Beautiful Feet

"I will never forget the first time I saw him. It was love at first sight. He had the most beautiful smile I had ever seen, and then when I looked into his eyes—they were beyond beautiful." Words like this are sometimes part of conversations in our land, but one thing you will never hear. "He had the most beautiful feet I have ever seen. I was captivated by their beauty." Now as strange as it might seem, the Bible does take about beautiful feet.

God's plan was for His people to take His message to a lost world. How did He look at it? "How shall they hear without a preacher? And how shall they preach unless they are sent? As it is written: 'How beautiful are the feet of those who preach the gospel the gospel of peace, who bring glad tidings of good things'" (Rom. 10:14-15)! There it is. Those who bring the gospel to the lost have beautiful feet.

What makes their feet beautiful? It begins long before they walk to conduct their study with a lost person. When God described the armor Christian soldiers must put on, He did not forget their feet (Eph. 6:13-18). He has on his head a helmet of salvation. His upper body has a breastplate of righteousness. His midsection is wrapped with the truth of God. His hand has that shield of faith to withstand every fiery projectile thrown at

him by Satan. He also holds the sword of the Spirit, the word of God. However, there is one other item he must have. He must enclose his feet with "the preparation of the gospel of peace."

That gospel of peace was completely prepared by God as He established the church, but we must ensure that we place it on our feet. Teaching others demands hours of preparing ourselves. It demands prayer and long periods of study of God's word. However, God expects all of us to feed on the milk of the word, then go on to feasting on the meat of the word and then to become teachers of others (Heb. 5:12-14).

Having done this, we take that "gospel of peace" to a troubled world. It brings peace between those who were captivated by sin, enemies of God, and makes them children of God. It brings to their hearts a peace which passes all understanding.

It also brings "glad tidings of good things." Is this not the definition of the gospel? The Greek word for gospel literally means good news. We take this good news to them, and it brings gladness to their souls. It brings gladness to your soul for there is no joy greater than bringing a lost person to Him.

So, take time to look at your feet. They may appear hideous to you, but the heart of that lost one will say, "How beautiful are the feet of those brought me the gospel of peace, glad tidings of good things!"

Worrywarts, Could You Spare a Moment?

Worry really worries us. We worry a lot about worrying. It is so common and almost natural for so many of us that we may figure that it's an acceptable part of our lives. Is that true? Is worrying a big deal or not?

How many of us are like Martha in Luke 10? Jesus said that she was "worried and troubled about many things" (10:41). Are you worried about many things? Jesus was not commending Martha but reproving her and telling her that, instead of having her mind divided in different directions, she needed to focus on "one thing" (10:42). How many of us need to stop drawing our minds in so many troublesome directions and draw them, instead, toward the Lord and what He has to tell us about living and about worrying?

The Bible tells us, "Do not worry." Three times in Matthew 6, Jesus instructs His followers with these three simple words, "Do not worry" (6:25, 31, 34). In verse 28, He asks the rhetorical question, "Why do you worry?" There is no answer (acceptable answer) to that question. So, would it be ok for me to worry about just a few little things?

The Bible tells us, "Be anxious for nothing." From the pen of a man who was incarcerated in a Roman prison and facing the possibility of death came these words, "Rejoice in

the Lord always...Be anxious for nothing" (Phil. 4:4, 6). But, seriously, how can I do that?

The Bible tells us, "Trust in the Lord." Rather than worry about what you cannot control, Scripture tells us, "Trust in the Lord with all your heart...In all your ways acknowledge Him" (Prov. 3:5-6). In fact, that is the emphasis of both passages that prohibit worrying. Eleven times in Matthew 6, Jesus stresses how God is "your Father." Paul said not to worry about anything but "in everything" to "let your requests be made known unto God" (Phil. 4:6).

The Bible tells us, "Your Father knows what you need." We have an all-powerful and an all-knowing Father in heaven! There is nothing about our lives (and our needs) that He does not know (and cannot handle). Rather than worry, Jesus said to lean on "your Father" who "knows that you need all these things" (Matt. 6:8, 32). How much do you trust your Father?

The Bible tells us, "Cast all your anxieties on Him." Not some. Not most. Not the heavy ones. Not the worst ones. Not the ones you can't handle. "Humble yourselves...casting all your anxieties on Him" (1 Pet. 5:6-7).

