7 Ways to Give Your Child His/Her Own Faith

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Introduction

- i. Having one's own faith is essential!
 - a. "Without FAITH it is impossible to please God" (Heb. 11:6).
 - b. Each person, including my child, must have his own faith to please God.
- ii. Having one's own faith is valuable!
 - a. "This is the victory that has overcome the world—our faith" (1 John 5:4).
 - b. When a child leaves home, the parent's faith will not help him overcome the world.
- iii. Having one's own faith is the only way to slow the apostasy rate among today's youth!
 - a. By most estimations, more than 50% are losing their faith when they leave home.
 - b. While multiple reasons exist, the fundamental truth is that they do not have their own faith.
 - c. It is possible for an entire generation to be raised who does not know the Lord (Judg. 2:10).
- iv. Having one's own faith is the only way to make it to heaven!

1. Have and Build Your Own Faith First!

- a. One cannot impart or share that which he does not have himself!
- b. Spend time reading the Word of God (Deut. 31:10-12; Eph. 3:3-4; Rev. 1:3).
- c. Spend time meditating upon the Word of God (Psa. 1:2; 119:97, 148; 1 Tim. 4:15).
- d. Spend time studying the Word of God with diligence (2 Tim. 2:15).
- e. Spend time praying fervently to God (Phil. 4:6-7; 1 Thess. 5:21; Jas. 5:16).
- f. Even so, let your child see you reading, meditating, studying and praying.

2. Live a Life of Faith Before Your Child!

- a. Your child should see Christ living in you (Gal. 2:20).
- b. Your child should see the church first in your life (Matt. 6:33).
- c. Your child should see you doing good works for the Lord (Matt. 5:12; Eph. 2:10).
- d. Your child should see you engaged in evangelistic efforts (Mark 16:15; 2 Tim. 2:2).
- e. Your child is less likely to walk where they have not first seen you walk.

3. Teach Them Diligently!

- a. Faith comes from the source of faith (Rom 1:17; 10:17). Use the Bible to teach.
- b. Start early. You cannot start too early. Timothy was taught from infancy (2 Tim. 3:14-15).
- c. Teach your child to love God (Deut. 6:4-9; Matt. 22:36-37).
- d. Teach your child to love the Bible (Psa. 119:97, 127, 159, 167).
- e. Teach your child to love doing right (Heb. 1:9; Psa. 119:104; John 8:29).
- f. Teach your child to love the church (Matt. 6:33; Heb. 10:24-25; Gal. 6:10; Jas. 1:27; Eph. 5:25).

4. Talk about God, Jesus, the Bible, the Church, Righteousness in Everyday Conversations!

- a. Sitting down with a Bible and having a Bible study together is essential.
- b. However, that should not be the only time that these matters are included in our conversations.
 - (1) "...When you sit in your house, when you walk by the way, when you lie down, and when you rise up" (Deut. 6:7).
 - (2) "God was so happy with you today when you..." "Jesus dealt with that same thing one time."
- c. Biblical and spiritual matters should not require a special occasion or conversation to come up.
- d. They should be an integral part of our homes, our families, our hearts and our goals.

5. Give Evidence for the Existence of God, the Inspiration of the Bible and the Deity of Jesus!

- a. Our culture and our schools are bent on destroying faith; we must be tenacious in creating it!
- b. From infancy, your child should learn that "God made dogs, duck and dinosaurs."
- c. As years progress, your child should learn to see design and know God is the Designer.
- d. Show evidences of Bible's inspiration (factual accuracy, prophecy, scientific foreknowledge, etc.).
- e. Establish the historicity, deity and Messiahship of Jesus. He is our Savior, Lord and King!
- 6. Create a Respect for God and His Word, a Love for the Church, and a Joy for Serving!
 - a. Too many children have no respect for authority parents, teachers, police, God, etc.
 - (1) Thus, we are seeing the consequences in rebellious and self-centered behaviors.

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- (2) A verse to memorize: "Fear God and keep His commandments..." (Ecc. 12:13).
- (3) Jesus said, "The word that I have spoken will judge him in the last day" (John 12:48).
- b. Children should never think of the church as drudgery or some obligatory inconvenience.
 - (1) The attitudes and words of parents will determine a child's view of the church.
 - (2) Create a heart in your child that says, "I was glad when they said..." (Psa. 122:1).
 - (3) The church should grow to be as precious to your child as it was/is to Jesus (Eph. 5:25).
 - (4) A child, a parent and every Christian need to move from "I have to" to "I get to."
- c. Children should grow up experiencing the joy of serving the Lord and helping others.
 - (1) "Let us do good to all, especially to those who are of the household of faith" (Gal. 6:10).
 - (2) The heart of your child needs to sing, "I want to be a worker for the Lord!"

7. Make It a Daily Priority to Pray Together!

- a. True prayer expresses and demonstrates one's real dependence on our Father.
- b. Through your example, your child should learn to pray about everything (Phil. 4:6-7).
- c. Through humble prayer, your child should learn to say to God, "Not my will but Yours" (Jas. 4:15).
- d. Pray: "God, please help us make good decisions. Please help us to be leaders and help others to do right."
- e. Make sure your prayers and their prayers are saturated with thanksgiving (Col. 4:2; 1 Thess. 5:18).
- f. Children need to know that God is always listening to them (1 Pet. 3:12; 1 John 5:14-15; Jas. 4:2).

Conclusion

- i. Having one's own faith is essential, valuable and the only way for our children to make it to heaven!
- ii. May God help us to build faith in their hearts diligently, early, joyfully, prayerfully and continuously!
- iii. Let us remember: "Unless the Lord builds the house, they labor in vain who build it" (Psa. 127:1).
