Introduction

- 1. *Total Hereditary Depravity* One of five major doctrines compositely known as "Calvinism," named after one of the main proponents, the sixteenth-century French theologian, John Calvin.
- 2. Psalm 8 Compare the tenet of Calvinism to the fact that:
 - a. "Children" evidence the glory of God (Psa. 127:3-4; cf. Matt. 18:1-3).
 - b. "Celestials" evidence the glory of God (Psa. 19:1-3; Acts 14:15).
 - c. "Compassion" evidences the glory of God (Psa. 136:1ff; Rom. 11:33).
- 3. Total Hereditary Depravity is contrary to what the Bible says about:

I. Our "Sin"

- B. Total Hereditary Depravity is in disagreement with what the Bible says about the:
 - 1. "Definition" of our sins (1 John 3:4; 5:17).
 - 2. "Conception" of our sins (Jas. 1:14-15; e.g. Gen. 3:1-6).
 - 3. "Remission" of our sins (Acts 2:38; 10:43).

II. Our "Savior"

- B. *Total Hereditary Depravity* is in disagreement with what the Bible says about the:
 - 1. "Incarnation" of our Savior (John 1:2; Heb. 2:9-18 + 10:1-10).
 - 2. "Crucifixion" of our Savior (2 Cor. 5:19-20; 1 Pet. 3:21-24).
 - 3. "Mediation" of Jesus (Heb. 7:25; 9:24).
- C. cf. 1 Timothy 2:5

III. Our "Salvation"

- A. Matthew 10:28-30
- B. Total Hereditary Depravity is in disagreement with what the Bible says about the:
 - 1. "Convictions" of our salvation (John 8:24; Rom. 5:1 + 4:12).
 - 2. "Conversion" [i.e. change of repentance] of our salvation (Acts 17:30; 2 Pet. 3:9).
 - 3. "Immersion" [baptism] of our salvation (Acts 16:22; 1 Pet. 3:20-21).