It is hard (truly hard) to not worry about things. Even Martha struggled with that. But, try to focus your mind on the "one thing"—Spend time with the Lord, talking to Him, trusting Him, transferring your worries to Him.

The Leap of Faith

Summer Bible camps are always full of learning. Some children are learning to be away from their parents for the first time. Some college age counselors are learning the psychology of maintaining order in a cabin full of adolescents. In all of these things, the lessons of faith are by far the most important. At Central Florida Bible Camp, we have an activity that highlights those lessons in an exciting way.

We call it the Leap of Faith. It is a forty-foot power pole sticking skyward out of the ground with climbing spikes. On either side of that pole, forming a triangle, are two other power poles that are about ten feet taller. They support a cable on which hangs a red ball and the belay rope. The idea of this exercise is to climb the pole, stand on top of it and jump out trying to touch the red ball, hence leap of faith. Lest you question the safety and sanity of the participants, they are in a full-body harness, with a helmet, and the belay rope attached to the harness. The rope is kept taut as they climb, always ready to catch them at any time. On the other end of the line is a full belay team and friction device to stop/slow the descent.

I have facilitated this event for several years. There are several lessons that I like to share with the participants after they have come down off the pole. One lesson is that the

leap of faith represents a life of faith. We stepped out in faith when we chose to follow Christ. It wasn't a blind "scratch off" kind of leap. It was done with the knowledge of our sin and the salvation in Christ. As we climb in life, we understand more, and greater faith is required as we grow in knowledge (2 Cor. 8:7). By the time we get to the top, we are ready to jump.

For others with a great fear of heights, jumping out for the red ball forty feet in the air is beyond their ability. For them, the leap is the first step up the pole. That first step is the greatest challenge. As they climb, they require encouragements from those on the ground. Many have gotten fifteen feet up and bear cub the pole and begin to weep. With gentle encouragement, many have been able to climb up to touch the top. For them, that was the best that could be expected. Not everyone will be a teacher, preacher, elder or deacon. Many are great servants and labor at their greatest abilities (Eph. 4:11, 16).

Lastly, we are not climbing alone. From the ground, we are connected to those who are on the belay rope, the church. They encourage and strengthen us (Eph. 4:29). The victories of the one on the pole are the victories of everyone. God has provided everything for us to succeed. We are often our own greatest enemy (Matt. 23:27). Let this be a word of encouragement to keep on climbing. "Climber, climb on!"

Like a thief in the night

If I knew that the thief was going to break into the house that night, I would not have left the car keys on the counter. I would have moved the camera to the back room. I would have done a number of things differently...if I had only known.

You know that the Bible says that Jesus will come "as a thief in the night" (1 Thess. 5:2; 2 Pet. 3:10; Matt. 24:43-44). That means there will be no warning, no signs leading up to it, no indication at all that it is about to happen. What if He comes tonight? Seriously. Think about it. What if Jesus comes back just as you pillow your head tonight? What would you move right now, what would you start doing differently right now, what would you change right now, what would you need to do right now to be 100% prepared for His coming? This is not some academic exercise in hypothetical research! This is very real! This is critically important! This is of E-T-E-R-N-A-L significance—the difference between eternity in heaven and eternity in hell! Whatever you "would" do is what you "need to" do right now! – DS



"The church" is "the Way"

When Paul addressed the Jerusalem mob in Acts 22, he confessed that in his pre-conversion life he had "persecuted this Way to the death" (22:4). "This Way"? What is that? On his way to Damascus in Acts 9, he was planning to find and persecute "any who were of the Way" (9:2). "The Way"? Who are they? That was the Holy Spirit's way of depicting those in the first century who were faithful followers of Christ (cf. Acts 19:9, 23; 24:14, 22). The singularity of the word (not "Ways") emphasizes the exclusive and unique nature of God's followers. Only one group!

Elsewhere, Paul specifically stated that he "persecuted the church" (1 Cor. 15:9; Gal. 1:13; Phil. 3:6). Compare these two affirmations: Paul persecuted "the Way" and Paul persecuted "the church." "The Way" consisted of faithful followers of Christ, and there was only one. "The church" also consisted of faithful followers of Christ, and there also was only one. The singularity of both words emphasizes their exclusive and unique nature! There is only one church as there is only one Way! – DS
