified. He was a blasphemer and a vile man. He was so vile that not even a single one of our religious or political leaders thought He was right. He spoke like a terrorist and said He was going to tear down the temple and not leave one stone upon another of that sacred building. He spoke of holiness and presented Himself as a holy man, but all one has to do to see what He really was like is to look at who He spent His time with—publicans, harlots and

the dropouts of our world. He chose twelve men who were ignorant and unlearned laborers and some of them were Zealots (who carried knives to secretly kill the Romans) and others who collected taxes to fund the immorality of the Caesars.

He taught that one should cut off their hands and pluck out their eyes. He told everyone to sell everything they had and give it away. No one could really know what He believed because He told weird stories about sowing seed, cooking bread, building houses on sand, rich men in a burning fire, sheep and goats, and told of sins our holy God will not forgive.

If you want to know what he really was like, look at how He died—crucified with convicted criminals, begging Elijah to come and take Him off the cross and sanctimoniously asking God to forgive those killing him. He was buried in a rich man’s tomb, but His disciples came by night and stole His body. He was a fraud and everyone I know thinks this.

### The Other View of Jesus and His Crucifixion

Read Matthew, Mark, Luke and John. Then, form your own conclusions. Hear the whole matter before you speak. Now, apply this principle to the rest of your life and what you say about any matter, especially what you say about others. Hearing only one side is why the multitude crucified the Son of God. Think about it!

Let us hear the conclusion of the whole matter before we say anything

## When I Pick Up My Bible, What Do I Have?

You can pick up a novel to read. You can pick up a work of nonfiction. You can pick up a bedtime story book. You can pick up a self-help book. You can pick up a biography. You can pick up a book of fantasy. There are scores of different kinds of books that you can read today, but when you pick up your Bible, there is nothing else like it! What sets it apart from all other books today?

First, consider what the Bible is NOT. Are you aware that Scripture repeatedly informs its readers what they are NOT reading? Consider each of these affirmations carefully. The Bible is “**not** the wisdom of this age, **nor** of the rulers of this age” (1 Cor. 2:6). The Bible is “**not** in words which man’s wisdom teaches” and “**not** the spirit of the world” (1 Cor. 2:12-13). The Bible is “**not** according to man” (Gal. 1:11). The Bible is “**not**...the word of men” (1 Thess. 2:13). The Bible is “**not** to please man” (1 Thess. 2:4). The Bible is **not** “from someone’s own interpretation” and **not** “produced by the will of man” (2 Pet. 1:20-21).

Think about that. If you pick up the Bible, thinking that it is just like any other book that you can find in a library, you are continually informed that this book is **not** from man and does not contain the wisdom of **man**. So what is it?

What sets it apart from all other books today?

Second, after considering what the Bible says that it is not, we must investigate what the Bible IS. The Bible informs us clearly of its divine origin. The Bible “**is** given by the inspiration of God” (2 Tim. 3:16). The Bible **is** from “men moved by the Holy Spirit” (2 Pet. 1:21). The Bible **is** “the wisdom of God” (1 Cor. 2:7). The Bible **is** “words...taught by the Holy Spirit” (1 Cor. 2:13). The Bible **is** “the commandments of the Lord” (1 Cor. 14:37). The Bible **is** “through the revelation of Jesus Christ” (Gal. 1:12). The Bible **is** “the word which God sent” (Acts 10:36). The Bible **is** “the oracles of God” (Rom. 3:2). The Bible “**is** in truth, the word of God” (1 Thess. 2:13).

In addition to the hundreds of times that the Bible emphasizes its divine origin as “the word of the Lord,” note the other divine descriptions of Scripture. The Bible **is** “the word of truth” (2 Tim. 2:15), “the word of this salvation” (Acts 13:26), “the word of His grace” (Acts 20:32), “the word of the gospel” (Acts 15:7), “the word of the kingdom” (Matt. 13:19), “the word of faith” (Rom. 10:8), “the word of reconciliation” (2 Cor. 5:19), “the word of life” (Phil. 2:16), “the word of righteousness” (Heb. 5:13), “the word of exhortation” (Heb. 13:22).

