Exalting His Resurrection

The central event in the history of mankind is the resurrection of Jesus. Without it, death is the victorious enemy of all mortals. Without it, death comes, and all our dreams, aspirations and future plans come to a screeching halt. It all ends. When Job faced this problem, his heart was full of questions.

Job looked at his life and said, "Man that is born of woman is of few days and full of trouble. He comes forth like a flower and fades away; he flees like a shadow and does not continue" (Job 14:1,2). His despair is sent in many of the verses which follow. "But man dies and is laid away; indeed he breathes his last and where is he? ... So man lies down and does not rise. The heavens are no more, they will not awake nor be roused from their sleep." He then asks the ultimate question. "If a man dies, will he live again" (Job

14:14)? Without a revelation from heaven, death wins!

Hear the words of Paul when he affirmed that the appearing of the Savior "...abolished death and brought life and immortality to light through the gospel" (2 Tim. 1:10). There are glimpses of the resurrection in the shadows of the Old Testament, but the gospel brought by Jesus brings this truth out of that shadow. We now understand so clearly that the time will come when all that are in the grave will hear His

voice and come forth (John 5:28-29). But there is more. God has given us assurance of this truth by raising His own Son. He entered into Hades (Acts 2:31) and returned from that realm having "the keys to Hades and death" (Rev. 1:18). His resurrection answers Job's question and forever removes the bondage of the fear of death from the hearts of the saints (Heb. 2:14-15). In Paul's letter to the church at Corinth, he tied the fact of our resurrection to the fact of Jesus' resurrection (1 Cor. 15).

> How will this happen? When those who are in the grave hear His voice, they will come forth in an incorruptible, spiritual body. Because flesh and blood cannot inherit the kingdom of God, even the bodies of those who are alive will also be changed. "In a moment, in the twinkling of an eye, at the last trumpet. For the trumpet will sound and the dead will be raised..." (1 Cor. 15:52). How quickly will this hap-

pen? In the twinkling of an eye. How long will it take? Just as long as it takes you to bat your eyes!

Jesus has been raised, and by this we know that we shall be raised. His resurrection is the foundation of Biblical truths. We live in bodies that are mortal—subject to death. We live in bodies that are corruptible—they are aging and decaying. "When this corruptible has put on incorruption and this mortal has put on immortality, then death is swallowed up in victory" (1 Cor. 15:54). God hasten that day!

Honestly, Is Lying a Big Deal?

In the verb form, to "lie" means "to make an untrue statement with intent to deceive; to create a false or misleading impression." A lie can be "spoken" or "written." But, in the grand scheme of things, if I tell one little lie, or mislead someone to believe an untruth, or am dishonest in

my financial dealings, is that really all that big of a deal?

One reality we must face is that our senses have been dulled by our culture today. We are, after all, living in what some call the "Post-Truth World." Truth is not that big of a deal. (Look at the politicians.) Pure honesty is not demanded. (Look at advertisements.) We almost expect, these days, to be lied to on some level by almost everyone. So, if we fall in line and follow suit, where's the harm in that?

The Bible commands us to abstain from lying. The Old Testament was clear, "You shall not bear false witness against your neighbor" (Ex. 20:16). The New Testament is just as clear, "Do not lie to one another" (Col. 3:9).

The Bible discloses to us God's view of lying. "Lying lips are an abomination to the Lord" (Prov. 12:22). "The Lord hates...A lying tongue...A false witness who speaks lies" (Prov. 6:16-19).

The Bible gives a vivid warning against lying. The

story of Ananias and Sapphira in Acts 5 is well known, as the couple "agreed together" to "lie to God" about the profit from their land sale. The fact that each of them was struck dead for lying was (and still is) a powerful lesson for those early Christians to learn.

The Bible reveals that lying is a heart issue. It is not just a matter of the words that come from our mouth (or from our pen). Jesus said, "For out of the heart proceed evil

thoughts...false witness..." (Matt. 15:19). A man must look within his heart to change his outward habit of lying.

look within his The Bible ties our lying to the ultimate liar. heart to change The very first lie told in the Bible was by the devil his outward

himself (Gen. 3:4). That lie changed the course of human history forever! Of the devil, Jesus said, "When he speaks a lie, he speaks from his own re-

sources, for he is a liar and the father of it" (John 8:44). Liars, therefore, are children of their father, the devil.

The Bible parallels lying with "the worst" of sins and shows forth its final end. In Revelation 21:8, "all liars" are listed right alongside other sinners like "murderers" and "idolaters," all of whom (liars included) will be condemned to "the lake which burns with fire and brimstone."

The Bible commands us to tell the truth (Eph. 4:25). May God help us to be people of truth...all the time!

No other New Testament writer speaks on the theme of Christian living more than Paul. In his letters he highlights life and death principles to a life lived in Christ. Contemplating these things will help us keep our focus on a Christ centered life. "Fixing our eyes on Jesus, the author and perfecter of

faith, who for the joy set before Him endured the cross, despising the shame, and has sat down at the right hand of the throne of God" (Heb. 12:2).

We need to die to the world and its fleshly

to mature to the point that the physical world around us would not distract us from our spiritual reward in heaven. The life of a Christian isn't all about death.

Paul talks specifically about what it means to live in Christ. "Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who has blessed us with every spiritual blessing in the heavenly places in Christ" (Eph. 1:3). Our spiritual sphere is in Christ. "For all of you who were baptized into Christ have clothed
