America's New Kind of God

The events which followed the fall of the northern kingdom of Israel are recorded in the seventeenth chapter of Second Kings. The Assyrians moved many of the Jews, who were part of Israel, and sent them throughout the Assyrian world. Then, they brought men from other nations and settled

them in Israel. This was an attempt, largely successful, to destroy the ethnicity of the Jews.

There was a problem when all of this happened. The Gentiles who came into the Promised Land brought their own gods and worshiped them. The anger of the Lord was stirred against this use of His land. "Therefore the Lord sent lions among them, which killed some of them" (v. 25). So, the king of Assyria understood the reason for the problem and said the lions "...are killing them because they do not know the

rituals of the God of the land" (v. 26). His solution was to find a Jewish priest and send him to Bethel to teach them how to fear God (v. 28).

What was the result of all of this? "They feared the Lord, yet served their own gods—according to the rituals of the nations...they did not obey, but they followed their formal rituals...so the nations feared the Lord, yet served their carved images" (vs. 33, 40, 41).

What happened in that land is happening in our own land. Those people of the fallen northern kingdom did not like what they had been taught about the God in whose land they now dwelt. They simply redefined the God of Israel and ignored what He had said. Perhaps their fear of the lions was greater than their fear of the Lion of Israel. It is obvious they accepted some of the "rituals" of Judaism but brought in a new god they defined. The actual truth about that situation is found

in verse thirty-four. "They do not fear the Lord, nor do they follow...the commandment which the Lord commanded." Isn't this is what is happening in our land?

We have redefined God and, while ritualistically following Him in some ways, we are serving our newly defined God! Think of all that is happening with the elevation of our own ideas. God's view of

marriage has been laid aside, and the "new God" accepts our own definitions of marriage. God's view of worship being centered on all humbly praising Him has been replaced with worship that is man-centered and is designed to make us *feel* spiritual. The applause is given to Christian entertainers instead of reverence directed toward heaven. Look at all of Christendom and see if we are not doing as those in Israel.

It is high time for our nation, and us individually, to truly fear God and keep His commandments.

You Can't Be Putting Christ First If...

They feared the

Lord God, rede-

The first six letters of the word "Christian" give an obvious and helpful reminder that there is ONE who MUST come FIRST and absolutely foremost in our lives—CHRIST! There is no question that one cannot be a CHRISTian without CHRIST, and the positioning of those six letters is FIRST in the

word! As a Floridian is one who is "of or belonging to" the state of Florida, a Christian is one who is "of or belonging to" Christ.

Do I have Christ

Scripture clearly teaches the place that Christ demands to have in the life of a Christian. Read this text from Colossians very carefully: Christ is "the firstborn OVER ALL creation. For by Him ALL things were created through Him and for Him. things, and in Him ALL things consist...that in ALL things He may HAVE THE PREEMINENCE" (1:15-18, emp. added). Read that last line again—"that in ALL things He may HAVE THE PREEMINENCE."

The expression "have the preeminence" is a present tense participle that means "to be first, hold the first place." So, Christ is to "have first place in everything" (NASB). A serious question for every Christian to answer is, Do I have Christ in "first place in everything" in my life? There are a number of

litmus tests to answer that question, but Scripture provides one in this context. Read the entirety of verse 18, part of which was omitted above.

"He is the head of the body, the church, who is the beginning, the firstborn from the dead, that in all things He may have the preeminence." In the context of Christ having first place in ALL things is the affirmation that He is "the head of the body, the church." How essential is Christ to His body?

Well, what are you without your head? How essential is the church (or the body) to Christ? Well, what are you without your body?

Christ and His body are inseparable! It is not possible to have one (ex: Christ) without equally having the other (ex: the church). Yet, some individuals try to make claims to the contrary by saying things like, "I'll take Christ, but I'm not interested in the

church," OR "Christ is first in my life but I'm still not sure about the church," OR "I don't really have time for the church right now but Christ is my everything." Such cannot be the case!

The preeminence of the church is taught by the Head of the church Himself. He commanded, "Seek first His kingdom" (Matt. 6:33). So, which is supposed to be "first" in our lives—Christ or His church? The answer is, BOTH! One cannot be first in your life without the other being first! You can't be putting Christ first if you're not putting His church first!