What a glorious book! What a unique book! What a treasured book above all others! Pick up your Bible! Read it! Know what it is NOT! And cherish what it IS!

## A Message From Hell

Jesus uses a story about the rich man and Lazarus to illustrate that man's idea of righteousness is not God's (Luke 16:19-31). In that same chapter, Jesus said to the Pharisees who were lovers of money, "You are those who justify yourselves in the sight of men, but God knows your hearts; for that which is highly esteemed among men is detestable in the sight of God" (Luke 16:14-15). The message from Hell is this, "Warn them, so that they will not also come to this place of torment!" (Luke 16:28)

The subject of Hell is not one to bring up in casual conversation. Some might mention it as a curse and nothing more. Most do not believe it even exists. I am persuaded that if people were convinced of its reality, they might change their behavior.

Jesus teaches that there is a place of torment, "In Hades he lifted up his eyes, being in torment" (Luke 16:23a). Even some who believe in Jesus do not believe there is a place of torment. Just because someone doesn't believe in something doesn't negate its existence. It just makes it even more dangerous. They are rushing headlong into a danger that they are not even trying to avoid. If asked, those that don't believe in Hell will often believe in Heaven. If Disney can convince people that "All Dogs Go to Heaven," then surely Satan can con-

vince people that only Heaven awaits us all. It is true that Jesus said that He went "to prepare a place" for us, those that are His followers (John 14:2-3). But, where did Judas go? Jesus, speaking of His disciples, said, "not one of them perished but the son of perdition [destruction]" (John 17:12). Then, in Acts, "Judas, by transgression, did fall, to go on to his proper place" (1:25, YLT). "Woe to that man by whom the Son of Man is betrayed! It would have been good for that man if he had not been born" (Matt. 26:24). Where was that place? If we believe in Heaven as a place, we must believe in Hell as a place. You can't have one and not the other.

**"DON'T COME  
HERE!"**

What we know of Hell is that it is a place of great torment. The Scripture does not describe a place we would want to be (Isa. 66:24; Mark 9:44; Rev. 14:11). We have seen that men do go to Hell. Many have or will go. "Enter through the narrow gate; for the gate is wide and the way is broad that leads to destruction, and there are many who enter through it" (Matt. 7:13). Also, "the fearful, and unbelieving, and the abominable, and murderers, and whoremongers, and sorcerers, and idolaters, and all liars, shall have their part in the lake which burneth with fire and brimstone: which is the second death" (Rev. 21:8). According to Jesus, those in Hell are concerned that their loved ones not follow. You do nobody a favor by going to Hell because so and so went. That person would implore you, "DON'T COME HERE!"

The sign in front of the church building says, "Worship: Sunday at 10:00 a.m." If you go to that church building at 10:00 a.m. on Sunday, you can expect there to be a worship service that you can attend. But the question is, when you go to that worship service, do you "worship"?

"Worship" is a word that can be used to designate an activity of a church at a certain time and place. But using the word itself does not ensure that worship is actually taking place. Worship is an act of giving honor, reverence and praise to God (and as the Greek word indicates, "to kiss toward"). This is a very individual act. This is a very personal act. Do you "worship"?

When you sing in worship, do you actually worship God?  
When you pray in worship, do you actually worship God?  
When you give in worship, do you actually worship God?  
When you commune in worship, do you actually worship God?  
When you hear God's Word proclaimed in worship, do you actually worship God? True worship takes effort! So, do you "worship"? – DS

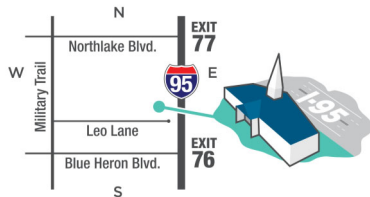
