Discovering the Bible on a Deserted Island

Sometimes great truths can be taught by using the most simple thoughts. This is why both Old Testament prophets and even Jesus employed objects and stories to illustrate great truths. The following story is far from being equal with those, but perhaps it will help us understand the truth about the church Jesus built and the religious division in our world.

Imagine a man, isolated on a deserted island, who finds a Bible which has washed ashore. He begins reading it and is so fascinated. There is much he struggles to comprehend, but he learns what this book taught about the origin of man and the earth. He learns about a holy God who expects His creation to obey Him, punishes those who turn away and rewards those who obey Him. He learns of God making a great nation of the descendants of Abraham, Isaac and Jacob and sending prophets to tell that nation that someday a great One would come to deal with all of man's sinful disobedience.

An amazing thing happens. These words are powerful, and he begins to believe these truths. He has a simple faith which comes from hearing the simple truth. As he reads more, he finds that the great One came—His name was Jesus. He died. He was raised. He ascended back to heaven and left men on the earth to show a new way and established the church.

Sometimes great truths can be clearly understood by simple stories

The man's faith grows. He changes his life, and he is immersed so that God will wash away all his sins. He worships like those apostles taught men to worship. He lives by the moral precepts they taught. Because he did what those twelve men taught others to do to become members of the church, he does what they did, and God adds him to that church.

This story is not an actual event, but if the Bible is from God and is written in such a way that a common man can understand it, *it could happen*. That Bible this man found was from God, and God fulfilled the promises He made to those who would seek to find Him, hungering and thirsting after righteousness.

Now imagine that man being rescued and coming into our world. He would learn of churches begun by the Pope, Luther, Wesley, Calvin, Smith, Russell, and other churches based on ecclesiastical hierarchy. He would readily see how different they were from the simple church Jesus started. He would struggle to see the many "faiths" on which these churches were built, but he knew where his faith came from. He had the *same faith* as those taught by the apostles, and he was so glad the circumstances in his life had taught him the simple truth.

Make No Provision for the Flesh

Do you ever plan ahead? Most folks when they go on vacation will plan ahead. Before most folks have surgery, they will plan ahead. Even when most folks go to the grocery store, they will plan ahead. Putting our minds to events—to consider as many aspects of those events in advance—is an essential life skill. But not all advanced planning is good.

In Romans 13:14, Christians are given two instructions, which is actually one instruction with two contrasting sides. Let's start with the second part, where God commands (with a present middle imperative), "Make no provision for the flesh, to fulfill its lusts." The Greek word for "provision" is *pro-noia*, which is a compound word with the prefix *pro*, meaning "before," and the verb *noeo*, "to think." The expression in this verse literally means, "give no forethought to" those things of the flesh.

The challenge that the devil throws in the path of every Christian (and non-Christian, as well) is "the flesh." "The lust of the flesh" is in his arsenal at every turn (1 John 2:16), in order that we might "fulfill its desires." It is impossible for us to "live according to the flesh" and "live according to the Spirit" at the same time (Rom. 8:1-14), but this is much more than just the actions that we take. In Romans 13:14, God calls upon

us to not even let our thoughts wonder over into the arena of the flesh. By letting our minds dwell upon the passions and desires of this world, we are, in essence, planning ahead (and giving forethought) to how we might fulfill those carnal cravings. But the Lord knows that if we cut off the thoughts "before" we can "think" them that we cannot then sin against Him. Thus, we must "have crucified the flesh with its passions and desires" (Gal. 5:24). Have you done that? Or are you still letting those passions and desires live in your heart?

The first part of this instruction in Romans 13:14 states, "Put on the Lord Jesus Christ." Place this in contrast with the second part of the verse. Rather than think on the things of the flesh, God expects me to make a determined choice to think the way Christ thought (Phil. 2:5-8) and to live the way Christ lived (1 Pet. 2:21). I must clothe myself with the Lord—not just on the outside (as we might sometimes picture clothing), but on the very deepest parts of the inside of my heart. How do I do that?

I must bathe myself in His word (Psa. 119). I must not allow myself to be conformed to the fleshly lusts of this world (1 Pet. 2:9). I must love what He loves, want what He wants, hate what He hates, etc. Rather than allowing my heart to plan ahead to fulfill fleshly desires, I need to find joy in planning ahead to fulfill godly desires and make provision for Him!

Your Person of the Year

Here it is! The end of the year! With it comes all the countdowns and end of the year reflections. One of the year-end traditions is Time Magazine’s Person of the Year that highlights that year’s most influential person. You may not notice it but many notable people have been on the cover of the magazine. From Mahatma Gandhi (1930) and Winston Churchill (1940) to Adolf Hitler (1938) and Joseph Stalin (1940, 1942). Presidents, scientists, Nobel Peace Prize winners, and groups of people like the American Fighting Man (1950) and You (2006). This year, they selected Greta Thunberg, the youngest to ever be named. Greta is a 16-year-old climate change activist from Sweden. She organized students to strike for climate change and became famous for her “how dare you” address to the 2018 United Nations Climate Change Conference. Whether or not she impacted our lives for anything other than a good meme is debatable. However, who has influenced our lives this year?

As is common, at the end of a year we will take a moment and look back at what this year held for us. We count the year by units of time. What if we counted it by the encounters with people in our lives? Of those encounters, how many were significant? It could be that someone said something that stuck with you. It may have been positive or negative, but it caused a

great change in your life. It could be that influence came at the hand of unexpected change in the life of someone close to you. When we look back, we can see that our lives are heavily influenced by those around us. This raises the question, who are we keeping around us?

It has been said, “Keep your friends close and your enemies closer.” In our spiritual lives, this is not sound advice. We need to keep those close that will move us “to love and good deeds” (Heb. 10:24). The immediate context of that verse is the general assembly of the church (Heb. 10:25). If we looked back on 2019, what percentage of Sundays were we in worship with the saints? How many times did I fellowship with my brothers and sisters? Would that have made a difference in our lives?

There are many things that are out of our control. There are people that unknowingly influence us throughout the year, and we can’t change that. We can control who we spend time with. We can choose to be around people that are going to help us on our Christian walk (John 13:34; Rom. 12:10; Gal. 6:2). We need to stay away from those that would be a negative influence as much as is in our control (Prov. 16:29; 28:10). Let’s look back on our year and see who our person of the year has been. Christ will always be our greatest influence, but others can help (1 Cor. 11:1).

It is worth it!

What Must I Do to Be Saved?

The Bible says...

1. Believe that Jesus is the Son of God

“Believe on the Lord Jesus Christ, and you will be saved” (Acts 16:31).

2. Repent of your sinful ways

“Repent therefore and be converted, that your sins may be blotted out” (Acts 3:19).

3. Confess your faith in Jesus

“If you confess with your mouth the Lord Jesus...you will be saved” (Rom. 10:9).

4. Be immersed in water

“He who believes and is baptized will be saved” (Mark 16:16).

5. Commit to a lifetime of faithful service

“Be faithful until death, and I will give you the crown of life” (Rev. 2:10).