Five Views of Salvation

In Mark's account of the Great Commission, Jesus' words are clear and simple. "He who has believed and has been baptized shall be saved" (Mark 16:16a). As simple as this is, there are five different views regarding salvation.

The first is, "He who has believed and has been baptized shall not be saved." There are two groups that

believe this statement. Atheists that don't believe in God, heaven, hell or salvation of any kind. Also, all those that don't believe in Jesus as the Son of God. This view contradicts the Bible. There is a God who offers salvation (1 Tim. 2:3-4), and it is through Jesus only (1 Tim. 2:5-6).

The second is, "He who has not believed and is not baptized will be saved." This view is held by those that believe that all people will eventually be saved. This view contradicts the Bible. Jesus Himself said that there would be few who would be saved (Matt. 7:13-14). Paul also warned of those who would not be saved but face the wrath of God (Eph. 5:5-6).

The third is, "He who has not believed and has been baptized shall be saved." This view is held by people who practice infant baptism. By "baptizing" (sprinkling) infants incapable of faith, they indicate that faith is not essential to salvation.

By sprinkling or pouring instead of immersion, they also indicate that Jesus did not mean what He said about baptism. This contradicts the Bible. Faith is a necessary prerequisite for baptism and salvation (Acts 8:35-37; Rom. 10:9-10). Baptism is described in the Bible as a burial (Rom 6:3-4). Sprinkling or pouring was substituted in the place of baptism (immersion) hundreds of years after Christ and His apostles. By keeping the tradition of men by sprinkling or pouring, we fail to keep the command of God concerning baptism.

With which of these views is our life consistent? The fourth view is, "He who has believed and has not been baptized shall be saved." This view is held by those that believe in faith only. They believe that one is saved before baptism, and that baptism is not essential to salvation. This view contradicts the Bible. Faith alone can't save. This was declared by Jesus (Matt. 7:21; Luke 6:46) and by His

apostles (Rom. 6:17-18; Heb. 5:9; 1 Pet. 1:22).

Lastly, "He who has believed and has been baptized shall be saved." This view takes Jesus' words at face value. No explanations are necessary. This is clearly what the Bible teaches. Belief (Acts 8:36-37) and baptism need to happen before one can enjoy the spiritual blessing of salvation (Acts 8:36-37; 2:38; 22:16). It should be clear there is only one view which is in harmony with Jesus' words. The next question is, with which of these views is our life consistent?

Mighty in the Scriptures?

When Apollos is introduced to the reader in Acts 18, he is described as being "mighty in the Scriptures" and "instructed in the way of the Lord" (18:24-25). I have known some men who I considered to be "mighty in the Scriptures." I stand in awe of such men. I would imagine that the brethren in Ephesus were impressed with Apollos. Sometimes, the tendency is to believe and accept whatever such teachers say, for they

know so much and "who am I to question?"

However, Scripture lets us know that Apollos was in error when it came to the topic of "baptism" (18:25). So, Aquila and Priscilla, rather than either (1) believing what Apollos said because he knew so much, or (2) remaining silent when they realized he was in error, "took him aside and explained to him the way of God more accurately" (18:26).

Don't believe everything you hear! No matter who it is! Measure every teacher against God's Word (Acts 17:11; 1 John 4:1)! – DS

Are you hastening the day?

The Bible teaches that Jesus is coming back (Acts 1:9-11; Heb. 9:28b). Are you ready for that? The Bible teaches that Jesus will return as suddenly and unexpectedly as a thief in the night (Matt. 24:43-44; 2 Pet. 3:10). Are you ready for that? In reaction to the certainty of the return of Christ, the Bible bids Christians to be "looking for and hastening the coming" (2 Pet.

3:12). The Greek verb for "hastening" is also found in Luke 2:16, when the shepherds "came with haste" to find Baby Jesus, and in Luke 19:5-6, when Jesus told Zacchaeus to "make haste and come down" from the tree. God wants us to "make haste" or "hurry up" the coming of Jesus.

What does that mean? How do we do that? In the context, God calls upon His people to be constantly looking for and constantly hastening Jesus' return by devoting themselves to "holy conduct and godliness" (3:11). By faithfully carrying out our responsibilities as Christians, we are preparing for and even hastening His return, by accomplishing His will on this earth. So, by your Christian conduct, are you hastening His return or hoping its delayed? -DS
